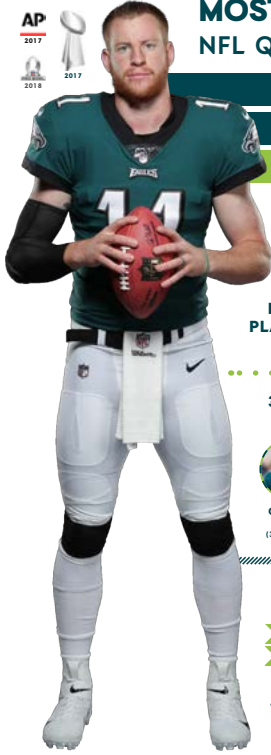

BY THE NUMBERS

90.1

Philadelphia ranked 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards allowed per game (90.1), trailing only Tampa Bay (73.8) and N.Y. Jets (86.9) in that category.

66.7%

The Eagles produced the 3rd-highest red zone TD efficiency (66.7%, 36 of 54) in the NFL, behind Tennessee (75.6%) and Baltimore (67.2%).

45.4%

Philadelphia ranked 4th in the NFL in third-down offense (45.4%, 104 of 229), trailing only Kansas City (47.6%), Baltimore (47.1%) and Dallas (47.1%).

27.5%

The Eagles ranked 1st in the NFL in defensive three-and-out percentage (27.5%, 52 of 189), including a 33.3% (16 of 48) mark during Weeks 14-17.

8.5

Brandon Graham registered the 2nd-most sacks (8.5) of his NFL career (9.5 in 2017) and moved into the Top 5 on the Eagles' all-time sacks list (51.0).

5.8

Miles Sanders had the 3rd-most scrimmage yards per touch (5.8) among NFL RBs, behind Austin Ekeler (6.9) and Christian McCaffrey (5.9) (min. 200 touches).

NOTES TO KNOW



EAGLES IN THE POSTSEASON

Of the 21 NFL teams that have qualified for the playoffs since 2017, only four of those teams have appeared in each of the last three seasons: **Kansas City, New England, New Orleans** and **Philadelphia**.

- Philadelphia will appear in the postseason for the 27th time in franchise history. The Eagles are tied for the 4th-most playoff appearances (13) in the NFL since 2000, behind New England (17), Green Bay (14) and Indianapolis (14).
- Philadelphia captured its 11th all-time NFC East crown following a 9-7 campaign in the regular season. The Eagles' nine NFC East titles since 2001 lead the division in that span, ahead of Dallas (5), N.Y. Giants (3) and Washington (2).
- Doug Pederson, who owns the highest winning percentage by a head coach in Eagles history (.609, 42-27), is the first NFL head coach to make the playoffs in three of their first four seasons as a head coach since Mike Tomlin (2007-08, 2010).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

HOME, SWEET HOME Lincoln Financial Field

- Including playoffs, Philadelphia owns the 2nd-best home winning percentage (.735, 25-9) in the NFL since 2016. **The Eagles have won each of their last 2 playoff games at Lincoln Financial Field.**

- Carson Wentz (.700, 14-6) owns the 3rd-highest home winning percentage by an NFL QB since 2017, behind Tom Brady (.833, 20-4) and Drew Brees (.810, 17-4) (min. 20 home games). **In that span, Wentz has completed 480-of-719 (66.8%) attempts for 5,277 yards, 40 TDs, 8 INTs and a 102.2 passer rating in 20 games at Lincoln Financial Field.**

QUICK HITS

- From Weeks 14-17, Philadelphia produced at least 400 yards of total offense in every game of a 4+ game winning streak for just the second time in team history (5, 10/25/53-11/21/53).
- The Eagles allowed the 5th-fewest points per game (18.7) in the NFL from Weeks 8-17, trailing only Baltimore (14.0), Buffalo (16.8), Pittsburgh (17.2) and Kansas City (17.6) in that span. **Philadelphia has allowed 17-or-fewer points in 7 of its last 9 games.**
