#### ALL-TIME SERIES

Atlanta leads the all-time series between these two teams, 27-25, with the Falcons sweeping the season series in both 2017 and 2018. The Buccaneers bounced back with a 35-22 win in Week 12 of 2019. In 2015, the Buccaneers swept the Falcons for the first time since 2007. Since the NFC South was created in 2002, Atlanta leads the series 18-14. The Buccaneers also swept the season series in 2002, 2005 and 2007, on the way to NFC South titles. The Falcons also swept the series in 2006, 2009, 2010 and 2014. The teams have split their NFC South matchups seven times (2003-04, 2008, 2011-13, 2016).

The two teams first met in 1977, with Atlanta notching a 17-0 win at Tampa Stadium (11/27/77). The Bucs picked up their first win in the series the next season, a 14-9 victory that evened Tampa Bay's record at 2-2, marking the first time the club hit the .500 mark. Tampa Bay's 48-10 home victory to open the 1987 season represented the most points ever scored by a Buccaneers squad in the regular season, a mark that was later broken. Tampa Bay also posted a six-game winning streak in the series, beginning with a victory in 1997.

### 'SACK' BARRETT



• Shaquil Barrett ranks second in the NFL with 16.5 sacks through Week 16 of the 2019 NFL season. **His 16.5 sacks are tied for the most in a single season by any Buccaneers player in team history.**

• Along with sacks, Barrett also ranks second in the

league with 32 quarterback hits and tied for third with 16 tackles for loss.

• Barrett has also generated six forced fumbles and one interception through the first 16 weeks of the season. His six forced fumbles rank third in the NFL.

### QB JAMEIS WINSTON



• Winston **set new franchise records for both passing yards (4,908) and passing touchdowns (31)** this season.

• In Weeks 14-15, Winston became **the first quarterback in NFL history with 450+ passing**

**yards in consecutive games.** He also has five games with 375+ passing yards in 2019, joining Peyton Manning (6 in 2013) and Drew Brees (5 in 2013) as the only quarterbacks in league history with five or more such games in a single season.

• The fifth-year quarterback **currently leads the league in passing yards and ranks second in the NFL in passing touchdowns.** He joined Peyton Manning, Andrew Luck, Dan Marino and Matthew Stafford as the only quarterbacks with at least 4,000 passing yards in three of their first five NFL seasons and ranks second all-time in passing yards by a quarterback through five seasons.

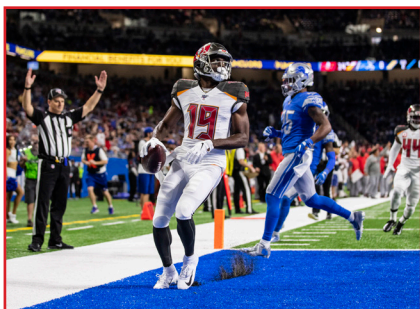

### TRENDING UP



• After beginning the season with 11 receptions for 139 yards and one touchdown through his first nine games played of the year, **Breshad Perriman** has broke out with 20 receptions for 372 yards and four touchdowns over the past four games, including a three-touchdown

performance at Detroit on 12/15/19. **He joined Mike Evans** (9/22/19 vs. NYG), **Jimmie Giles** (10/20/85 at MIA) **and Morris Owens** (10/24/76 vs. MIA) **as the only four players in Buccaneers franchise history to haul in three touchdown receptions in a single game.**

### ROCK SOLID ROOKIE



• Rookie cornerback **Sean Murphy-Bunting** leads the Buccaneers with **three interceptions** this season, which are the most by a Tampa Bay rookie since 2008 and **tied for the fourth-most by a rookie in team history.**

• **His 70-yard pick-six** against the Detroit Lions in Week 15 **was the sixth-longest interception return by any player this season and the longest by a Buccaneers player since Mason Foster** returned a pick 85 yards for a touchdown vs. New Orleans **on 9/15/13.**

