Philadelphia Eagles 38
Carolina Panthers 10



Bolstered by stifling defensive pressure on Panthers quarterbacks, the Eagles registered seven takeaways and five sacks en route to a 38-10, opening day romp of the Carolina Panthers in Charlotte. Eagles cornerback Sheldon Brown notched two of the Eagles five interceptions as they scored 24 points off turnovers. Trailing 7-0 following an 8-minute touchdown drive by the Panthers on the game's opening possession, the Eagles responded with a 49-yard field goal by David Akers after Brown's first interception later in the first quarter. On the first play of the 2nd quarter, Panthers QB Jake Delhomme fumbled after a sack by a blitzing Trent Cole. Fellow defensive end Victor Abiamiri scooped up the loose ball at the Panthers 2-yard line and scored to give the Eagles a 10-7 lead. The Eagles scoring barrage was just beginning, though, as DeSean Jackson returned a Panthers punt 85 yards for a touchdown on their ensuing possession. Brown came up with his 2nd interception of the game on the Panthers next possession to set up a 9-yard touchdown pass from Donovan McNabb to TE Brent Celek. After a 3-and-out by the Panthers, McNabb led the Eagles on a 74-yard drive that was capped off by a 4-yard shovel pass to RB Brian Westbrook, giving the Eagles a commanding 31-7 lead late in the 2nd quarter. Although the Panthers would tack on a field goal in the waning moments of the first half, they would not score again. In fact, after rolling up 70 yards of offense on their first possession, Carolina would gain just 99 more for the rest of the game. The only scoring in the 2nd half would occur on a 3-yard touchdown run by McNabb, who suffered a fractured rib on the play that sidelined him for the remainder of the game. That touchdown was set up by the first interception of LB Akeem Jordan's career.

Notes: The Eagles scored an offensive, defensive, and special teams touchdown in the same game for the first time since 12/24/94 at Cincinnati ... The Eagles defense forced seven turnovers (five interceptions, two fumbles), which was the highest total since they forced seven vs. St. Louis on 1/2/00. It was also their highest interception total since 9/30/96 vs. Dallas, when they also posted five ... Brown's two-interception game was the 2nd of his career (10/2/05 at KC), and the first time an Eagle did so since Lito Sheppard snared two on 10/8/06 vs. Dallas ... Jackson was named NFC special teams player of the week for his performance. His 85-yard punt return for a touchdown was the 2nd longest in team history (Vai Sikahema, 87 yards on 11/22/92 at NYG) ... Abiamiri's touchdown was the first of his life ... FS Macho Harris became the first Eagles rookie to start at safety on opening day since Wes Hopkins on 9/3/83 at San Francisco. Harris also became the first Eagles rookie defensive player to start on opening day since DT Corey Simon on 9/3/00 at Dallas ... Westbrook played in his 100th regular season game.

Philadelphia Eagles 22 New Orleans Saints 48



New Orleans broke open a close game with a 31-point scoring barrage in the final 30 minutes that sent the Eagles home with a 48-22 loss in their home opener. The Eagles and Saints were tied, 10-10, heading into the final minutes of the first half. But Saints QB Drew Brees connected with Marques Colston for his 2nd touchdown of the game with 43 seconds to play, giving the Saints the lead for good at 17-10. The Eagles did respond with a 32-yard field goal by David Akers as time expired in the half to cut the lead to 17-13, but the game went downhill quickly from there for the home squad. First, Ellis Hobbs fumbled the 2nd half kickoff and the Saints turned that into an 11-yard TD pass from Brees to FB Heath Evans. On the ensuing possession, Kevin Kolb, making his first NFL start in place of an injured Donovan McNabb (fractured rib), was intercepted by LB Scott Shanle. Four plays later, Saints RB Mike Bell scored on a 7-yard TD run, giving the Saints a commanding 31-13 lead. New Orleans upped their lead to 21 points after a field goal by John Carney before Eagles WR Jason Avant grabbed a 3-yard scoring pass from Kolb on a fourth down play late in the third stanza. But New Orleans scored on a 19-yard run by Reggie Bush early in the fourth quarter to seal the victory for the Saints, who also scored on a 97-yard interception return by Darren Sharper in the final minutes of the contest. Kolb started quickly for the Eagles as he found Jackson for a 71-yard scoring play on just the fourth play from scrimmage. That touchdown tied the game at 7 after Brees connected with Colston for a 15-yard TD on the game's opening possession.

Notes: Kolb's 391 passing yards were the 12th-highest total in team history and the most by an Eagle since McNabb threw for 464 on 12/4/04 vs. Green Bay. It was also the highest yardage total ever for an Eagles quarterback in his first NFL start ... Jackson's 71-yard TD catch was the longest of his career ... Jackson and TE Brent Celek each topped the 100-yard mark in receiving yards, becoming the first WR/TE tandem to do so in one game for the Eagles since WR Terrell Owens and TE L.J. Smith reached the century mark on 9/18/05 vs. San Francisco ... The last time multiple Eagles topped the 100-yard receiving mark in the same game was in the 2008 home opener vs. St. Louis (Jackson, WR Greg Lewis and WR Hank Baskett).

