

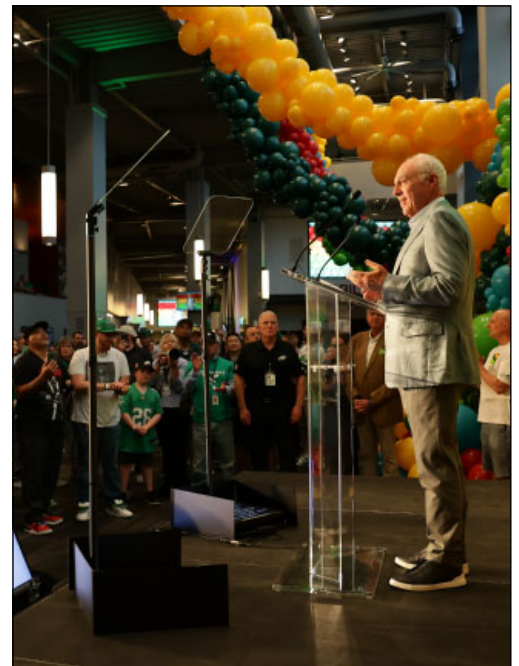



# EAGLES AUTISM FOUNDATION

Established in September 2019, the Eagles Autism Foundation was formed to centralize the team’s autism activities into one organization and to strengthen its charitable mission of assisting individuals and families affected by autism. Led by Chairman and CEO Jeffrey Lurie, the team’s commitment to raising funds for cutting-edge autism research and care programs has grown exponentially, raising more than \$56 million since launching the Eagles Autism Challenge in May 2018.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that one in 31 people living in the United States are on the autism spectrum. While it has become one of the fastest-growing developmental disorders in the country, autism has historically been underfunded, misunderstood, and under-researched.

By delivering the necessary resources to leading institutions, and through year-round fundraising efforts that inspire and engage the community, the Eagles Autism Foundation is turning awareness into action.



## LURIE AUTISM INSTITUTE

Jeffrey Lurie and his family donated a \$50 million gift to Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and Penn Medicine in June 2025 to launch the Lurie Autism Institute.

It is the largest single donation to U.S. academic medical centers focused on autism research across the lifespan.

The Lurie family’s investment strategically leverages CHOP and Penn Medicine’s strengths in autism research and translation to seek answers to the most challenging and important questions around autism.

This first-of-its-kind Institute aims to be a global hub for autism research that connects scientists, clinicians, families, students, and donors.

Powered by CHOP and Penn Medicine’s long history of partnering on

transformative breakthroughs for the care of both children and adults, the Lurie Autism Institute is poised to make fresh discoveries that will reshape how we understand and treat autism.

Through his family’s unprecedented \$50 million gift to help launch the Lurie Autism Institute and the \$56 million raised by the Eagles Autism Foundation, Lurie’s philanthropic impact has contributed more than \$100 million to the global autism research and care community.

In July 2026, as part of ESPYS Week, Lurie was presented with the distinguished Stuart Scott ENSPIRE Award for his lifelong commitment to supporting individuals and families affected by autism.

## \$56 Million+ Raised Since 2018



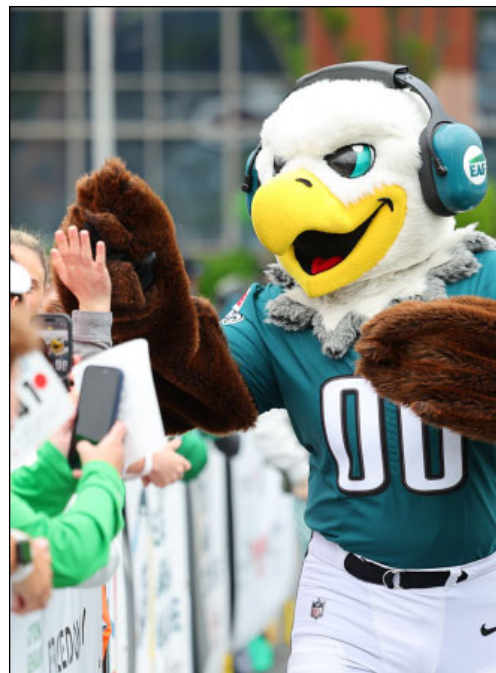
The Eagles Autism Challenge presented by Lincoln Financial is a one-day bike ride and family-friendly 5K run/walk that donates 100% of participant-raised funds to institutions conducting innovative autism research and care.

The event features the Wawa Hoagie 10-Mile Ride, the FreedomPay 5K Run/Walk, and the West Sensory Walk, which offers families and participants a shorter, sensory-friendly course around the perimeter of Lincoln Financial Field.

Participants return to a post-ride celebration, co-presented by West, featuring family-friendly activations, catering, hospitality, an awards ceremony, and closing remarks from Jeffrey Lurie.

Since the inaugural event in 2018, more than 240,000 donations have contributed to the \$56 million raised through the Eagles Autism Foundation.





### SCIENTIFIC REVIEW PANEL

Institutions around the globe are invited to submit proposals every year to the Eagles Autism Foundation for grant research funding. Each project is carefully reviewed by an independent team of scientists who have demonstrated a clear and steadfast commitment to autism research, services, and programs.

Research proposals are evaluated by Dr. Emanuel DiCicco-Bloom, the lead scientific advisor from the Rutgers Health Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, and a team of investigators who are individually selected based on the areas represented in the proposals.