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

### **Buccaneers Team**

- Tampa Bay has totaled at least 400 yards in each of the past three games. With 400 or more yards against Atlanta, it would tie the franchise record for consecutive 400-yard games.
- The Buccaneers have thrown 31 touchdowns this season. The team needs five more to tie for the most passing touchdowns in a season in team history (36 2018).
- The Buccaneers have rushed for 15 touchdowns this season. The team needs one more to one more tie for fifth-most (16 in 1978) and two more to tie for the third-most rushing touchdowns in a season in team history (17 in 1984 and 2001).
- The Buccaneers have five defensive touchdowns this season. They need one more to set the single season franchise record (also five in 1981, 2000 and 2002).
- The Buccaneers have three opponent fumble recovery touchdowns this season. They need one more to set the single season franchise record (also three in 1992, 2005 and 2017).
- The Buccaneers have 339 first downs this season. The team needs five more to tie for third-most (344 in 1984) and 32 more to tie for the second-most first downs in a season franchise history (352 in 2017).

### **QB Jameis Winston**

- Winston has 11 games with at least 300 passing yards this season. With one more, he would tie Peyton Manning (12 in 2013) for the second-most such games in a single season in NFL history.
- Winston has thrown for 4,908 yards this season. He needs 162 more to pass Drew Brees (5,069 in 2008) for 10th-most, 177 more to pass Dan Marino (5,084 in 1984) for ninth-most, 190 more to pass Patrick Mahomes (5,097 in 2018) for eighth-most, 222 more to pass Ben Roethlisberger (5,129 in 2018) for seventh-most, 255 more to pass Brees (5,162 in 2013) for sixth-most, 270 more to pass Brees (5,177 in 2012) for fifth-most, 301 more to pass Brees (5,208 in 2016) for fourth-most and 328 more to pass Tom Brady (5,235 in 2011) for the third-most passing yards in a single season in NFL history.
- Winston has 119 career passing touchdowns. He needs three more to tie Derek Carr (122 from 2014-18) for seventh-most and five more to tie Andy Dalton (124 from 2011-15) for the sixth-most passing touchdowns by a player from their rookie season through their fifth season.

### **RB Peyton Barber**

- Barber has six rushing touchdowns this season. He needs two more to tie Mike Alstott (eight in 1998), Warrick Dunn (eight in 2000) and Lars Tate (eight in 1989) for the eighth-most rushing touchdowns in a single season in team history.
- Barber has 15 career rushing touchdowns. He needs one more to tie Ricky Bell (16 from 1977-81) for the eighth-most rushing touchdowns in team history.
- Barber has 1,977 career rushing yards. He needs 71 more to pass Earnest Graham (2,047 from 2004-11) for the 10th-most rushing yards in team history.

### **OLB Shaquil Barrett**

- Barrett has 16.5 sacks on the season. He needs 0.5 more to pass Warren Sapp (16.5 in 2000) for most sacks in a single season in team history.

### **TE Cameron Brate**

- Brate has 26 career touchdown catches. He needs one more to tie Mark Carrier (27 from 1987-92) for fifth-most and two more to tie Joey Galloway (28 from 2004-08) for the fourth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has three career games with multiple touchdown receptions. He needs one more to tie Jimmie Giles for the most ever such games by a Buccaneers tight end and tie for the third-most such games in franchise history.

### **ILB Lavonte David**

- David has 999 career tackles. He one more to reach 1,000 in his career.
- David has 22.5 career sacks. He needs 3.5 more to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and 4.0 more to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the ninth-most sacks in franchise history. Thomas holds the record for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has 11 career interceptions and needs 14 more to tie Derrick Brooks (25 from 1995-2008) for the most interceptions by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has three career defensive touchdowns and needs one more to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).

### **WR Chris Godwin**

- Godwin has 86 receptions this season. He needs one more to pass Mark Carrier (86 in 1989) and Mike Evans (86 in 2018) for third-most, 10 more to tie Evans (96 in 2016) for second-most and 20 more to tie Keyshawn Johnson (106 in 2001) for the most receptions in a single season in team history.
- Godwin has 1,333 receiving yards this season. He needs 52 yards to pass Vincent Jackson (1,384 in 2012) for third-most, 90 yards to pass Mark Carrier (1,422 in 1989) for second-most and 192 yards to pass Mike Evans (1,524 in 2018) for the most receiving yards in a single season in team history.
- Godwin has nine receiving touchdowns this season. He needs one more to tie Joey Galloway (10 in 2005) for fourth-most and two more to tie Mike Williams (11 in 2010) for the third-most receiving touchdowns in a single season in team history.

