POST-GAME NOTES

EAGLES ON OPENING DAY

■ The Eagles have won 8 of their last 10 season openers, including 6 of their last 7. The Eagles have scored the most opening day points (294) in the NFL since 2008. The Eagles have won 4 straight opening day games against NFC East opponents since 2000.

CARSON WENTZ THROWS FOR 300 YARDS, 2 TDS

Carson Wentz became the first QB in Eagles history to throw a TD pass on the first drive of the season in consecutive years. Wentz is the 4th QB to win his first two opening day starts with the Eagles since 1950, joining Michael Vick (2011-12), Norm Snead (1964-65) and Adrian Burk (1951-52).

STOUT DEFENSE

- Fletcher Cox became the first Eagles player to post a sack, forced fumble and TD in a game since Chris Clemons (12/28/2008 vs. Dal).
- Brandon Graham recorded his first strip-sack of the season, which led to a 20-yard fumble recovery for TD by Cox.
- Jordan Hicks recovered the fumble on Cox's first-quarter sack. Hicks has recorded 12 takeaways (7 INTs, 5 FRs) in his first 25 career NFL games.
- Jalen Mills recorded his 1st-career INT when he picked off Kirk Cousins on a fourth-quarter, third-down red zone pass intended for Jamison Crowder.

MORE NOTES FROM THE GAME

- Trey Burton notched the 2nd special teams fumble recovery of his NFL career on a muffed punt.
- Nelson Agholor helped give the Eagles a 7-0 lead in the first quarter when he caught a career-long 58-yard TD pass from Wentz.

POST-GAME NOTES

ERTZ REACHES 3,000 RECEIVING YARDS

- Zach Ertz eclipsed 3,000+ receiving yards (now 3,030) in just his 63rd career game, tying Tony Gonzalez (1997-2000) for the 9th-fastest pace by an NFL TE to reach that milestone since the 1970 merger. Among NFL TEs in that span, only Kellen Winslow Sr. (45, 1979-83), Rob Gronkowski (47, 2010-14), Jimmy Graham (49, 2010-14), Kellen Winslow Jr. (55, 2004-10), Antonio Gates (56, 2003-07), Mark Bavaro (60, 1985-89), Bob Tucker (60, 1970-74) and Jeremy Shockey (62, 2002-06) have posted 3,000+ receiving yards in fewer games.
- Ertz finished the game with 5 catches for 97 yards (19.4 avg.). Ertz has recorded 90+ receiving yards in three straight games, which is the longest active streak in the NFL.

EIGHT SACKS THROUGH TWO GAMES

- The Eagles have recorded 8.0 sacks in the first two games of the season. That is their highest total through the season's first two games since 2011 (9.0).
- Fletcher Cox now has 30.5 career sacks, which are the 4th-most ever by an Eagles interior defensive lineman, trailing only Andy Harmon (39.5, 1991-97), Ken Clarke (32.5, 1978-87) and Corey Simon (32.0, 2000-04).
- Chris Long registered his first sack as an Eagle in the third quarter. Long has produced the 7th-most sacks (59.5) among active NFL defensive ends since 2008.

MORE FROM THE GAME

 Donnie Jones played in his 200th career game. Jones has played in 194 consecutive contests, which is the 4th-longest active streak in the NFL, behind Shane Lechler (240), Jason Witten (220*) and Eli Manning (200*).

ELLIOTT MAKES HISTORY

- Jake Elliott connected on a franchise-record 61-yard FG as time expired to give the Eagles a 27-24 home victory. Elliott converted back-to-back FGs of 46 and 61 yards in the last 51 seconds of the game to erase a 24-21 deficit.
- Elliott's 61-yard FG is tied for the 7th-longest FG in NFL history, trailing only Matt Prater (64 yards on 12/8/13 vs. Tennessee), David Akers (63 yards on 9/9/12 at Green Bay), Sebastian Janikowski (63 yards on 9/12/11 at Denver), Jason Elam (63 yards on 10/25/98 vs. Jacksonville), Tom Dempsey (63 yards on 11/8/70 vs. Detroit) and Matt Bryant (62 yards on 10/22/06 vs. Philadelphia). It is also tied for the 3rd-longest walk-off FG in NFL history, behind Dempsey and Bryant.
- Elliott's 61-yard FG is also the longest ever by an NFL rookie, breaking the record of 60 set by Greg Zuerlein on 9/30/12 vs. Seattle.

