

Nick Rallis enters his second season as the linebackers coach of the Philadelphia Eagles after originally joining the team in 2021.

In his first year with the team, Rallis contributed to a defense that allowed the fifth-fewest explosive plays (117), ninth-fewest rushing yards per game (107.9) and 10th-fewest total yards per game (328.8) in the NFL. Under his guidance, **Alex Singleton** (team-high 130) and **T.J. Edwards** (125) posted the fourth- and sixth-most tackles by any Eagle since at least 1991, respectively. The duo finished as two of five NFL players to total 125 tackles, one interception and one fumble recovery in the regular season.

Prior to Philadelphia, Rallis served as a defensive quality control/assistant linebackers coach with the Minnesota Vikings from 2018-20.

During the 2020 season, he assisted the only pair of linebacker teammates in the NFL to each record 100-plus tackles and three interceptions – **Eric Wilson** and **Eric Kendricks**. Wilson led the team with 121 tackles, while adding eight passes defensed, three sacks, three interceptions, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble. Kendricks totaled 107 tackles, six passes defensed and three interceptions.

With Rallis' help, Kendricks turned in a career year in 2019, as he collected first-team All-Pro honors from the *Associated Press* and earned his first career Pro Bowl nod. Kendricks was Minnesota's tackling leader (career-high 110) for the fifth consecutive season and tied for the most passes defensed (12) among NFL linebackers. Additionally, *Pro Football Focus* tabbed Kendricks as the league's highest-graded linebacker.

Before his stint with the Vikings, Rallis spent the 2017 season working as a quality control coach at Wake Forest.

An Edina, MN, native, Rallis played linebacker at the University of Minnesota from 2012-16. He saw action in 26 games with the Gophers and made three starts as a senior. In his final contest, he recorded five tackles and a sack in the Holiday Bowl victory over Washington State.

Rallis studied business marketing at Minnesota and earned his master's degree in sport and exercise science. His older brother, Mike, also played linebacker for the Gophers from 2008-12.

Rallis and his wife, Devin, have a son, Kendrick.