### **WR Breshad Perriman**

- Perriman has had at least 100 receiving yards in each of the past two games. With 100 receiving yards against Atlanta, he would tie for the second-longest streak of 100-yard receiving games in franchise history.

### **RB Ronald Jones II**

- Jones has six rushing touchdowns this season. He needs two more to tie Mike Alstott (eight in 1998), Warrick Dunn (eight in 2000) and Lars Tate (eight in 1989) for the eighth-most rushing touchdowns in a single season in team history.



## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

### **DL Ndamukong Suh**

- Suh has two fumbles returned for a touchdown this season. With one more, he would tie Link Lyman (1924 Cleveland Bulldogs) as the only players in NFL history to return three fumbles for a touchdown in a single season.

### **OLB Jason Pierre-Paul**

- Pierre-Paul had 3.0 sacks against Houston. With 3.0 or more sacks against Atlanta, he will join Shaquil Barrett (Weeks 2-3, 2019) as the only players in franchise history to post consecutive games with at least 3.0 sacks.

### **K Matt Gay**

- Gay has 27 made field goals this season. He needs one more to pass Martin Gramatica (27 in 1999) and tie more to tie Connor Barth (28 in 2012), Matt Bryant (28 in 2007) and Gramatica (28 in 2000) for the third-most made field goals in a single season in franchise history.
- Gay has 122 points this season. He needs one more to tie Connor Barth (123 in 2012) for fourth-most, four more to tie Martin Gramatica (126 in 2000) for third-most, six more to tie Gramatica (128 in 2002) for second-most and nine more to tie Matt Bryant (131 in 2008) for the most points in a single season in franchise history.

## STANDOUT PERFORMERS

Below are highlights of how select Buccaneers have performed during their careers against the Falcons.

**RB Peyton Barber:** Notched two rushing touchdowns, his first career multi-touchdown game (11/26/17)... Recorded 82 rushing yards and 24 receiving yards, to go along with a receiving touchdown (10/14/18).

**TE Cameron Brate:** Caught his first career touchdown pass and tied for a team-leading 48 receiving yards (11/1/15)... Had five catches for 43 yards and a touchdown (11/3/16)... Had a 15-yard touchdown catch (10/14/18).

**LB Lavonte David:** Has played 13 career games against Atlanta, totaling 106 tackles (18 for loss), five passes defended, one sack, one interception, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery... ## BRUCE ARIANS



Bruce Arians was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019.

Arians is a two-time Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals). He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times.

Prior to arriving in Tampa, Arians spent five seasons as the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals (2013-17) in addition to a 12-game stint as interim head coach for the Indianapolis Colts (2012), compiling a regular season record of 58-33-1. During that 92-game stretch Arians was a head coach, his 58 wins ranked fourth in the NFL, trailing only Bill Belichick (73), Pete Carroll (63) and Mike Tomlin (59).

Throughout his 25-year NFL career, Arians has worked closely with some of the league's top passers including Pro Bowlers Peyton Manning, Ben Roethlisberger, Andrew Luck and Carson Palmer. As an offensive play-caller, Arians has directed top-10 offenses with three different teams (Arizona, Indianapolis and Pittsburgh) over the last nine seasons of his coaching career.

During his time in Arizona, the York, Pennsylvania native compiled a 49-30-1 regular season record (.619 winning percentage). The Cardinals' 49 wins during that span were the seventh-most in the NFL and the third-most in the NFC. Arians won 50 total games in Arizona (49 regular season, one postseason), finishing his time there as the winningest coach in franchise history. His 49 regular season wins are also the most by any coach in Cardinals history.

Arians posted three seasons with double-digit wins as the head coach of the Cardinals, including tying the then-franchise best with 11 in 2014. The following season, Arizona established a new franchise record with 13 wins, which also featured the team's first-ever postseason bye and second-ever appearance in the NFC Championship Game.