EAGLES RUSH FOR 193 YARDS

The Eagles totaled season highs in rush attempts (39) and rushing yards (193). The last time Philadelphia had at least 39 rush attempts in a single game was on 11/27/14 at Dallas (45 attempts for 256 yards and 2 TDs in a 33-10 victory). The Eagles' 193 rushing yards were their most in a single game since 11/13/16 vs. Atlanta (38 attempts for 208 yards and 2 TDs in a 24-15 victory).

MORE FROM THE GAME

- Rasul Douglas registered his first career INT in the first quarter, becoming the first Eagle to record an INT within his first two career games since Nate Allen in 2010.
- The Eagles' 37:32 time of possession was their highest since 11/13/16 vs. Atlanta (38:10).

RUSHING TO VICTORY

- The Eagles' 214 rushing yards marked the team's highest single-game total since 11/27/14 at Dallas (256 W, 33-10).
- LeGarrette Blount led Philadelphia with a season-high 136 yards on 16 attempts (8.5 avg.). Blount's 136 yards marked the 5th-highest rushing total of his career. Blount became the first Eagle to rush for 136+ yards in a single game since LeSean McCoy on 11/27/14 at Dallas (159 W, 33-10).

CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS

■ Jake Elliott booted the Eagles to leads of 10-0, 13-0, 16-7 and 19-10 with FGs from 45, 40, 53 and 47 yards. Elliott has now made 6 consecutive FG attempts, all of which have been from 40+ yards (46, 61, 45, 40, 53, 47). During that stretch, Elliott's made FGs are averaging 48.7 yards in distance.

TIME OF POSSESSION

Philadelphia turned in a time of possession of 39:18, which was its highest single-game figure since 9/11/16 vs. Cleveland (39:20 – W, 29-10). The Eagles posted a 37:00+ time of possession in consecutive games (37:32 in Week 3 vs. NYG) for the first time since 10/16/11-10/30/11.

TOTAL NET YARDS

 Philadelphia's 454 total net yards were the club's most in a single game since 11/8/15 at Dallas (459 – W, 33-27).

MORE FROM THE GAME

■ The Eagles returned to the Los Angeles area for the first time since 9/23/90, when they defeated the Rams, 27-21, at Anaheim Stadium.

CARSON WENTZ'S CAREER DAY


- Carson Wentz threw for a career-high 4 TDs, including 3 in the first quarter (previous career high was 2). Wentz's 4 passing TDs were the most by an Eagle in a single game since Nick Foles on 11/3/13 at Oakland (7). Wentz (24 years, 282 days) became the youngest Eagle to throw 4+ TDs in a single game since Donovan McNabb (24 years, 15 days) on 12/10/00 at Cleveland (also 4). Wentz became the first Eagle to record 3 first-quarter passing TDs since at least 1991.
- On third down, Wentz went 11-of-12 (91.7%) for 225 yards (18.8 avg.), 3 TDs, 9 first downs and a 158.3 passer rating (all single-game bests by an NFL QB on third down in 2017). His third-down passing yards and yards per attempt were the most by an Eagle since at least 1991 and he recorded the most third-down completions and highest third-down completion percentage by an Eagle since Donovan McNabb on 10/1/00 vs. Atlanta (11-of-11, 100.0%) (min. 10 attempts). Additionally, Wentz recorded the most third-down passing TDs by an Eagle since McNabb on 11/27/08 vs. Arizona (also 3)



Philadelphia opened with 3 consecutive TD drives (all passing TDs) in the first 14:17 of the game, giving the Eagles an early 21-0 advantage. Philadelphia scored 21+ points in the first quarter for the sixth time since 1950, last doing so on 12/22/13 vs. Chicago (also 21).

MORE FROM THE GAME

- Nelson Agholor finished with a career-high 93 yards on 4 receptions (23.3 avg.), including a career-long 72-yard TD in the third quarter that gave the Eagles a 31-7 lead.
- Torrey Smith caught a season-high 70 yards on 3 catches (23.3 avg.), including a 59-yard TD that made it 21-0 in the first quarter. It was Smith's longest receiving TD since registering a 73-yard score on 10/8/15 vs. Baltimore with SF.

WENTZ THROWS FOR 3TDs

- Carson Wentz became the first Eagle to throw 3+ TDs in back-to-back games (7 TDs in 2 games) since Nick Foles from 11/3/13-11/10/13 (10 TDs in 2 games).

MULTI-TOUCHDOWN GAME FOR ERTZ




- Philadelphia rushed for a season-high 215 yards, which are the club's most in a single game since rushing for 256 yards at Dallas on 11/27/14.