Philadelphia Eagles 34 Kansas City Chiefs 14



Playing without injured offensive starters Donovan McNabb, Brian Westbrook and Kevin Curtis, the Eagles piled up 420 yards of total offense in a 34-14 romping of the visiting Kansas City Chiefs. Although the majority of headlines heading into the game featured the return of QB Michael Vick to the NFL, the Eagles highlights were manufactured by a quartet of youngsters in QB Kevin Kolb (24-34 passing for 327 yards and 2 TDs), RB LeSean McCoy (20-84 rushing), TE Brent Celek (8-104-1TD) and WR DeSean Jackson (6-149-1TD). In fact, Kolb became the first quarterback in NFL history to eclipse the 300-yard passing mark in his first two NFL starts. The Eagles opened the game with two touchdowns on their first three possessions as McCoy (5-yard run after a direct snap) and Kolb (11-yard QB sneak) each scored for the first time in their respective NFL careers. After the Chiefs cut the lead to 14-7 early in the 2nd quarter, the Eagles responded on their next play from scrimmage as Kolb and Jackson connected on a 64-yard TD strike to give the Eagles a two touchdown lead. Two field goals by David Akers upped the Eagles lead to 27-7 until Kolb fired his third touchdown pass in the 4th quarter, a 35-yard strike to Brent Celek, to seal the victory.

Notes: At halftime, Randall Cunningham and Al Wistert were inducted into the Eagles Honor Roll ... Jackson became the first NFL player to post a 60-plus yard play in three consecutive games since the Chiefs Dante Hall in 2003 (four straight games) and the first Eagle to do so since Jack Ferrante in 1945 ... Jackson also became the first Eagle since 1985 (Mike Quick) to have 60-plus yard TD receptions in consecutive games ... Jackson and Celek became the first Eagles duo to notch 100-yard receiving games in back-to-back games since Pete Pihos and Bobby Walston in 1953 ... In fact, Celek became the first Eagles tight end to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Pete Retzlaff did so in 1965 ... The Chiefs were 0-11 on third down opportunities ... Vick became the 2nd left-handed QB to throw a pass in team history joining Allie Sherman ... Kevin Kolb was named NFC offensive player of the week for his performance.

Philadelphia Eagles 33 Tampa Bay Buccaneers 14



Donovan McNabb posted near-perfect statistics from the quarterback position and rookie receiver Jeremy Maclin provided big plays in a starting role as the Eagles burned the visiting Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 33-14. Making his first start since the season opener due to a fractured rib, McNabb completed 76.2 percent of his passes (16 for 21) for 264 yards and three touchdowns en route to the 2nd best QB rating of his career (157.2). But it was McNabb's feet that boosted the Eagles offense early as a 13-yard scamper on the first play from scrimmage set up a 51-yard scoring strike to Maclin, giving them an early 7-0 advantage. Midway through the 2nd quarter, Tampa Bay drove deep into Eagles territory and faced a 4th-and-1 at the Eagles 23-yard line, but quarterback Josh Johnson fumbled the snap and was stopped short of the first down. Six plays later, McNabb connected with FB Leonard Weaver on a 20-yard scoring play to give the Eagles a 14-0 lead. Johnson and the Bucs responded on the ensuing possession with an impressive 5-play, 80-yard drive that was capped by a 9-yard TD grab by TE Kellen Winslow. Undaunted by the momentum swing, McNabb rushed for 17 yards on the next play from scrimmage before connecting with Maclin once again for a 40-yard score. With six seconds remaining in the first half and situated at the Eagles 8-yard line, Johnson fired his first of three INTs in the game as CB Asante Samuel grabbed an errant pass in the end zone. Samuel stung the Bucs in the 3rd quarter as well as his 2nd interception set up a 7-yard TD run by Brian Westbrook to give Philadelphia a commanding 28-7 lead. David Akers upped the score to 31-7 in the 4th quarter after booting a 44-yard field goal. That score was set up by another interception by Johnson as Sheldon Brown stopped a red zone scoring opportunity by the Bucs. Winslow grabbed another TD pass midway through the 4th quarter to cut the lead to 31-14 but Eagles DE Darren Howard tackled RB Cadillac Williams in the end zone for a safety to set the final score at 33-14.

Notes: Eagles coach Andy Reid became the 34th head coach in NFL history and the first in team history to post 100 regular season victories ... Maclin became the first Eagles rookie ever to post two 40-plus-yard TD receptions in the same game. His 142 receiving yards were the third most by a rookie in club history behind Don Looney (180 on 12/1/40 at Washington) and Hank Baskett (177 on 12/31/06 vs. Atlanta) ... Akers connected on four PAT attempts to become the franchise's all-time leader ahead of Bobby Walston (365) ... Samuel's two-INT performance was the 5th multi-interception game of his career and his first as an Eagle ... Trent Cole notched his 38th career sack, moving ahead of Seth Joyner (37.5) for 6th place on the Eagles all-time list.

