EAGLES ON PRIMETIME

- Philadelphia is 4th in the NFL in primetime winning percentage (.684, 13-6) since 2016 (including playoffs), behind Seattle (.806, 14-3-1), Pittsburgh (.737, 14-5) and New England (.731, 19-7) (min. 15 primetime games).

HOME, SWEET HOME

- Including playoffs, Philadelphia owns the 4th-best home winning percentage (.719, 23-9) in the NFL since 2016, trailing only New England (.882, 30-4), Minnesota (.767, 23-7) and New Orleans (.727, 24-9) in that span.



SERIES HISTORY: EAGLES vs. GIANTS

Philadelphia has won each of its last 5 games vs. N.Y. Giants, as well as 9 of the last 10 matchups overall in the series. The Eagles also own a 5-game winning streak against the Giants at Lincoln Financial Field.

In his last 3 starts vs. N.Y. Giants (since 2017), Carson Wentz has led the Eagles to a 3-0 record while completing 67-of-95 (70.5%) attempts for 690 yards (230.0 ypg), 5 TDs, 0 INTs and a 108.7 passer rating.

Alshon Jeffery recorded a season-high 137 receiving yards in Week 13 at Miami, marking his 2nd-highest single-game total as an Eagle (6th-most of career).

Jake Elliott ranks 3rd in the NFL in FG percentage (94.4%, 17-of-18), trailing only **Josh Lambo** (96.2%, 25-of-26) and **Justin Tucker** (95.7%, 22-of-23).

Philadelphia has allowed the 4th-fewest rushing yards per game (91.0) in the NFL, behind N.Y. Jets (75.3), Tampa Bay (76.3) and New Orleans (88.6).

Zach Ertz leads all NFL TEs with a team-leading 70 receptions. Since Week 9, Ertz has produced 33 catches, ranking 5th overall in that span.

45.4%

The Eagles own the 6th-ranked third-down offense (45.4%) in the NFL, trailing only Dallas (48.1%) and San Francisco (45.6%) among NFC teams.

Carson Wentz has thrown a TD in 15 consecutive regular-season games, which is tied with **Russell Wilson** for the longest active streak in the NFL.

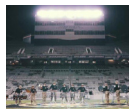

MY CAUSE MY CLEATS

The National Football League's My Cause My Cleats campaign is an annual initiative that empowers players to express their commitment to the causes they support through creative artwork and custom designs on their game cleats. To recognize and celebrate the positive impact players are having across the country, the Philadelphia Eagles will join the NFL community in Week 14 by lacing up their custom cleats and sneakers.

Nearly 30 Eagles players will be wearing custom cleats on Monday night, supporting several charitable causes such as Carson Wentz's focus on Spiritual and Physical Blessings for Youth, Malcolm Jenkins highlighting "College Behind Bars," Jake Elliott's support of Animal Rescue, Brandon Brooks' work with Mental Health Awareness, and several players including Jason Kelce, Jason Peters and Fletcher Cox supporting Autism Awareness. In further support of this initiative, Eagles ownership, coaches, cheerleaders and support staff will be wearing sneakers to highlight the Eagles Autism Foundation.

Throughout the game on Monday, player causes and their inspirational messages will be incorporated into the gameday presentation, as well as the action on the field.

Players will share images of their cleats and the stories behind them on social media using the hashtag #MyCauseMyCleats. The Eagles worked directly with local customizers as well as Nike, Under Armour and adidas to design the cleats and sneakers that will be on display Monday, Dec. 9.