The last time the Eagles tallied multiple sacks in 7+ straight games in a single season was in 2012 (8 games, 10/28/12-12/13/12).
- Derek Barnett led the Eagles with a career-high-tying 2.0 sacks, becoming the first Eagles rookie to have two multisack games since Trent Cole in 2005. Barnett now has 4.5 sacks (all of which have been recorded in the last 5 games), which are the most by an Eagles rookie since Fletcher Cox (5.5) in 2012.

MORE FROM THE GAME

Alshon Jeffery caught his 6th TD pass of the season and added a 2-point conversion in the 3rd quarter. Jeffery leads the NFL with three 2-point conversions this season. The last NFL player to record three 2-point conversions in a single season was Reggie Bush in 2007.

RECORDS & STREAKS

- Philadelphia owns the best record (10-1) in the NFL this season. The Eagles have started 10-1 for just the fourth time in franchise history (tied for their best start all-time through 11 games), having previously done so in 2004, 1980 and 1949.
- Philadelphia has won a franchise-record-tying 9 consecutive games for just the third time in team history, having previously done so in 2003 (10/19/03-12/15/03) and 1960 (9/30/60-12/4/60).

POINT PRODUCTION

 Philadelphia leads the NFL with 351 points, which are the most through 11 games in franchise history.

EAGLES DEFENSE

- Philadelphia allowed only 140 total yards, which was their fewest allowed in a single game since 12/1/96 vs. N.Y. Giants (121 yards). The Eagles also held Chicago to just 6 rushing yards, which is their fewest rushing yards allowed in a single game since 1950.
- The Eagles have held opponents to 9-or-fewer points in back-to-back games for the first time in a single season since 11/21/04-11/28/04 (also 2 games).

RUSHING OFFENSE

■ Philadelphia finished the game with 176 rushing yards, including a game-high 97 yards on 15 carries by LeGarrette Blount. The Eagles have rushed for 175+ yards in 3 consecutive games for the first time since 11/25/90-12/9/90 (also 3 games).

TOUCHDOWN TRIO

- Zach Ertz led Philadelphia with season highs in receptions (10) and receiving yards (103) and became the Eagles' first 100+ yard receiver this season.
- Philadelphia has three different players with 6+ receiving TDs (Ertz – 7, Agholor – 6, Jeffery – 6) through 11 games for the first time in franchise history.

POST-GAME NOTES

AGHOLOR'S CAREER GAME

- Nelson Agholor led the Eagles with career highs in receptions (7) and receiving yards (141) while also adding a 27-yard TD in the fourth quarter. Agholor's 141 receiving yards are the most by an Eagle in a single game since Zach Ertz on 1/3/16 at N.Y. Giants (152 yards).
- Agholor is tied with Zach Ertz and Alshon Jeffery for the team lead with a career-high 7 receiving TDs (tied for 5th-most in the NFL). This is the first time in franchise history that the Eagles have had three different receivers with 7+ receiving TDs each through 12 games. The last NFL team to accomplish that feat was the 2014 Broncos (Julius Thomas 12, Demaryius Thomas 10, Emmanuel Sanders 7).



- Carson Wentz leads the NFL with a career-high 29 passing TDs, which are now tied with Norm Snead in 1967 for the 4th-most in Eagles single-season history, trailing only Sonny Jurgensen in 1961 (32), Donovan McNabb in 2004 (31) and Randall Cunningham in 1990 (30).
- Wentz's 348 passing yards were the 2nd-highest single-game total of his career (364 yards on 11/6/16 at N.Y. Giants).

GRAHAM & BARNETT REGISTER SACKS

- Brandon Graham finished the game with 1.5 sacks to bring his season total to a career-high 8.5 sacks, which are the most by an Eagle since Fletcher Cox in 2015 (9.5) and the most by an Eagle through 12 games since Connor Barwin in 2014 (12.5). Graham now has 37.5 career sacks, which are the 7th-most in Eagles all-time history.
- Derek Barnett registered a half-sack to bring his season total to 5.0 sacks, which are the most by an Eagles rookie since Fletcher Cox in 2012 (5.5) and the most by an Eagles rookie through 12 games since Trent Cole in 2005 (5.0).