Under Arians, the Cardinals offense set several single-season team records, including points scored (489 in 2015), total touchdowns (59 in 2015), total net yards (6,533 in 2015) and first downs (373 in 2015). Arians also helped coach individual players to some of the best seasons of their careers. In 2015, Cardinals quarterback Carson Palmer set franchise records for passing yards (4,671), passing touchdowns (35), yards per attempt (8.70) and passer rating (104.6) en route to a Pro Bowl selection. In 2016, running back David Johnson established new team records for rushing touchdowns (16), total touchdowns (20) and yards from scrimmage (2,118), while leading the NFL in total touchdowns and yards from scrimmage. Wide receiver Larry Fitzgerald posted the top three seasons for receptions in Cardinals history under Arians and ranked third in the NFL in catches during that span.

Arians came to Arizona after spending the 2012 season with Indianapolis. Hired as the team's offensive coordinator, he also served as the team's interim coach for 12 games while head coach Chuck Pagano was treated for leukemia. He led the Colts to a 9-3 record and was selected as the 2012 AP NFL Coach of the Year. Indianapolis' nine-win improvement (2-14 to 11-5) matched the third-largest single-season turnaround in NFL history.

Arians helped the Colts' offense rank 10th in the NFL in yards (362.4 ypg) and seventh in passing yards (258.0 ypg). Rookie quarterback Andrew Luck – the first overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft – made the Pro Bowl and set rookie records for passing yards (4,374) and 300-yard passing games (six). He also established the NFL single-game rookie record for passing yards (433, 11/4 vs. Miami). Luck finished with the then-third-most passing touchdowns by a rookie in NFL history, with 23.



## BRUCE ARIANS

Prior to his time with the Colts, Arians spent eight seasons with the Steelers, five as offensive coordinator (2007-11) and three as the wide receivers coach (2004-06). During his tenure as the offensive coordinator, the Steelers had a 55-25 record, tying Green Bay for the second-best mark in the NFL during that span. Pittsburgh won three AFC North Division titles, two AFC Championships and earned a victory in Super Bowl XLIII over the Cardinals. Arians was also part of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL win as the team's wide receivers coach.

Under Arians' guidance, Steelers quarterback Ben Roethlisberger put together some of the best seasons in team history, establishing a then-franchise record with 32 touchdown passes in 2007, recording a then-team record 4,328 passing yards in 2009 and registering a career-high and Steelers-record 104.1 passer rating in 2007. Roethlisberger earned his first career Pro Bowl selection in 2007 under Arians.

In 2009, the Steelers' offense became the first team in NFL history to have a 4,000-yard passer (Roethlisberger), two 1,000-yard receivers (Antonio Holmes, Hines Ward) and a 1,000-yard rusher (Rashard Mendenhall) in the same season.

Before joining the Steelers, Arians spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator for the Cleveland Browns (2001-03). He joined Cleveland after spending three seasons with the Colts as the team's quarterbacks coach. Working with offensive coordinator Tom Moore, Arians helped tutor Peyton Manning during his first three seasons in the league and helped him earn Pro Bowl berths in 1999 and 2000.

Arians' first NFL job was with the Kansas City Chiefs, working as the team's running backs coach for four seasons (1989-92). There he helped Christian Okoye to two Pro Bowl selections (1989, 1991). Arians also spent the 1996 season as the tight ends coach for the New Orleans Saints.

Arians' coaching career began as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Virginia Tech, in 1975, before being elevated to running backs coach in 1977. He spent 1978-80 with Mississippi State as the school's running backs/wide receivers coach before coaching the running backs at Alabama for two seasons (1981-82) under legendary coach Paul "Bear" Bryant. Arians would later return to Mississippi State (1993-95) and Alabama (1997) to serve as the offensive coordinator for the respective schools. He became one of the youngest head coaches in Division I history when Temple University hired him in 1983 at the age of 30. He spent six seasons coaching the Owls (1983-88).