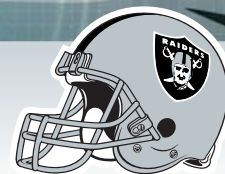

Philadelphia Eagles 9 Oakland Raiders 13



The Eagles surrendered six sacks, 116 rushing yards and the game's only touchdown in a 13-9 loss to the Raiders at the Oakland Alameda County Coliseum. Philadelphia's offense sputtered all day long in the midst of heavy pressure on QB Donovan McNabb, who completed just 48% of his passes (22 for 48). The Eagles led 3-0 late in the first quarter before Raiders tight end Zach Miller caught a pass from JaMarcus Russell and broke several tackles before racing 86 yards for a touchdown. On the very next play from scrimmage, McNabb was intercepted by Raiders CB Stanford Routt, who returned the ball 28 yards for a score. But the play was nullified by a pass interference penalty. The Raiders, however, managed to force a punt and promptly drove 76 yards on 12 plays to set up a 29-yard field goal by Sebastian Janikowski to give them a 10-3 lead. Late in the 2nd quarter, Eagles S Quintin Mikell intercepted a Russell pass attempt and returned it 16 yards to the Raiders 40-yard line. However, the Eagles drive stalled as they settled for a 43-yard field goal by Akers to close the halftime deficit to 10-6. Philadelphia started quickly in the 3rd quarter driving inside Raiders territory, but Akers misfired for the 2nd time in the game as he missed a 47-yard attempt. From there, the Eagles offense went three-and-out on their next four possessions. Janikowski boomed a 46-yard field goal early in the 4th quarter to up the Raiders lead to 13-6. Midway through the fourth quarter, McNabb hit tight end Brent Celek with a 46-yard strike across the middle to set the Eagles up deep inside Raiders territory. But they did not gain another yard on that possession as they settled for a 45-yard field goal by Akers. Down by four points with 3:42 to play, the Eagles regained possession but turned the ball over on downs at the Raiders 43-yard line.

Notes: Eagles RB Brian Westbrook moved past Steve Van Buren (5,860) and into 2nd place on the Eagles all-time rushing list ... The Eagles made their first visit to Oakland since September 24, 1995 ... Eagles CB Asante Samuel posted his 30th career interception.

Washington Redskins 17



Behind the big-play ability of WR DeSean Jackson and a stingy defense, the Philadelphia Eagles trounced the Washington Redskins, 27-17, on Monday Night Football at FedEx Field. Jackson recorded two touchdowns of 50+ yards on the evening – one on the ground and one through the air. The Eagles defense was especially bolstered by newly acquired LB Will Witherspoon, who made his Eagle debut a memorable one by registering a sack, forced fumble and an interception returned for a touchdown. Witherspoon was acquired in a trade with the St. Louis Rams just six days earlier and worked overtime throughout the practice week to digest the defensive playbook. Jackson and Witherspoon wasted no time giving the Eagles a commanding lead early in the game as Jackson took an end around from Donovan McNabb on the 4th play from scrimmage and raced 67 yards down the sideline to give his team a 7-0 lead. Later in the 1st quarter, Redskins QB Jason Campbell had a pass attempt deflected by SS Quintin Mikell into the hands of Witherspoon, who trotted nine yards into the end zone for a touchdown, making it 14-0. Another Washington turnover resulted in another score by Philadelphia, as Witherspoon sacked and forced a fumble by Campbell that was recovered by Mikell and set up a 47-yard field goal by David Akers. The Redskins responded on their ensuing possession with a touchdown pass from Campbell to WR Devin Thomas to shrink the lead to 17-7, but another Redskins turnover proved costly later in the quarter. Antwaan Randle El muffed a punt return inside his own territory, setting up another Akers field goal. Then, Jackson broke the game open once again with another big play late in the 2nd quarter as he hauled in a 57-yard bomb on a 3rd-and-22 play from McNabb to give the visiting team a 27-7 lead. The Redskins answered with a field goal in the waning seconds of the first half, but would not score again until less than three minutes remained in the game when Campbell and TE Fred Davis connected on a 2-yard touchdown for the final score of the game.

Notes: McNabb became the 4th player in NFL history to throw for over 30,000 yards and 200 touchdowns while rushing for over 3,000 yards and 20 touchdowns in a career. Only John Elway, Fran Tarkenton and Steve Young have reached all of those plateaus ... Jackson became the 2nd player in team history to post a rushing and receiving touchdown of 50+ yards in the same game, joining Bosh Pritchard, who accomplished that feat vs. Washington on 10/23/49 ... Jackson became the 5th player in league history to register a rushing, receiving and punt return TD in each of his first two NFL campaigns (Louis Lipps, Ray McLean, Bobby Mitchell and Dick Todd were the others) ... Witherspoon became the 2nd NFL player to record a sack and an interception return for a TD in his first game with a team, joining Buffalo's Sam Adams in 2003 ... Eagles DE Trent Cole notched two sacks and moved past Andy Harmon (40) and into 5th place on the team's all-time list.