WENTZ SETS NEW EAGLES RECORD

- Carson Wentz established a new single-season franchise record with a career-high 33 passing TDs, breaking the previous mark of 32 set by Sonny Jurgensen in 1961.
- Wentz's 33 passing TDs are tied with Daunte Culpepper in 2000 (33) for the 4th-most ever by an NFL QB in his first or second year, behind Dan Marino in 1984 (48), Kurt Warner in 1999 (41) and Blake Bortles in 2015 (35).

FOLES LEADS COMEBACK



- Despite missing Zach Ertz, tight ends accounted for 3 of Philadelphia's 4 receiving TDs. Each of those 3 TDs came during the first half when the Eagles scored 21 unanswered points on 3 consecutive scoring drives.
- Trey Burton, who now has a career-high 4 receiving TDs this season, caught TDs of 20 and 11 yards to record his first career multi-TD game. Burton became the first undrafted Eagle with 2+ receiving TDs in a single game since Greg Lewis on 11/25/07 at New England (2 TDs).

MORE FROM THE GAME

 Brandon Graham sealed the victory with a 16-yard fumble recovery TD, which was the first score of his NFL career.



SINGLE-SEASON WINS AND POINTS


- With one game remaining in the regular season, Philadelphia has tied the most wins in franchise history with 13 (2004).
- The Eagles are 7-0 at home for the first time since 2004.
- Philadelphia has scored 457 points this season (30.5 points per game), which ranks 2nd all-time in single-season franchise history, trailing only 2014 (474 points). Heading into the final week of the regular season, the Eagles are 18 points shy of setting a new club record.

TAKEAWAYS

- The Eagles finished the game with a season-high 5 takeaways (3 FRs, 2 INTs) marking the first time that the team has recorded at least 5 takeaways in a game since 11/10/14 vs. Carolina (also 5).
- Derek Barnett sealed Philadelphia's win with a 23-yard fumble recovery TD as time expired to give the game its final score, 19-10. Barnett is the first Eagles rookie to produce a fumble recovery TD since Brian Rolle on 11/7/11 vs. Chicago.
- Barnett's fumble receovery TD marked the Eagles' 5th of the season, which is the most the team has ever recorded in a single season.

MORE FROM THE GAME

- Jake Elliott connected on a 48-yard FG to give the Eagles a 13-10 lead with 22 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter. It was his third game-winning FG of the season (also Week 3 vs. N.Y. Giants and Week 14 at L.A. Rams). Elliott is now tied with David Akers in 2004 for the most 40+ yard FGs (17) in single-season franchise history.
- Zach Ertz now has 800 receiving yards this season and is the first Eagles TE to record 800+ receiving yards in three consecutive seasons since Pete Retzlaff from 1963-65.
- Chris Long recorded his 5th sack of the season when he strip-sacked Derek Carr on third-and-8 in the 4th quarter.
 Four of his five sacks have been strip-sacks.



EAGLES RECORD BOOKS

- Philadelphia finished the regular season with a franchise-record-tying 13 wins (also 2004). The Eagles tied with Minnesota, New England and Pittsburgh for the best record in the NFL this season. This is the fifth time in team history that Philadelphia has at least tied for the best record in the NFL, previously doing so in 2002 (12-4, tied for best record in NFL), 1980 (12-4, tied for best record in NFL), 1960 (10-2, best record in NFL, tied for most wins) and 1949 (best record in NFL, most wins).
- Philadelphia finished with the 2nd-most points in team history (463, 28.9 points per game), trailing only their 2014 production (474, 29.6 points per game).
- Philadelphia finished with 338 total first downs this season, which are the 5th-highest total in single-season franchise history.

MORE FROM THE GAME

- Over the last two games of the regular season, Philadelphia held opponents to just 8.0 points per game and allowed only 8 conversions on 28 third-down attempts (28.6%).
- Eleven different receivers caught passes for the Eagles, including seven different players with multiple receptions.
- Zach Ertz now has 3,664 career receiving yards, moving past Jason Avant (3,646, 2006-13) and into 14th place on the Eagles all-time list.
- Steven Means sacked Dak Prescott for a 7-yard loss in the second quarter. The takedown was Means' first sack (2nd of his career) since bringing down Sam Bradford on a sack-fumble on 10/23/16 vs. Minnesota. Means was also credited with 3 solo tackles, 2 TFL and 2 QB hits.

POST-GAME NOTES

EAGLES ADVANCE TO NFC CHAMPIONSHIP

■ With a 15-10 victory over Atlanta, Philadelphia is set to play in the NFC Championship for the first time since the 2008 season (1/18/09 at Arizona – L, 25-32). The Eagles will host the conference title game for the first time since the 2004 season (1/23/05 vs. Atlanta – W, 27-10).

