The Philadelphia Eagles began a new chapter in their storied history on Sunday, September 11, 2016, with **Eagles Head Coach**



Doug Pederson taking over the sidelines for his first regular-season game and rookie QB Carson Wentz stepping into the spotlight as the team's starter under center.

It didn't take long for Wentz to win over the home crowd at Lincoln Financial Field, as the rookie quarterback jumped out of the gates and led a nine-play, 75-yard touchdown drive on the team's opening possession of the 2016 season. During the march, Wentz completed 4-of-5 passes for 57 yards and capped the drive with a

perfectly lofted, 19-yard pass to **WR Jordan Matthews** in the left corner of the end zone for the first touchdown of his career

The Eagles new-look, 4-3 defense stifled **Browns QB Robert Griffin III** and the Cleveland offense for the remainder of the first quarter. After the Birds forced three-straight three-and-outs, Eagles **K Caleb Sturgis** connected on a 22-yard field goal to put Philadelphia up 10-0.

The Browns managed to get their offense in gear on its first possession of the second quarter, as Griffin hit **WR Terrelle Pryor Sr.** for a 44-yard gain to move Cleveland inside the Eagles 10. A pass interference penalty in the end zone on Eagles **S Malcolm Jenkins** allowed Browns **RB Isaiah Crowell** to punch the ball in from the 2-yard line and cut the Eagles' lead to 10-7.

Despite giving up a score, the Eagles defense responded on Cleveland's next possession as **S Rodney McLeod**, who was signed

as a free agent in the 2016 offseason, picked off Griffin and returned the ball to Wentz and the Eagles offense with just under four minutes remaining in the half.

Following the pick, Sturgis connected on a 38-yard field goal to give the Eagles a 13-7 lead.



Cleveland added a field goal on their first drive of the second half, but an errant snap out of the end zone on their next possession resulted in an Eagles safety and made the score 15-10 Philly.

Wentz took advantage of the momentum generated from the safety and threw a 35-yard touchdown to **WR Nelson Agholor** on the Eagles' next drive.

The defense closed out the win by keeping Cleveland off the board for the remainder of the game and <u>Eagles RB Ryan Mathews</u>



PHILADELPHIA 29, CHICAGO 14

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2016 - SOLDIER FIELD

The Eagles kicked off their 2016 road schedule when they traveled to Chicago to face the Bears on *Monday Night Football*.



Philadelphia's defense set the tone early when Eagles **S Malcolm Jenkins** sacked Bears QB Jay Cutler on the second play from scrimmage, setting up a third-and-20 and an eventual fourth-down punt.

Appearing in the second game of his career, rookie **QB Carson Wentz** came out of the gates strong on the Birds' first possession, completing 8-of-9 attempts to set up a 25-yard field goal by **K Caleb Sturgis**.

On Chicago's next drive, Cutler completed passes of 31 yards (WR Eddie Royal) and 22 yards (WR Alshon Jeffery) to

move the Bears into the red zone, but the Birds defensed tightened up and forced a field goal attempt which Chicago **K Connor Barth** clanked off the left upright.

Despite the missed field goal, the Bears were able to take a 7-3 lead on their next possession, as **RB Jeremy Langford** capped a six-play, 65-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown.

Langford's touchdown proved to be the last offensive score for the home team, as the Eagles defense put a stranglehold on the Bears offense for the remainder of the game.

Following Chicago's touchdown, Sturgis hit two field goals to close out the first half (29 and 53 yards), propelling the visitors to a 9-7 halftime lead.

After the teams traded numerous possessions to start the second half, Philadelphia broke the game wide open at the end of the third quarter. Taking over at his own 32, Wentz completed

a 22-yard pass to WR Jordan Matthews to spark an eightplay, 68-yard drive, which was punctuated by a 3-yard rushing touchdown by RB Ryan Mathews.

Moments after Mathews' touchdown gave Philly a 16-7 lead, the Eagles offense received



another scoring opportunity courtesy of Eagles LB Nigel Bradham.