Philadelphia Eagles 40 New York Giants 17



On a rare day when Philadelphia and New York were battling in both baseball and football on the same day in the same city, the Eagles stomped the visiting Giants, 40-17, at Lincoln Financial Field. Donovan McNabb was a usual suspect in leading the Eagles to victory (240 yards, three touchdowns, and a 146.7 QB rating), but it was back-up running back LeSean McCoy (11-82-1TD rushing) and FB Leonard Weaver (8-75-1TD) heading up the ground game in the absence of star RB Brian Westbrook (concussion). In fact, it was Weaver who opened the scoring with a 41-yard jaunt on the game's opening possession. On the Giants ensuing drive, CB Asante Samuel stepped in front of an Eli Manning pass and raced 37 yards to the Giants 10-yard line. Three plays later, McNabb fired a 17-yard scoring strike to TE Brent Celek on 3rd down to give Philadelphia a fast 13-0 lead (the Giants blocked the extra point attempt). David Akers nailed a 30-yard field goal three plays into the 2nd quarter to improve the lead to 16-0. But the Giants responded late in the first half with an 89-yard drive that was capped by an 18-yard pass from Manning to TE Kevin Boss. With less than two minutes left to play until intermission, the Eagles responded with a 39-yard kickoff return that led to 54-yard TD toss to DeSean Jackson, and an interception by safety Quintin Demps that produced a 23-yard TD pass to rookie Jeremy Maclin. Armed with a 30-7 lead at half, the Eagles forced a fumble on the kickoff to start the 2nd half that led to a 35-yard field goal by Akers. The Giants would not quit, though, as they used a field goal and a 1-yard scoring plunge by RB Ahmad Bradshaw to pull to within 33-17 as the 4th quarter began. But McCoy ended New York's comeback hope with a 66-yard dart to the end zone on the 2nd play of the final stanza to set the final score at 40-17.

Notes: Later in the evening, the Philadelphia Phillies and the New York Yankees battled in game four of the World Series ... The Eagles 23-point margin of victory was their largest over the Giants since winning 24-0 on 12/1/96 at Veterans Stadium ... The Eagles 40 points was the highest total against the Giants since scoring 47 in a win on 11/22/92 at Giants Stadium ... McNabb's 146.7 QB rating was the 5th best of his career and his best ever against the Giants ... Weaver logged a career-high 75 yards and his 41-yard TD run was the longest run by an Eagles fullback since Anthony Toney's 44-yarder on 10/8/89 vs. NYG ... McCoy's 66-yard TD run was the longest by an Eagles rookie since Herman Hunter's 74-yard scoring run at Dallas on 11/24/85.

Philadelphia Eagles 16 Dallas Cowboys 20



The Eagles dropped a hard-fought battle for first place in the NFC East with a 20-16 defeat at the hands of the Dallas Cowboys at Lincoln Financial Field. Both teams entered the nationally televised Sunday night football game with a 5-2 record but it was the Cowboys, after overcoming a 13-10 deficit in the 2nd half, who ended up on the top of the division at the end of the night. The Eagles started slow on offense as evidenced by an interception on their first series of the evening. Donovan McNabb fired a pass over the middle of the field to WR Jeremy Maclin, who had the ball deflect off of him and into the hands of Dallas safety Gerald Sensabaugh. Seven plays later, Cowboys RB Tashard Choice took a direct snap from center and scored on a two-yard TD run giving them an early 7-0 lead. The Eagles responded in the 2nd quarter with a pair of scoring drives led by McNabb to pull them within one point at 7-6. David Akers connected on a pair of long distance field goals (45 and 48 yards, respectively) to account for the scoring. With under two minutes remaining in the first half, Dallas QB Tony Romo connected with Patrick Crayton on a 64-yard pass play setting up a field goal with just 4 seconds until intermission. The Eagles responded in the 2nd half by taking the kickoff 96 yards for a score, but a holding penalty nullified the touchdown by Ellis Hobbs. Undaunted, McNabb and the Eagles drove 77 yards on six plays, culminating in an 11-yard TD pass to TE Brent Celek that gave Philly their first and only lead of the contest at 13-10. The Cowboys took advantage of another interception late in the 3rd quarter as Mike Jenkins stepped in front of a McNabb pass at the Dallas 45-yard line. Five plays later, Nick Folk connected on a 33-yard field goal to tie the game at 13-13. On their ensuing possession, the Eagles drove into Dallas territory and, facing a 4th-and-1 situation, called a quarterback sneak by McNabb, who appeared to have gained the first down but was spotted short. Eagles head coach Andy Reid's challenge of the play was upheld by the officials and gave Dallas the momentum they needed. Facing a 3rd-and-14 at the Eagles 49-yard line, Romo pump faked and connected with WR Miles Austin on a TD pass to give them the lead for good. The Eagles responded once again with a drive deep into Dallas territory only to have McNabb tripped up for a sack on a 3rd-and-10 play at the 34-yard line. The Eagles settled for a 52-yard field goal by Akers and hoped to regain possession with 4:27 to play, but the Cowboys converted a 3rd down pass from Romo to TE Jason Witten that allowed them to run out the clock and give them sole possession of first place in the NFC East.

Notes: Including playoffs, this game represented the 100th all-time meeting between the Eagles and Cowboys ... Akers nailed three field goals of 40+ yards in a game for the 2nd time this season and the 5th time in his career (including playoffs) ... Eagles S Quintin Mikell played in his 100th regular season game.