Born in Paterson, New Jersey, Arians grew up in York, Pennsylvania, and played quarterback at Virginia Tech. He and his wife, Christine, have two children — son, Jake, and daughter, Kristi Anne, as well as a granddaughter, Presley, and a grandson, Aiden.

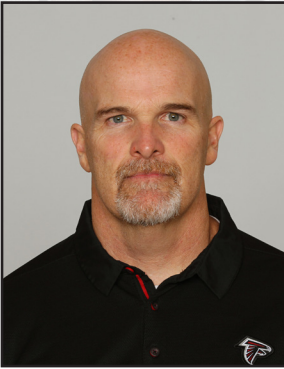

## DAN QUINN



Dan Quinn was named the 16th head coach in Falcons history in February of 2015.

In his first four seasons, he compiled a 36-28 regular season record with two postseason appearances, while leading the club to an NFC title and its second Super Bowl appearance in 2016. Under Quinn's guidance, Atlanta was the only NFC team to return to the playoffs in 2017 after making the tournament in 2016.

Quinn took over the Falcons after serving as the Seattle Seahawks defensive coordinator for the last two seasons (2013-14). During that span, Quinn oversaw the NFL's top defensive unit, as Seattle led the league in yards per game (270.4), points per game (15.2) and passing yards per game (178.8). In his two seasons as the Seahawks defensive coordinator, Quinn's defense helped the team earn consecutive NFC Championships and a win over the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XLVIII.

Quinn originally joined the Seahawks as the assistant head coach/defensive line coach in 2009, after spending the previous six years coaching the defensive line for the San Francisco 49ers (2003-04), Miami Dolphins (2005-06) and New York Jets (2007-08).

Quinn left Seattle in 2011 to becoming the defensive coordinator at the University of Florida (2011-12), where his defenses ranked in the Top 10, including ranking eight nationally in total defense (299.5 yards per game), seventh in passing defense (166.8 pass yards per game) and second in third-down defense (27.1 percent) in his first season.

Quinn began his NFL coaching career in San Francisco as a defensive assistant in 2001, before moving on to coach the defensive line from 2003-04. Following his time in San Francisco, he spent two seasons coaching Miami's defensive line, which ranked second in the NFL with 49 sacks. After Miami, his defensive line with the New York Jets ranked fifth yards per carry allowed (3.7) and seventh in sacks (41).

Quinn got his start coaching the defensive line at William and Mary in 1994, followed by a season at Virginia Military Institute. He held the same position with Hofstra for four years before being promoted to defensive coordinator in 2000.

A Morristown, New Jersey native, Quinn was a four-year letter winner and two-time co-captain at Division III Salisbury (Md.) State as a defensive lineman.

## JASON LIGHT

Jason Licht was named the fifth general manager of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on January 21, 2014. Now in his 24th NFL season, including one as a coach, Licht has had a proven track record of success. Since joining the Miami Dolphins front office in 1995, teams that Licht has been a part of have won over 53 percent of their games, including eight seasons with double-digit victories, while making nine playoff appearances and winning eight division titles, four conference championships and one Super Bowl title. 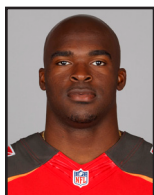
### 2019 NOTABLE FREE AGENTS & TRADE ADDITIONS



OLB **Shaquil Barrett** joined Tampa Bay after spending his first five seasons with the Denver Broncos (2014-18), including winning Super Bowl 50. In the first five years of his career, Barrett played in 61 regular season games, with 15 starts, registering 137 tackles, including 25 for loss, 14.0 sacks, seven forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. He played in four postseason games, recording three tackles.

During the Broncos 2015 Super Bowl season, Barrett tied for second in the NFL in forced fumbles with four on the season.

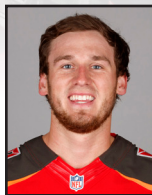
Since joining the Buccaneers, Barrett has made an immediate impact in Tampa Bay. Barrett currently sits second in the league with 16.5 sacks and third with six forced fumbles through Week 16, while also generating one interception. Barrett was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in Week 2 at Carolina and NFC Defensive Player of the Month for September, capping it off with his first career Pro Bowl selection.