On Chicago's next play from scrimmage, Bradham picked off a Cutler pass and returned the interception to the Bears 2-yard line. Wentz immediately hit **TE Trey Burton** for a touchdown and although Sturgis missed the ensuing extra point, the Eagles found themselves with a comfortable 22-7 advantage.

The Bears fumbled on their next possession, setting up the Eagles' third touchdown of the night: a 1-yard run by Mathews.

Following a Monday Night Football road win in Week 2 at Chicago, the Eagles returned to Lincoln Financial Field to face the



Pittsburgh Steelers in Week 3.

Despite the quick turnaround that comes from playing on a Monday night, the Birds got off to a fast start against their Western Pennsylvania counterparts.

Steelers QB Ben
Roethlisberger led Pittsburgh
into the red zone on the
game's opening possession;
however, the Eagles were
able to keep Pittsburgh off the
board when DT Bennie Logan
burst through the Steelers line
to block a 36-yard field goal
attempt by K Chris Boswell.

Following the block, **Eagles QB Carson Wentz** hit **TE Brent Celek** for 22 yards and **RB Darren Sproles** for 40 yards on back-to-back plays to move the Eagles inside the Pittsburgh 15-yard line and set up a 29-yard field goal by **K Caleb Sturgis**.

The Eagles defense forced a quick punt on the Steelers' ensuing possession to return the ball to the Philadelphia offense and help set up the Birds' longest touchdown drive of the season.

Taking over at his own 18, Wentz directed a 12-play, 82-yard drive and gave Philadelphia a 10-0 lead when he connected with WR Jordan Matthews for a 12-yard touchdown.

Both teams traded field goals to close out the second quarter, with Boswell connecting from 40 yards and Sturgis hitting his second kick of the contest (38 yards) to make the score 13-3 at halftime.

The Eagles received the ball to start the second half and needed just three plays to add to their lead. Facing a thirdand-8 on his own 27, Wentz stepped up in the pocket, scrambled to his right and lofted a perfect pass down the right sideline to Sproles. The



veteran running back adjusted his route, hauled in the pass and weaved his way to the end zone for a 73-yard score.

Sproles' touchdown gave the home team a 20-3 lead and allowed the Birds' defense to help close out the game.

Down by 17 points, Pittsburgh elected to go for it on fourthand-5 from the Philadelphia 33 and Eagles **S Malcolm Jenkins** broke up a pass intended for Steelers **WR Antonio Brown**. The stop led to yet another Eagles' scoring drive, as rookie <u>RB Wendell</u> <u>Smallwood</u> scored the first touchdown of his career to give the <u>Eagles a 27-3 lead</u>.

The Birds got off to a slow start in their first game back from

the bye, as Lions **QB Matthew Stafford** guided the home team down the field on the game's opening possession and gave Detroit a 7-0 lead when he connected with **RB Theo Riddick** on a 1-yard touchdown pass.

After a quick stop by the Lions defense, Stafford went back to work and engineered a nine-play, 80-yard drive, which was capped yet again by a receiving touchdown from Riddick (17 yards).

With Philadelphia in need of a spark to stop the Lions' offensive surge, Eagles

rookie **QB Carson Wentz** put together a nine-play, 75-yard drive that featured five Philadelphia first downs and five plays of 10-plus yards. The Birds cut their deficit to 14-7 when **RB Ryan Mathews** caught a 1-yard touchdown from Wentz.

Despite the brief swing in momentum, the Lions offense continued to roll on its next possession, as Stafford drove the home team deep into Eagles territory once again and **WR Marvin Jones** gave Detroit a 21-7 lead on a 1-yard touchdown catch with 3:08 left in the first half.

Eagles **K Caleb Sturgis** hit a 50-yard field goal as time expired in the half to make the score 21-10 at the break.



The Eagles jumped out to a fast start in the third quarter, as Wentz hit WR **Nelson Agholor** for 18 yards, Mathews for 17 yards and WR Dorial Green-Beckham for 26 yards to move the Eagles down to the Lions 3. Two plays later, Wentz found WR

<u>Josh Huff over the middle for a 1-yard touchdown</u> to make the score 21-17.