The Eagles made a valiant comeback attempt in the 4th quarter, but could not overcome a slew of missed opportunities early in the game as they fell to the host San Diego Chargers, 31-23, at Qualcomm Stadium. The Eagles fell behind 14-0 early on in the contest on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Philip Rivers to FB Mike Tolbert and on a 3-yard touchdown run by LaDainian Tomlinson early in the 2nd stanza. After a slow start, the Eagles offense finally started rolling. They put together two lengthy drives in the 2nd quarter only to be held to field goals on each opportunity deep in the red zone. On the first occasion, the Eagles were set up first and goal at the Chargers 1-yard line, but were stopped three straight plays. They failed to score a touchdown again after having a 1st-and-goal later in the quarter at the Chargers 9-yard line. Trailing 14-6 heading into the 2nd half, the Eagles were forced to punt during their first possession of the 3rd quarter and the Chargers promptly drove 76 yards on five plays and scored on a 20-yard TD run by Tomlinson. Philadelphia cruised down the field again with the help of a 58-yard catch and run by Jason Avant but was held out of the end zone after facing a 1st-and-10 at the San Diego 16, and a 3rd-and-1 at the 7-yard line before settling for another field goal. The Chargers upped their lead to 28-9 after a 20-yard scoring pass from Rivers to WR Legedu Naanee late in the 3rd quarter. Donovan McNabb and the Eagles offense would not lie down, though, as they drove 54 yards on nine plays, including a highlight film, 21-yard grab from Avant on 3rd and 18, to set up a five-yard TD catch by Jeremy Maclin. After a three-and-out by the Chargers, McNabb led a 77-yard drive that was capped by a six-yard TD catch by TE Brent Celek that pulled the Eagles within 5 points at 28-23. With momentum clearly on the Eagles side, San Diego converted two important third down plays, leading to a 29-yard field goal by Nate Kaeding to increase their lead to 31-23. With less than 30 seconds to play, McNabb drove the Eagles to the Chargers 35-yard line. But with 2 seconds remaining, his last throw into the end zone was intercepted to end the game.

Notes: With 450 passing yards, McNabb eclipsed the 400-yard plateau for the 2nd time in his career and tied a career high with 35 completions ... Avant set career highs in catches (8), yards (156), while recording the longest reception of his career (58 yards) ... Eagles WR DeSean Jackson tied a career high with 8 catches ... The game marked the Eagles first visit to San Diego since 1998.

Donovan McNabb's homecoming to Chicago was punctuated with a come-from-behind victory in the final minutes of the 4th quarter as the Eagles defeated the Bears, 24-20, on Sunday Night Football. Trailing 20-17, McNabb orchestrated an 11-play, 62-yard drive that was capped off by a 10-yard touchdown scamper by rookie RB LeSean McCoy with 5:31 remaining in regulation. On that drive, McNabb completed 5 of 6 pass attempts for 40 yards. For the game, he completed 71.9% of his passes (23 for 32) for 244 yards and two touchdowns for a QB rating of 101.6. The Eagles also started fast, literally, as a no-huddle offense propelled them to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter after a 25-yard field goal by David Akers and a 13-yard scoring pass from McNabb to WR Jason Avant, another Chicago native. But the Bears took advantage of Eagles turnovers and penalties to take a 12-10 lead early in the 3rd quarter with four field goals by Robbie Gould. Later in that quarter, WR DeSean Jackson made up for an earlier fumble with a 48-yard TD catch to give Philadelphia a 17-12 lead. But the Bears bounced right back with a 6-play, 55-yard drive that resulted in a 15-yard TD pass from Jay Cutler to TE Kellen Davis. After a successful two-point conversion pass, the Bears held a 20-17 lead heading into the final quarter. The Eagles survived a fumble by McCoy in Philadelphia territory as rookie DT Antonio Dixon blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt by Gould to stifle a Bears scoring opportunity. That block set the stage for McNabb's and McCoy's heroics on the decisive scoring drive. After McCoy's TD, Eagles FS Sean Jones sealed the win with his first interception as an Eagle.

Notes: Akers became the 28th player in NFL history to kick 250 field goals ... McNabb tied Ron Jaworski (142) for most regular season games played by a quarterback in Eagles history ... Eagles CB Asante Samuel played in his 100th career regular season game ... Dixon's field goal block was the first by the an Eagle since Trent Cole did so on 12/7/08 at NYG ... Philadelphia won for the first time on NBC Sunday Night Football after dropping their first seven such contests

Philadelphia Eagles 27 Washington Redskins 24



Donovan McNabb led the Eagles to their 2nd straight come-from-behind victory as the Eagles erased an eight point deficit in the fourth quarter to down the visiting Washington Redskins, 27-24. Trailing 24-16 following a 25-yard field goal by Washington with 11:42 remaining in the contest, McNabb pumped newfound life into the Eagles offense who had suffered 3 three-and outs and an interception in their first four possessions of the 2nd half. The Eagles drove 90 yards in 10 plays, including 66 on two catches by WR Jason Avant (46 and 20) to set up a one-yard TD plunge by RB Eldra Buckley. On the ensuing two-point conversion attempt, McNabb shoved a pass to rookie RB LeSean McCoy, who miraculously stayed on his feet to dive into the end zone and tie the game at 24. After the Redskins were forced to punt on their ensuing possession, McNabb connected with rookie WR Jeremy Maclin on a 35-yard pass that led to a 32-yard game-winning kick by David Akers, his 16th consecutive made and his fourth of the day. The Redskins took an early 7-0 lead following a botched onside kick attempt by the Eagles. Quinton Ganther recovered the kick and returned it deep inside Eagles territory and set up a 1-yard TD run by QB Jason Campbell. But the Eagles responded with two impressive drives that resulted in 10 points (29-yard field goal by Akers and a 35-yard scoring pass from McNabb to DeSean Jackson). Washington countered with an impressive scoring drive of their own (80 yards on 13 plays) that ended with a four-yard TD grab by WR Santana Moss. But Eagles CB Asante Samuel picked up two interceptions late in the 2nd quarter that led to a pair of field goals by Akers to give Philadelphia a 16-14 half-time lead. Washington grabbed the lead again early in the 3rd quarter with a 10-yard scoring pass from Campbell to TE Fred Davis. But the Eagles 4th quarter rally overcame the sluggish 3rd quarter, which saw them gain just 22 yards on 9 plays.

