

REVIEW OF EAGLES' 1974 SEASON

St. Louis 7, Eagles 3

September 15 at St. Louis

The Eagles failed to score from nine yards out in the final minute as St. Louis, the eventual NFC Eastern Division champion, posted a 7-3 victory. Roman Gabriel directed the Birds from their own 21-yard line to the St. Louis nine with 27 seconds remaining but four straight passes misfired. Despite being sacked five times, Gabriel completed 23 of 39 passes for 208 yards. Tom Dempsey kicked a 44-yard field goal in the first period to give the Eagles their only lead of the game.

Joe Lavender and Tom Dempsey were the heroes as the Eagles opened their home season with a 13-10 nationally televised win over Dallas. With the Cowboys leading 7-0 and driving toward another score. Lavender scooped up a Doug Dennison fumble and raced 96 yards for the longest fumble return touchdown in Eagles' history. Early in the fourth period, Dempsey booted a 33-yard field goal to give the Eagles a 10-7 lead but Mac Percival's 26-yard three pointer later in the period set up Dempsey's game breaker. With 25 seconds remaining in regulation time, Tom converted a 45-yard attempt in a stiff crosswind to guarantee the upset win.

Randy Logan, on a safety blitz, knocked the ball loose from Fouts and tackle Bill Dunstan recovered the ball in mid air and rambled 46 yards for his first NFL touchdown. The Eagles' deciding score came on a one-yard Tom Sullivan run at the end of a 10-play drive in the second period.

Dallas broke the Eagles' four-game winning streak in a classic NFL battle that also saved the Cowboys from virtual elimination in the NFL playoff chase. Tom Dempsey's 39-yard field goal gave the Birds a 17-14 halftime lead and Don Zimmerman's 64-yard reception from Roman Gabriel gave Philadelphia a 24-17 advantage in the third period. Dallas came back to score the final two touchdowns, mainly on the running strength of Calvin Hill who gained 140 yards on 26 carries and scored on runs of 17 and two yards.

Philadelphia settled for a Tom Dempsey 18-yard field goal in the 3rd period after booing fans, protesting an official's call, delayed the game for 22 minutes while the Eagles' offense waited with a first down at the New Orleans' seven-yard line. When play resumed, the Birds lost a sure touchdown when Charles Young caught Roman Gabriel's pass just beyond the end zone line.