Due in large part to proceeds raised by the Eagles Autism Challenge, a total of 223 research projects and community grants that specialize in treating and caring for those in the autism community have been funded.

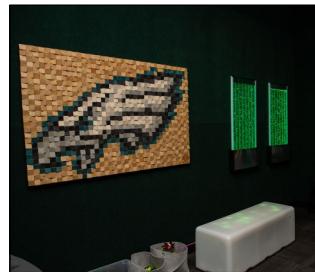


### EAGLES SENSORY ROOMS

On August 4, 2019, the Eagles became one of the first sports franchises to build a state-of-the-art sensory room in its home venue.

Certified by KultureCity as a sensory-inclusive stadium, Lincoln Financial Field's Eagles Sensory Room presented by Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) promotes a calm and supportive environment for guests and fans with sensory challenges.

In 2024, the Mobile Sensory Unit was introduced in partnership with CHOP and KultureCity to provide another resource for individuals with sensory needs. In addition, Lincoln Financial Field has trained staff to assist guests and provides sensory bags, visual schedules, and inclusion resources generously sponsored by the Five Below Foundation.



### SENSORY RESOURCES

In May 2026, the Eagles Autism Foundation partnered with Tork, an Essity brand, to expand accessibility efforts at Lincoln Financial Field. Three Lower Suites restrooms located near the stadium's sensory room underwent a series of major renovations to better serve guests of all abilities.

Upgraded restrooms now feature adult changing tables, higher urinal and stall dividers for enhanced privacy and comfort, warm lighting and soothing music to build a calming ambiance, and more enhanced accessibility features.



### INCLUSION AT SUPER BOWL LX

After setting the standard at Super Bowl LIX, the Eagles Autism Foundation delivered inclusion and accessibility on the NFL's biggest stage at Super Bowl LX with the All Abilities football clinic.

In collaboration with KultureCity and Toyota, the All Abilities Clinics presented by Nouryon were built into the NFL Super Bowl Experience at the Moscone Center.

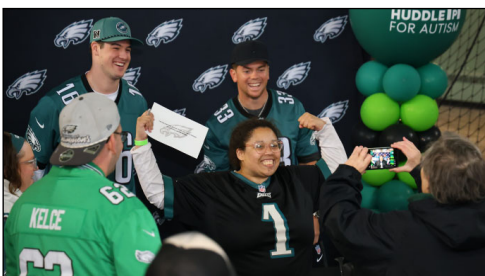
Trained volunteers from UC Berkeley and UC San Francisco provided real-time assistance for the 300 attendees.



The Eagles Radiothon presented by Firsttrust Bank and The Green Family Foundation is a multi-day auction held on SportsRadio 94WIP that offers fans the opportunity to bid on exclusive sports and entertainment experiences involving their favorite Eagles players and 94WIP radio personalities.



Eagles Huddle Up for Autism is an annual event designed specifically for guests with autism and developmental disabilities. Since 2009, Huddle Up has raised more than \$1.25 million for the Center for Autism Research at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia



Through the Eagles Autism Foundation 50/50 Raffle presented by WBE Line Services, one lucky fan at every Eagles home game walks away a winner, with the other half supporting the Eagles Autism Foundation. The largest jackpot in 2025 - \$309,930 - occurred during the home opener.





### EAGLES AUTISM FOUNDATION PRACTICE JERSEYS

The Eagles dedicate a training camp practice each season to the Eagles Autism Foundation by wearing specially designed jerseys to elevate the Foundation’s platform and showcase the team’s commitment of turning autism awareness into action.

The exclusive, one-of-a-kind jerseys feature Energy Green numbers and nameplates, along with the Eagles Autism Foundation logo prominently displayed on the shoulder. Each jersey is signed by the player who wore it and is then auctioned through the annual Eagles Radiothon.



My Cause My Cleats is an NFL initiative that empowers players to showcase their commitment to the causes they support through creative artwork and custom designs on their game cleats.



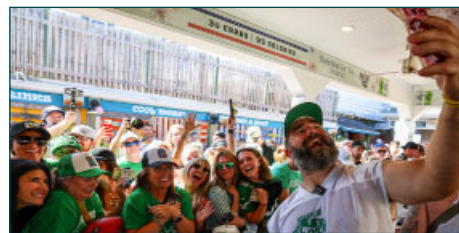
### TRAINING CAMP PUBLIC PRACTICE

The Eagles Training Camp practice at Lincoln Financial Field is open to the public and serves as a vehicle to drive critical funds for autism research and care. All ticket, yard sale, and merchandise proceeds benefit the Eagles Autism Foundation.



### TEAM 62 AT THE OCEAN DRIVE

To help raise funds for the Eagles Autism Foundation, Eagles Legend Jason Kelce hosts an annual celebrity bartending event at the Ocean Drive in Sea Isle City, NJ. Through its first six years, the event has raised more than \$3.69 million for cutting-edge autism research and care programs.



### NEURODIVERSE GAMEDAY STAFF

To further the team’s ongoing commitment to creating employment opportunities for the autism community, the Eagles Autism Foundation matches skills and abilities with the most appropriate gameday roles. Resources are provided to the more than 40 individuals involved in the employment program.



### ALL ABILITIES CLINICS

The All Abilities Clinics presented by Nouryon consist of football, cheer, and drum classes that are designed to promote accessibility for all. STEM clinics presented by Bentley Systems are also available as an additional option for those who wish to participate alongside their peers. The experience includes trained volunteers, smaller group sizes, a visual schedule, and quiet spaces.