Notes: The Eagles swept the season series vs. the Redskins for the 5th time in the last eight seasons ... They posted 4th quarter come-from-behind victories in consecutive games for the first time since 2003 (10/19/03 at NYG and 10/26/03 vs. NYJ) ... Samuel posted the 6th multi-interception game of his career ... Buckley's TD was the first of his career.

Michael Vick made a magical return to the Georgia Dome as he accounted for a pair of touchdowns in the Eagles 34-7 rout of the Atlanta Falcons. Vick scored on a five-yard touchdown run early in the 3rd quarter to break the game open and, with the crowd loudly chanting, "We want Vick, we want Vick," fired a 5-yard TD pass to TE Brent Celek in the 4th quarter to give the Eagles a commanding 34-0 lead. It was the first touchdowns of the season for Vick, who played six years for the Falcons franchise after being selected first overall in the 2001 NFL draft. Lost in the Vick-mania that surrounded the day was the play of the Eagles defense who stifled Atlanta's undermanned offense all day long. In fact, they kept the home team off the scoreboard until the final play of the game. Philadelphia, meanwhile, scored 21 points off of three turnovers, including a forced fumble by Eldra Buckley on a kickoff early in the game that was recovered by Tracy White at the Falcons 22-yard line. From there, Donovan McNabb connected with FB Leonard Weaver on a 4-yard scoring pass to give the Eagles an early 10-0 advantage. The Eagles made it 13-0 in the 2nd quarter after David Akers' 2nd field goal from 33 yards out split the uprights. Undaunted, the Falcons drove deep into Eagles territory late in the first half only to be stifled in a classic goal-line stand after being set up 2nd-and-goal from the PHI1. After Vick's TD run gave Philadelphia a 20-0 lead early in the 3rd quarter, Sheldon Brown stepped in front of a 4th down pass by Chris Redman and returned it 83 yards for a touchdown. Vick set up his TD pass to Celek with a 43-yard bomb to WR Reggie Brown to the ATL7.

Notes: The Eagles became the 13th team in NFL history to post 100 regular season wins in a decade ... Vick's TD run was his first since 10/15/06 vs. NYG at the Georgia Dome and his touchdown pass was his first since 12/31/06 at Philadelphia's Lincoln Financial Field ... Sheldon Brown set a career high with his 5th INT of the season and posted the longest INT return of his career (83 yards) ... Atlanta played without five offensive starters including QB Matt Ryan and RB Michael Turner, while the Eagles played without offensive stalwarts Brian Westbrook and DeSean Jackson ... The Falcons lost at home for just the 2nd time since the start of the 2008 season ... Eagles FB Leonard Weaver accounted for 100 yards of total offense (37 rushing and 63 receiving)

Philadelphia Eagles 45 New York Giants 38



DeSean Jackson accounted for 261 all-purpose yards and two long-distance touchdowns in a wild, 45-38 victory in the Eagles final regular season visit to Giants Stadium. In all, both teams combined for 83 points, 886 yards of total offense and five touchdown scoring plays of 60+ yards. Philadelphia kept the scoreboard operators occupied all night long, especially in the early going when Donovan McNabb led a game-opening drive that covered 67 yards on 6 plays and finished with an 8-yard screen pass for a touchdown by TE Brent Celek. On the Giants ensuing possession, RB Brandon Jacobs was stripped by DE Trent Cole and the bouncing ball landed into the hands of CB Sheldon Brown, who raced 60 yards for a touchdown and a 14-0 lead. But the Giants responded with a field goal later in the 1st quarter and a 68-yard scoring pass from Eli Manning to WR Hakeem Nicks, who broke two tackle attempts en route to the end zone. After a field goal by Eagles K David Akers gave Philadelphia a 17-10 lead, Jackson took a directional punt by Jeff Feagles along the Eagles sideline, waited patiently for a couple of blockers and raced down the sideline for a 72-yard TD giving the Eagles a commanding two-touchdown lead. But New York used a touchdown run by Ahmad Bradshaw to cut the score to 24-17 with 1:35 to go in the 1st half. That proved to be too much time for the Eagles, who converted two 3rd-and-long situations to set up a 1-yard TD scamper by QB Michael Vick. However, the extra point was blocked as Philadelphia took a 30-17 lead into the intermission. The Giants stormed out of the gates in the 2nd half to take the lead with a pair of touchdowns (a one-yard TD run by Jacobs on 4th-n-goal at the PHI1 and a 61-yard pitch and catch by Manning and WR Domenik Hixon, who eluded Eagles tackle attempts before racing into the end zone). Holding the lead for the first time in the game, the Giants attempted to feed off the raucous home crowd en route to a victory. But Jackson quickly silenced them. On the very next play from scrimmage, McNabb fired a 60-yard scoring strike to the speedy receiver who raced past a Giants safety and back-pedaled into the end zone. The score remained at 37-31 into the 4th quarter when Feagles pinned the Eagles back at their own 9-yard line with 13:12 to play in the game. From there, McNabb led a textbook, 12-play, 91-yard scoring drive that shredded 7:24 of clock time and was capped by a one-yard TD plunge by FB Leonard Weaver. A two-point pass from McNabb to Jason Avant gave the Eagles a 45-31 lead with 5:48 remaining. Although the Giants managed to pull within 7 points with a Manning TD pass, the Eagles held on for a big NFC East road victory.