HOME SWEET HOME

- Philadelphia has produced a 14-3 (.824) record at home under head coach Doug Pederson, which is the best home record in the NFL over the last two seasons (including playoffs). The Eagles also own the best home record in the NFL this season at 8-1 (.889).
- The Eagles are 14-7 (.667) all-time at home in the playoffs, including a 5-3 (.625) mark at Lincoln Financial Field. The Eagles also improved to 5-0 all-time at home in the Divisional Round.
- Philadelphia has outscored opponents 244-117 (+127) at home this season, allowing just 13.0 points per game, as well as only 7.3 points per game in the last four contests. The Falcons' 10 points were the fewest points allowed by the Eagles in the playoffs since the 2004 NFC Championship vs. Atlanta (W, 27-10).

ELLIOTT SETS EAGLES POSTSEASON RECORD

■ Jake Elliott connected on a 53-yard FG at the end of the second quarter to cut the deficit, 10-9. The 53-yarder is the longest FG in Eagles postseason history (previously 51 yards by David Akers on 1/4/09 at Minnesota).

FOLES GETS FIRST CAREER PLAYOFF WIN

- Nick Foles completed 23-of-30 (76.7%) attempts for 246 yards and a 100.1 passer rating. Foles' 76.7% completion percentage is the highest single-game figure in Eagles playoff history.
- In two career postseason contests, Foles has combined to complete 46-of-63 (73.0%) attempts for 441 yards, 2 TDs, 0 INTs and a 102.7 passer rating.

FOLES THROWS FOR 352 YARDS, 3 TDs & 0 INTs


- Nick Foles completed 26-of-33 (78.8%) attempts for 352 yards, 3 TDs, 0 INTs and a 141.1 passer rating. Foles became the only QB in Eagles history to throw for 300+ yards and 3+ TDs in a single postseason game.
- Foles' 141.1 passer rating is the 2nd-best figure in Eagles single-game postseason history, behind Rodney Peete on 12/30/95 vs. Detroit (143.3).

JEFFERY'S MULTI-TOUCHDOWN GAME

Alshon Jeffery caught TDs of 53 and 5 yards to give the Eagles leads of 21-7 and 38-7, respectively. Jeffery is the fifth Eagle to record multiple receiving TDs in a playoff game.

ROBINSON RETURNS INTERCEPTION

■ Patrick Robinson helped swing the momentum of the game when he intercepted Case Keenum at the 50-yard line in the first quarter and returned the pick for a touchdown to tie the game, 7-7. The return is the 2nd-longest INT-TD in team postseason history, trailing only Damon Moore's 59-yard TD on 1/12/02 vs. Tampa Bay.

SUPER BOWL LII POST-GAME NOTES

- The Eagles captured their first Super Bowl title in franchise history and became the first team to win the Super Bowl with a backup quarterback since the 2001 Patriots
- Doug Pederson became just the 8th head coach in NFL history to win the Super Bowl within his first two seasons. The last coach to accomplish the feat was Mike Tomlin with the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2008 (2nd season). Pederson also became just the 7th head coach in league history to win the Super Bowl in his first postseason appearance and the first to do so since Brian Billick with the Baltimore Ravens in 2000




- The Eagles became the first Super Bowl winner without a 1,000-yard rusher or receiver in the regular season since the 1990 New York Giants
- Nick Foles became the first player in Super Bowl history to record a passing touchdown and a receiving touchdown
- Trey Burton became the 4th non-QB to record a passing TD in the Super Bowl
- Foles' 373 passing yards marked the highest single-game postseason total in franchise history, breaking the mark he set in the NFC Championship Game vs. Minnesota (352)
- Foles has recorded a 100+ passer rating in all 4 of his career playoff starts
- Philadelphia's 164 rushing yards were the most against a Bill Belichick-coached Patriots team in a Super Bowl
- Corey Clement's 100 receiving yards were the 3rd-most by a RB in Super Bowl history and the 4th-most by a rookie in Super Bowl history

MISC. SUPER BOWL NOTES

- LeGarrette Blount and Chris Long (NE and Phi.) joined Deion Sanders (SF and Dal.) and Ken Norton Jr. (Dal. and SF) as the only players in NFL history to play in back-to-back Super Bowls on different teams and win both games
- Blount's 11 postseason rushing TDs tie for the 6th-most in NFL history and are the most over the last 20 seasons
