CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ Is a four-time **Pro Bowl** selection (2015, '17, '20, '21), three-time *Associated Press* first-team **All-Pro** honoree (2017, '18, '19) and **Super Bowl LII** champion ... Owns the most Pro Bowls ever by an Eagles C ... Is one of six NFL Cs to earn three first-team All-Pro nods since the 1970 merger, joining Pro Football Hall of Famers **Dermontti Dawson** (six, 1988-2000), **Mike Webster** (five, 1974-90), **Dwight Stephenson** (four, 1980-87), **Jim Langer** (three, 1970-81) and **Kevin Mawae** (three, 1994-2009) ... Is the ninth player in franchise history to be named first-team All-Pro three times
- ▶ Has started 105 consecutive regular-season games, the longest active streak among NFL Cs (longest streak by an Eagles C since the 1970 merger) ... Is the first NFL C with 100+ straight starts in the regular season since **Chris Myers** from 2007-14 (123)
- ▶ In 2019, was part of an OL that became the fourth unit in team history to feature three Pro Bowlers (also **Brandon Brooks** and **Lane Johnson**) ... Helped the Eagles rank 3rd in red zone TD efficiency (66.7%) and 4th in third-down conversions (45.4%)
- ▶ Did not allow a sack in 1,037 offensive snaps (95%) in 2018
- ▶ Blocked for one of the most dominant OLs in the league during Philadelphia's **Super Bowl LII**-winning season in 2017 ... Contributed to just the fifth OL in franchise history to include multiple All-Pros (also Johnson) ... Helped the Eagles lead the NFL in red zone offense (65.5%) and rank 3rd in rushing offense (132.2 ypg) and offensive points per game (26.3)
- ▶ A member of the third OL in team history to send three players to the Pro Bowl in 2014, joining **Evan Mathis** and **Jason Peters** ... Helped the Eagles finish 3rd in the league in points per game (29.6), 5th in total offense (396.8 ypg), 6th in passing offense (272.3 ypg) and 9th in rushing offense (124.5 ypg) while setting franchise records in points (474) and TDs (54)
- ▶ Paved the way for the top rushing offense (160.4 ypg) in 2013, highlighted by the NFL's leading rusher - **LeSean McCoy** (1,607 yards) ... Philadelphia also ranked 2nd in the league in total offense (417.3 ypg) and 4th in scoring offense (27.6 ppg)
- ▶ In 2011, became the first Eagles rookie OL to start all 16 games since **Doug Brzezinski** in 1999 (first Eagles rookie C to do so) ... Surrendered only 1 sack during his debut season

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ Played in 47 career games at Cincinnati and started each of his final 38 contests at LG (26) and C (12) ... Started all 12 games at C during his senior season in 2010, earning All-America honorable mention and first-team All-Big East accolades ... Named second-team All-Big East following the 2008-09 seasons
- ▶ Added more than 40 pounds to his frame in the 2007 offseason and transitioned to OL ... Originally joined Cincinnati's team as a walk-on in 2006, when he received Scout Team Defensive Player of the Year honors as a 240-pound LB

- ▶ Dressed in Mummers regalia at the podium atop the steps of the Philadelphia Museum of Art, closed the **Super Bowl LII** Parade of Champions with an emotional, powerful and iconic speech that solidified his unique place in Philadelphia folklore ... Inspired by the “underdog” theme associated with the playoff run, delivered an ode to his teammates and the city’s resilient spirit
- ▶ Graduated from Cincinnati with a degree in marketing
- ▶ Comes from a football lineage, as his younger brother, Travis, was a teammate at Cincinnati (2008-10) playing TE and was drafted by Kansas City in the 3rd round in 2013 ... His uncle, Don Blalock Jr., played DT for Purdue (1976-77) and his grandfather, Don Blalock, played football at Ohio University
- ▶ Is the son of Donna and Ed Kelce ... Donna works in banking and Ed is a sales rep in the steel business ... He and his wife, Kylie, have two daughters, Wyatt Elizabeth and Elliotte Ray