The Eagles defense returned to its dominant form in the second half and on Detroit's first drive of the half, <u>Eagles LB Nigel Bradham</u> scooped up a Stafford fumble at the Lions 16 and Sturgis hit another field goal to make the score 21-20.

After the Birds forced Detroit to punt on back-to-back possessions, Sturgis finished a fourth-quarter drive with a 49-yard field goal to give the Eagles a 23-21 lead with less than seven minutes remaining in regulation.

The Philly defense forced another three-and-out on Detroit's next possession, but the Birds offense was unable to seal the game when Mathews fumbled on third-and-2 and the Lions

Following their first loss of the season at Detroit, Philadelphia opened its 2016 NFC East slate with a Week 6 road contest at Wasington.

For the second straight week, the Eagles fell behind 14-0 and were forced to dig themselves out of an early hole

The scoring began when Redskins **QB Kirk Cousins** directed touchdown drives on back-to-back possessions to end the first quarter and start the second quarter. Cousins capped both of those drives with touchdown passes, first to **WR Jamison Crowder** and then to **TE Vernon Davis**.



Once again faced with the task of playing from behind, the Birds received two second-quarter scores from their defense and special teams to put them back in the game.

Following Davis' touchdown, which gave Washington its 14-0 lead, <u>Eagles rookie</u> **RB Wendell Smallwood** took the ensuing kickoff to the house for an 86-yard touchdown.

Feeding off the energy provided by the special teams unit, the Eagles defense provided another spark on the Redskins' next possession. On first-and-10 from the Philadelphia 38, Cousins targeted Davis over the middle, but Eagles S Malcolm Jenkins

undercut the route, picked off Cousins and dashed down the sideline for a 64-yard touchdown.

With the game knotted at 14-14, Washington restored its lead just before halftime when **RB Matt Jones** plunged into the end zone from 1 yard out to give



the Redskins a 21-14 advantage.

Washington reached the red zone on the opening drive of the second half, but was forced to settle for a 32-yard field goal by ${\bf K}$ **Dustin Hopkins**.

With the Eagles trailing 24-14 entering the fourth quarter, Eagles QB Carson Wentz moved Philadelphia into scoring position when he connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 54-yard pass. Three plays later, K Caleb Sturgis hit a 38-yard field goal to cut Washington's lead to 24-17.

Both teams traded field goals on their next possessions, with Sturgis connecting on a 28-yard kick to make it a one-score game with just over five minutes remaining in regulation.

The Birds defense immediately forced a three-and-out and returned the ball to its offense with four minutes left in the contest.

The two teams exchanged fumble recoveries on their next possesions and Wentz threw his second interception of the day to close out the quarter.

For the second time in three weeks, the Eagles hit the road

to take on an NFC East foe, as they traveled to Dallas for a Week 8 *Sunday Night Football* matchup.



Although the Eagles had already played two primetime contests on the road in 2016, Lincoln Financial Field hosted its



first night game of the season in Week 12 when the Eagles faced off against the Green Bay Packers.

The Birds entered the game looking to build on their perfect 4-0 home record, while the Packers were in search of their first win since Week 7.

The Packers offense got off to a fast start, as **QB Aaron Rodgers** engineered a 10-play, 75-yard drive on the game's opening possession, and gave the visitors a 7-0 lead when he hit **WR Davante Adams** for a 12-yard touchdown.



The Eagles kicked off the final quarter of the 2016 season with a Week 14 contest at home against the division rival Washington Redskins.

QB Carson Wentz and the Eagles offense opened the scoring on the first drive of the game, as Philadelphia marched down the field in 10 plays and K Caleb Sturgis hit a 45-yard field goal to give the Birds a 3-0 lead.

After the Eagles defense forced a three-and-out and a Washington punt, Wentz took over at his own 20 and moved the Eagles deep into Washington territory, thanks in part to a 44-yard pass interference penalty. The Birds moved all the way down to the Washington 3-yard line, but came up empty when Wentz was intercepted in the end zone by Redskins **S Deshazor Everett**.

Sturgis added his second field goal of the game on Philadelphia's next possession to give the Eagles a 6-0 lead.