WR **Breshad Perriman** came to Tampa Bay after finishing the 2018 NFL season with the Cleveland Browns. Originally a first-round pick (26th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens, Perriman played in 37 career games making 59 receptions for 916 yards and five touchdowns prior to joining the Buccaneers.

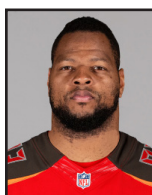
Perriman was a three-year player at the University of Central Florida in Orlando. His 19.5 yards per reception at UCF set a new school record for the Golden Knights.

Perriman has hauled in 31 receptions for 511 yards and five touchdowns over his 13 games played in 2019. In Week 13 at Jacksonville, Perriman set a then career high with 87 receiving yards, then followed that up with 70 yards and a touchdown in a win over Indianapolis in Week 14 and proceeded to notch a career-best 113 receiving yards to go along with three receiving touchdowns in Week 15 at Detroit. In Week 16, he led the team with 102 receiving yards on a career-best seven receptions.



P **Bradley Pinion** came to Tampa Bay after spending his first four seasons with the San Francisco 49ers (2015-18). He originally entered the NFL as a fifth-round pick (165th overall) by the 49ers in the 2015 NFL Draft. The former Clemson Tiger was the lone specialist selected in the draft that year.

Entering the season, Pinion had driven 334 punts for a combined 14,559 yards over his 64 career games. His 112 punts inside the 20 were the fifth-most of any punter since he entered the league in 2015. Pinion accumulated 13,359 net punt yards over that span, which ranked second behind only Rams P Johnny Hekker.



DL **Ndamukong Suh** joined the Buccaneers after spending the 2018 season with the Los Angeles Rams. In 16 games for the Super Bowl runners-up, Suh recorded 59 tackles, 19 quarterback hits, 4.5 sacks, four tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries. In the Rams' three playoff games, including Super Bowl LIII, Suh notched six tackles, five quarterback hits, two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

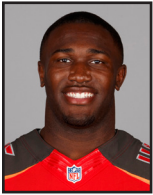
Throughout the first nine years of his career, Suh played in and started 142 games, missing just two games over those nine seasons. The three-time All-Pro and five-time Pro Bowl defensive lineman amassed 481 tackles, 107 tackles for loss, 56.0 sacks, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and one interception in his career. Suh was the NFL AP Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2010 for the Detroit Lions, after being selected second overall by the Lions in the 2010 NFL Draft out of the University of Nebraska.

Suh's 107 tackles for loss entering 2019 were the fifth-most in the NFL since he joined the league in 2010. He also ranked seventh in the NFL during that span with 166 quarterback hits. Among defensive tackles, Suh ranked second in tackles (478), first in tackles for loss (107), third in sacks (56), first in quarterback hits (166) and first in passes defended (32) since 2010.

Since joining the Buccaneers, Suh has made 39 tackles (six for loss) and notched 2.5 sacks. He also recovered a fumble for a touchdown in the Buccaneers' win over the Los Angeles Rams in Week 4 and another in Tampa Bay's win over the Atlanta Falcons in Week 12. Suh became just the second player in Buccaneers history to return multiple fumble recoveries for touchdowns in the same season, joining Rondé Barber (2004). His four fumble recoveries on the season are tied for the second-most single-season fumble recoveries in team history, trailing only Lavonte David's five in 2017.

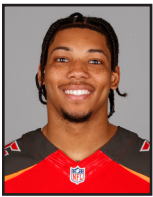


## 2019 DRAFT PICKS



ILB **Devin White** was chosen fifth overall in the 2019 NFL Draft out of LSU. In his three-year career with the Tigers, White played in 38 games, with 25 starts, totaling 286 tackles (29 for loss), 8.5 sacks, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and an interception.