Notes: The Eagles made their 40th and final visit to Giants Stadium (including playoffs) and finished with a 24-16 record, including wins in their final four trips to the Meadowlands ... Jackson's two home runs gave him 8 TDs of 50+ yards on the season, tying the NFL record with Devin Hester (2007) and Elroy "Crazy Legs" Hirsch (1951) ... Jackson's punt return for a TD was the third of his Eagles career, setting a new team record previously held by Brian Westbrook, Brian Mitchell and Steve Van Buren (two apiece) ... Brown's TD was the 5th of his Eagles career, tying Eric Allen and Seth Joyner for the most defensive scores in team history.

Philadelphia Eagles 27 San Francisco 49ers 13



The Eagles harassed the 49ers and their quarterback Alex Smith into committing four turnovers and used the big-play tandem of Donovan McNabb (306 yards passing and two total touchdowns) and DeSean Jackson (6 catches for 140 yards and 1 TD) in defeating San Francisco, 27-13, at a frigid Lincoln Financial Field. With the win, the Eagles clinched their 8th playoff berth this decade while eliminating the 49ers from playoff contention. McNabb and Jackson got the Eagles off to a fast start on the game's opening possession as the two connected on a 19-yard scoring pass to give Philadelphia a quick 7-0 lead. After the 49ers responded with a field goal later in the first quarter, Philadelphia was stopped on a 4th and 1 rushing attempt late in the stanza that set up the 49ers at the Eagles 29-yard line. But Sheldon Brown forced a fumble by TE Delanie Walker deep in Eagles territory that was recovered by fellow cornerback Asante Samuel at the 6-yard line. From there, McNabb drove the Eagles 94 yards on nine plays, including his own 8-yard TD run that gave Philadelphia a commanding 14-3 lead. The Eagles capitalized on two more 49ers turnovers (a Samuel INT and a Tracy White INT) that led to a pair of short field goals by David Akers and gave the home squad a 20-3 advantage. The 49ers stormed back in the 2nd half with 10 points in the first nine minutes of the 3rd quarter to pull to within 20-13, but an 8-play, 89-yard drive by the Eagles in the 4th quarter put the game out of reach as LeSean McCoy scampered in from 2-yards out with 11:32 to play.

Notes: After a major winter snowstorm dropped over 23 inches of snow in the Philadelphia area one day earlier, kickoff time was adjusted from 1 pm to 4:15 pm ... The Eagles became the 10th team in NFL history to earn eight or more playoff appearances in a decade. Indianapolis in the 2000s and Dallas in the 1970s each had nine. The following teams have also had eight: Dallas (1990s), Buffalo (1990s), Cleveland (1950s), Minnesota (1970s), Pittsburgh (1970s), San Francisco (1980s and 1990s) ... Jackson became the 5th Eagle ever to post 140+ yards in consecutive games and the first since Mike Quick did so in 1985 ... McCoy broke the club's rookie rushing record set by Correll Buckhalter in 2001 (586 yards) ... Samuel's 8th INT of the year is the most by an Eagle since Eric Allen in 1989 ... White's INT was the first of his career (92 games).

Philadelphia Eagles 30 Denver Broncos 27



David Akers booted a 28-yard field goal with 4 seconds to play in the 4th quarter to lift the Eagles to an exciting 30-27 victory over the Denver Broncos at Lincoln Financial Field. Akers' heroics offset a valiant comeback attempt by the visiting Broncos, who rallied to tie the game after trailing 27-10 late in the 3rd quarter. Ironically, the momentum swung in favor of the Broncos after an interception by Eagles CB Asante Samuel. After Samuel returned the ball 40 yards from the PHI 8, the Eagles were penalized twice during the return and the resulting line of scrimmage was their own one-yard line. After a three-and-out and a punt by the Eagles, the Broncos scored two touchdowns in less than a minute. First, Broncos QB Kyle Orton connected with Jabar Gaffney on a 7-yard TD and after a fumble by Eagles kickoff return man Macho Harris, Orton tossed a 16-yard scoring pass to RB Knowshon Moreno to make the score 27-24 heading into the 4th quarter. Denver tied the game with a 46-yard field goal by Matt Prater with 6:11 remaining in the 4th quarter and kept the momentum until Eagles QB Donovan McNabb scrambled for 27 yards on a 3rd-and-25 play. Although Philadelphia ended up punting on that drive, field position was changed and Denver went three and out on their ensuing possession and were forced to punt deep inside their own territory. McNabb and company took over from the DEN42 with 1:41 to play and rookie WR Jeremy Maclin made a highlight-film, 27-yard catch along the Eagles sideline at the Broncos 13-yard line. The play was originally ruled an incompleteness, but the replay system clearly showed Maclin drag both feet while maintaining possession of the ball. Four plays later, Akers gave the Eagles their 6th straight victory with his ninth career game-winning kick in the final two minutes of the 4th quarter or overtime ... The Eagles jumped ahead 20-7 in the first half on the strength of two touchdown passes by McNabb - 2 yards to WR DeSean Jackson and 47 yards to TE Brent Celek - and two field goals by Akers. They upped their lead to 27-10 after a juggling, 15-yard TD grab by Jason Avant midway through the 3rd quarter.