Washington took its first lead of the game at 7-6 on the ensuing drive when Redskins **RB Robert Kelley** ran off left tackle for a 22-yard touchdown.

With less than five minutes remaining in the first half, Wentz engineered the Eagles' first touchdown drive of the game. Starting at their own 23, the offense marched 77 yards on 12 plays and took a 13-7 lead when **RB Darren Sproles** hauled in a 4-yard touchdown pass from Wentz with 28 seconds remaining on the clock.

Washington regained the lead early in the third quarter when **WR DeSean Jackson** tracked down a deep ball from **QB Kirk Cousins** and raced into the end zone for an 80-yard score.

Although the Eagles reached field goal range on their next drive, a wrist injury to **LS Jon Dorenbos** proved costly, as backup long snapper **Brent Celek** snapped the ball into the turf and **P Donnie Jones** was unable to get the ball placed.

At the end of the third quarter, Washington tacked on its second touchdown of the half, taking a 21-13 lead on a 15-yard catch by **WR Pierre Garcon**.

Although Philadelphia went three-and-out on its next drive, CB Leodis McKelvin flipped the game when he picked off Cousins early in the fourth quarter and returned the interception 29 yards for a score.

Trailing 21-19 following a missed two-point attempt, the Eagles defense quickly stopped the Redskins and returned the ball to the offense.

A 14-yard pass from Wentz to **TE Zach Ertz** on third-and-7 kept the Eagles next drive alive, and a 2-yard QB sneak by Wentz on fourth-and-1 from the Washington 34 helped move the Eagles into field goal range. After the drive stalled at the Redskins 24, the Birds were forced to attempt a 41-yard field goal. Having already lost Dorenbos, Philadelphia's field goal unit faced even longer odds when Celek, too, was lost to an injury; however, third-string long snapper **Trey Burton** and Jones were able to execute the snap and hold, and Sturgis banged the kick home to give Philadelphia a 22-21 lead.

Washington responded with a touchdown drive, as Cousins marched the offense down the field and took back the lead on a 25-yard touchdown run by **RB Chris Thompson**. A failed two-point try brought the score to 27-22 with less than two minutes remaining.

With just one timeout remaining, Wentz quickly moved the Eagles offense into the red zone, completing four passes of 10-plus yards, including a 13-yarder to Ertz on third-and-10 from the Washington 27. However, the Eagles luck ran out when Redskins LB Ryan Kerrigan stripped Wentz in the backfield and Washington recovered the loose ball to end the game.

The Eagles hosted the New York Giants at Lincoln Financial Field on *Thursday Night Football* in Week 16, marking Philadelphia's final primetime contest of the 2016 season.

Philadelphia got off to a hot start, as the defense forced a three-and-out on the opening possession of the game and the offense marched right down the field on its first drive.

RB Ryan Mathews ran off right tackle for a 17-yard gain on the Birds' first play from scrimmage and on the next play, QB Carson Wentz completed a 16-yard pass to TE Brent Celek to move the Eagles into Giants' territory. Three straight carries by Mathews moved the ball to the New York 34 and two plays later, RB Darren Sproles broke off a 25-yard touchdown run to give the Eagles a 7-0 lead.

In the first matchup between the two division rivals back in Week 9, New York jumped out to a 14-0, first-quarter lead; this time around, the Eagles built a 14-0 lead of their own.

Three plays after Sproles' touchdown run, Eagles **S Malcolm Jenkins** intercepted Giants **QB Eli Manning** and <u>returned the pick 34 yards for a score</u>. The return was Jenkins' second pick-six of the season and his fourth as an Eagle, marking the second-highest total in franchise history.

Late in the first quarter, New York's offense moved into the red zone, but the Eagles defense held strong at the 17 and forced the Giants to settle for a 35-yard field goal by **K Robbie Gould**. Midway through the second quarter, New York once again reached the Philadelphia 17; however, the Philadelphia defense again held strong and forced another 35-yard kick by Gould that made the score 14-6.