White won the Butkus Award as a junior (2018), given annually to the nation's top linebacker, after starting 12-of-13 games, recording an SEC-best 123 tackles (12 for loss), six passes defended, 3.0 sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. He also earned first-team All-American honors from Walter Camp, Associated Press, Sporting News and the American Football Coaches Association, as well as first-team All-SEC distinction. In his career, he earned six career SEC Defensive Player of the Week Awards (two in 2018, four in 2017), and received the Charles McClendon Award in both 2017 and 2018 as LSU's Most Valuable Player. As a sophomore (2017), White was named second-team All-American and first-team All-SEC, leading the conference in tackles per game (10.2) and ranking second in total tackles (133).



CB **Sean Murphy-Bunting** was selected with the 39th pick in the draft, out of Central Michigan. In his three-year career, Murphy-Bunting started 25-of-38 games played, registering 104 tackles (3.5 for loss), 15 passes defended, nine interceptions, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

In 2018, Murphy-Bunting was named first-team All-Mid-American Conference and earned the Chippewas' Defensive Player of the Year award. In 2017, Murphy-Bunting recorded a career-high five interceptions.



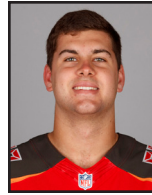
CB **Jamel Dean** was chosen 94th overall, out of Auburn. Dean played in 26 games at Auburn, totaling 73 tackles (4.5 for loss), 17 passes defended, two interceptions and one sack.

Entering the 2018 season, Dean was a preseason All-SEC second-team selection. He tied for the team lead in interceptions, with two, and had the second-most passes defended, with nine. He also ranked second on the team in passes defended in 2018, trailing only former Auburn Tiger and current Buccaneer Carlton Davis.



S **Mike Edwards** was selected 99th overall, out of Kentucky. Edwards did not miss a game in his four-year career with the Wildcats (2014-18), making 51 appearances, with 44 consecutive starts. He earned All-SEC honors three times (2016-18), while being named to the Thorpe Award Watch List twice (2017-18) and the Bronko Nagurski Watch List as a senior (2018). In his career, Edwards recorded 318

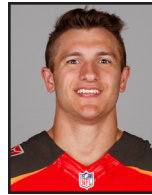
tackles (20.5 for loss), 23 passes defended, 10 interceptions, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. He ranked second in Kentucky history in tackles by a defensive back, while his 10 career interceptions ranked fourth in school history.



OLB **Anthony Nelson** was the 107th overall selection in the 2019 Draft out of Iowa. Nelson played in 37 games for the Hawkeyes, recording 119 tackles (31 for loss), 23.0 sacks, seven passes defended, four forced fumbles and one fumble recovery, which was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown. In his final season at Iowa — after posting 9.5 sacks, tied for the second-most in the Big Ten and tied for the 17th most in the FBS — Nelson was named second-team All-Big-Ten by the league's media and earned third-team honors from Phil Steele, as well as the league's coaches. He also earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for his effort against Minnesota, after matching a career high with three sacks.



K **Matt Gay** was chosen with the 145th selection. Gay played two seasons at Utah, connecting on 56-of-65 career field goal attempts (86.2 pct.), while also making all 85 extra point attempts. Gay won the Lou Groza Award as the country's top kicker in 2017 and was a semifinalist in 2018. A two-time All-American, Gay also earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors in both of his seasons with the Utes. He ranks third all-time in field goals made, including establishing a school record for field goals of 50-or-more yards made (eight). His career 86.2 field goal percentage ranks second in school history while his 253 kicking points scored rank third. In 2018, Gay set a school record with 21 consecutive made field goals.



WR **Scotty Miller** was the 208th selection in the draft, out of Bowling Green. In his career, Miller started 34-of-45 games played, catching 215 passes for 2,867 yards for 23 touchdowns. A three-time All-MAC selection (first-team 2016, second-team 2018, third-team 2017), Miller finished his career tied for the third-most receptions in school history, while ranking third in receiving yards. In 2018, Miller posted a career-best 1,148 receiving yards, the third-most in a season in school history. His 104.4 receiving yards per game in 2018 ranked him seventh in the FBS.