Notes: In the first half, the Eagles shattered their single-season scoring record of 416 points previously set in 2008 ... Samuel's interception was his 9th of the season and the most by an Eagle since Bill Bradley notched 9 in 1972 ... Celek notched a game-high 121 receiving yards on four receptions, marking the 4th 100-yard output of his career. His 47-yard touchdown grab in the 2nd quarter was the longest catch of his career ... With a sack, Trent Cole tied a career high with 12.5, while Juqua Parker registered his career-high 7th of the season ... Longtime Eagles Brian Dawkins and Correll Buckhalter made their first visit to Lincoln Financial Field as members of the Broncos.

Philadelphia Eagles 0 Dallas Cowboys 24



The Eagles fumbled away a chance at a first round bye and an NFC East division title as they were defeated soundly, 24-0, by the host Dallas Cowboys in the regular season finale. The Cowboys staked themselves to a 7-0 lead on the first possession of the game and never looked back. Tony Romo capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive with a 10-yard scoring pass to TE Jason Witten. Later in the first quarter, the Eagles negated another potential scoring opportunity by Dallas by intercepting a Romo pass in the red zone. CB Asante Samuel deflected a pass attempt that landed in the hands of fellow CB Joselio Hanson. But the Cowboys would not waste their next chance as Romo connected with WR Patrick Crayton on a 14-yard scoring play to give the home team a 14-0 lead. That score was set up by two long passes by Romo (40 yards to Miles Austin and 30 yards to Crayton). On their ensuing possession, Donovan McNabb finally got the Eagles moving, completing two long passes to Jeremy Maclin (31 yards) and DeSean Jackson (32 yards) to set them up deep in Cowboys territory. But a faulty shot gun snap from C Nick Cole to McNabb was fumbled and pounced on by Cowboys DT Jay Ratliff to thwart a chance for the Eagles to climb back in the game. Following the turnover, Dallas marched deep into Philadelphia territory and settled for a 44-yard field goal by Shaun Suisham to up their lead to 17-0 heading into halftime. The Eagles did not fare much better in the 2nd half as they sputtered on their first three possessions, including a missed field goal from 53 yards by David Akers, and allowed Felix Jones to race 49 yards for a TD in the 3rd quarter that finalized the scoring.

Notes: The Eagles set a new single-season record for most passing yards in a season (4,380), surpassing the previous mark of 4,309 in 2006 ... Eagles LB Will Witherspoon became the 5th player in the bye era (since 1990) to play in 17 regular season games (first six with St. Louis and last 11 with the Eagles). He joined Jerry Rice, Dexter Carter, Chris Singleton and Micah Ross as the only others to do so ... CB Sheldon Brown played in his 128th consecutive game as an Eagle, passing Jerry Sisemore for the 8th-longest streak in team history ... McNabb played in his 148th game as an Eagle, tying Bobby Walston and Ken Clarke for 10th place in team history

The Eagles turned the ball over four times and were outscored 27-7 in the decisive 2nd quarter by the Cowboys in an NFC Wild Card game in Arlington, TX. For the Eagles, it was the 2nd defeat at the hands of their NFC East rivals in just six days and put an end to their 2009 season. After a scoreless first quarter, Dallas scored on the third play of the 2nd quarter as Tony Romo connected with TE John Phillips on a one-yard TD pass. That score was set up by a 40-yard pass interference penalty by Eagles CB Sheldon Brown. The Eagles responded with a 76-yard scoring pass from Michael Vick to WR Jeremy Maclin to tie the game and kept the momentum with an interception by S Sean Jones on the next play from scrimmage. But the play was overturned as replay showed the ball touched the ground before Jones had full possession of it. The Cowboys promptly took advantage of the overturned call and drove 85 yards on 10 plays to take the lead for good on a one-yard TD run by Tashard Choice. Dallas added a field goal before a pair of Eagle turnovers led to 10 more points for the Cowboys as the half ended with a 27-7 deficit. Cowboys RB Felix put the game out of reach with a 73-yard TD run late in the 3rd quarter.

Notes: Vick's 76-yard TD pass to Maclin was the longest in the team's postseason history, besting Jeff Garcia's 75 yarder to Donte Stallworth at New Orleans on 1/13/07 ... Maclin's 146 receiving yards were the most ever by a rookie in NFL postseason history and the most by an Eagle in the playoffs, topping TE Keith Jackson's 142 in the "Fog Bowl" at Chicago on 12/31/88. The 21-year-old Maclin became the youngest player in NFL history to catch a touchdown pass ... K David Akers played in his 18th playoff game, tying Brian Dawkins for first place on the team's all-time list.



Jeremy Maclin set an NFL rookie postseason record with 146 receiving yards and his 76-yard TD catch from Michael Vick was the longest pass play in franchise postseason history.