On Philadelphia's next drive, a series of short gains and a 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty quickly moved the Birds across midfield. Following the penalty, Wentz dropped back on first down and connected with **WR Nelson Agholor** on a deep ball for a 40-yard touchdown to extend the Eagles' lead to 21-6.

New York answered with a touchdown drive of its own and made the score 21-13 when Manning hit **WR Sterling Shepard** on a seam route for a 13-yard score with less than a minute remaining in the first half.

After Philadelphia went three-and-out to start the third quarter, the Giants put together another march deep into Eagles' territory. This time around, New York made it as far as the 11, but the Eagles defense stiffened once again in the red zone and forced another Gould field goal to make the score 21-16.

Early in the fourth quarter, <u>Jenkins registered his second interception of Manning</u> and Eagles **K Caleb Sturgis** converted the turnover into a 41-yard field goal to bring the score to 24-16.

Gould added another red zone field goal with just over five minutes remaining in regulation to cut the Eagles' lead to 24-19 and the Giants got the ball back with four minutes left on the clock after the Eagles failed to register a first down.

Although New York moved the ball into Eagles' territory, CB **Nolan Carroll** <u>knocked down a fourth-down pass intended for Shepard to end the Giants' drive</u>.

The Giants received one last opportunity to put together a game-winning drive when they took over at their own 15 with 1:31 remaining. Six Manning completions quickly moved the Giants to the Birds' 34, but on third-and-10 with 14 seconds left, Eagles S Terrence Brooks jumped in front of a pass intended for TE Will Tye and sealed the game with his first career interception.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 1, 2017 - LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD

The Philadelphia Eagles closed out the 2016 season on New Years Day at home against the Dallas Cowboys.

Dallas received the opening kickoff, but netted just 9 yards on their first possession and were forced to punt.

Taking over at the Eagles 18, **QB Carson Wentz** engineered a 14-play, 79-yard drive and moved the Birds down to the Dallas 3; however, the Eagles were unable to find the end zone and settled for a 22-yard field goal by **K Caleb Sturgis**.

On his final drive of the game, Cowboys rookie **QB Dak Prescott** led a field goal drive of his own on Dallas' next possession to tie the game at 3-3.

After a punt by Philadelphia, Cowboys QB Tony Romo relieved Prescott at quarterback, taking the field for the first



time in the 2016 regular season. Romo, who missed the majority of the season due to a back injury suffered in the preseason, completed 3-of-4 attempts and put Dallas ahead 10-3 when he hit WR Terrance Williams for a 3-yard touchdown. Romo's season debut was short lived, as former Eagles QB Mark Sanchez received the remainder of Dallas' snaps following the Williams touchdown catch.

The Philadelphia offense went three-and-out following Dallas' touchdown,

but Eagles **LB Jordan Hicks** <u>returned the ball to the offense after</u> <u>he made an athletic interception</u> of Sanchez at the Cowboys 37.

Despite the strong field position, the Birds offense could not move the chains and turned the ball over on downs following a failed fourth-down attempt.

The two teams traded punts and then Hicks struck again when he dove in front of Cowboys **TE Gavin Escobar** to snag his second interception of the game.

This time around, the Eagles offense took advantage of the turnover. Wentz executed a perfect two-minute drive and evened the score at 10-10 when he found **TE Zach Ertz** in the end zone for a 6-yard score.

After Cowboys **K Dan Bailey** hit a 23-yard field goal to start the second-half scoring, Wentz drove the offense 89 yards, while completing 8-of-10 passes, and put the Birds in front 17-13 on a 20-yard touchdown pass to Ertz.

Philadelphia controlled the game from that point on. Sturgis added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter and the defense continued to clamp down, forcing three straight Dallas punts.

The Birds received a major contribution from the special teams unit as well, when **DE Steven Means** blocked a **Chris Jones** punt late in the fourth quarter and **LB Najee Goode** recovered the loose ball at the Dallas 7-yard line.

Following the block, rookie **RB Terrell Watson**, who was signed off the Eagles practice squad just two days prior to the game, carried three straight times and <u>plowed into the end zone for a 1-yard, game-sealing touchdown</u>.