## HONOR ROLL

Below is a look at awards and honors Buccaneers players have received so far in the 2019 NFL season:

### **OLB SHAQUIL BARRETT**

- **2019 Pro Bowl Selection** - Barrett was voted into the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career, rewarding him for a breakout season in which he ranks second in the NFL with 16.5 sacks (tied for the single-season team record), adding 32 quarterback hits, 16 tackles for loss and six forced fumbles. His 16.5 sacks are the most in a season by an undrafted player, since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.
- **NFC Defensive Player of the Week (Week 2 at CAR, 2019)** - Recorded four quarterback hits and 3.0 sacks in a divisional win over the Panthers. He became just the second Buccaneers player, since at least 1991, to record three sacks in a single quarter when he did so in the third quarter versus the Panthers.
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 3 vs. NYG, 2019)** - Racked up career-highs with 4.0 sacks and two forced fumbles to go along with five quarterback hits and four hurries.
- **NFC Defensive Player of the Month (September, 2019)** - Recorded 9.0 sacks over for games, which tied an NFL record for sacks in that span. Led the NFL with his 10 quarterback hits, 9.0 sacks and seven tackles for loss, while also tying for third in the league with three forced fumbles. Barrett also recorded the first interception of his NFL career in the Buccaneers Week 4 matchup with the Los Angeles Rams.
- **Pro Football Focus NFC Defensive Player of the Month (September, 2019)** - Given a 89.4 pass-rushing grade by PFF for his 172 pass-rush snaps in the month of September. According to PFF's metrics, Barrett ranked fourth in pass-rush grade, fourth in total pressures (25) and tied for 12th in pass-rush win percentage (19.6 percent) among players with at least 80 pass-rush snaps through Week 4.
- **Pro Football Focus First-Quarter NFL All-Pro Team (Weeks 1-4, 2019)**

### **ILB LAVONTE DAVID**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 8 at TEN, 2019)** - Recorded 12 tackles (one for loss) and one pass defense, including four defensive stops and zero missed tackles.
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 15 at DET, 2019)** - Recorded nine tackles (two for loss), one forced fumble and one pass defended, while also making three stops in coverage.

### **CB CARLTON DAVIS**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 11 vs. NO, 2019)** - Allowed just two receptions for 11 yards on three targets against the Saints, notching one pass defended.

### **CB JAMEL DEAN**

- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 10 vs. ARI, 2019)** - Allowed just one reception for -2 yards on five targets, adding an interception in the red zone that set up a game-winning drive for Tampa Bay.

### **WR MIKE EVANS**

- **2019 Pro Bowl Selection** - Evans was named to the Pro Bowl for the third time in his career, finishing his season with 67 receptions for 1,157 yards and eight touchdowns. He surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for the sixth consecutive season, joining Randy Moss as the only players in NFL history to accomplish that feat. At the time he was placed on Injured Reserve, Evans was fourth in the NFL in receiving yards, tied for fourth in receiving touchdowns and sixth with 17.3 yards per reception.
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 3 vs. NYG, 2019)** - Caught eight passes for 190 yards and three touchdowns, including 146 yards receiving and three touchdowns in the first half alone.
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 8 at TEN, 2019)** - Caught 11 passes for 198 yards and two touchdowns. His 198 yards are the fifth-most in a single game in Buccaneers history.
- **Pro Football Focus Team of the Week (Week 9 at SEA, 2019)** - Caught 12 passes for 180 yards and one touchdown. He became the first receiver in team history to post back-to-back games with 150+ yards receiving.

### **WR CHRIS GODWIN**

Prior to Godwin's injury in Week 15, he ranked second in the NFL in receiving yards, tied for second in receiving touchdowns and tied for sixth in receptions. He had six performances with 100-or-more receiving yards, which are the second-most in the NFL behind only Michael Thomas. In addition, his three games with multiple touchdown receptions are tied for most in the league and his 1,333 receiving yards are the fourth-most for a single season in team history.

Against Buffalo (12/8/13), David recorded two interceptions, becoming the first Buccaneer to record multiple interceptions in the same game since CB Aqib Talib in 2010 (2 at ARI, 10/31/10) and the first Buccaneers linebacker to record multiple interceptions in the same game since Derrick Brooks (2 vs. CHI, 10/24/99).
