

BY THE NUMBERS ★

Dallas currently ranks third in the NFL with a +13 takeaway differential. The last time a Cowboys team finished a season with a differential of at least +13-or-better was 1981, when they finished with a +18 margin.

Micah Parsons needs 1.5 sacks to tie Jevon Kearse for the NFL rookie sack record (14.5). Parsons, who holds the Cowboys rookie sack record with 13.0, also has the most multi-sack games (three) by a rookie in Cowboys history. With another multi-sack performance, Parsons would be the seventh rookie in NFL history with four games of 1.5-or-more sacks.

Dallas leads the NFL with 29.9 points-pergame and has already tied the franchise record for most points in a season (479; 1983).

★ DALLAS COWBOYS 2021 SCHEDULE →

The Cowboys schedule currently features five games that will be broadcast nationally in primetime, including two from AT&T Stadium. In addition to the two primetime games at AT&T Stadium one on ESPN and one on NBC - and the club's annual Thanksgiving Day national appearance (this year on CBS), the Cowboys will make three national appearances in primetime on the road, one on NBC Thursday night, one on NBC's Sunday Night Football, and once on Thursday night on Fox/NFL Network/Amazon.

The Cowboys play five games against teams that qualified for the 2020 playoffs - Kansas City, New Orleans, Tampa Bay and Washington (twice). Additionally, for the 19th time in the organization's history, second consecutive, the Cowboys will open and close the season on the road. This will be fifth time in the last 11 years Dallas opens and closes the year away (2011, 2012, 2018, 2020).

This season marks the seventh time - second time in the last three seasons - that the Cowboys will face both Super Bowl participants from the previous season:

Player Spotlight

4 DAK PRESCOTT

Dak Prescott has nine games with a 100.0 passer rating in 2021 - tied for the second-most in the league - but he is tied for the NFL lead with seven games of a 100.0 passer rating and three touchdown passes this year:

Prescott has established a single-season career-high with 32 passing touchdowns in 2021 - a total that ranks third in a season in Cowboys history behind Tony Romo (36 in 2007 and 34 in 2014).

SCOUTING REPORT

Philadelphia has struggled to throw the ball in the red zone in 2021, recording the second-worst passer rating (68.8) and throwing a league-high five red zone interceptions on the year.

The Eagles have not been able to generate consistent pressure on opposing quarterbacks in 2021, recording only 28 sacks (fourth-fewest) on the season. Despite this, the Eagles have only blitzed their opponents on 19.9% of dropbacks this year - third-lowest rate in the league.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 18 ★

DAK PRESCOTT

Dak Prescott, who has 32 touchdown passes this year, is four passing touchdowns shy of Tony Romo's single-season franchise record (36) that he set in 2007.

- Prescott has a 68.4% completion rate in 15 games played in 2021, which would be a career-best and finish as the third-highest completion percentage in a season in franchise history. Tony Romo holds the completion percentage record (69.9%, 2014), while Troy Aikman ranks second (69.1%, 1993).
- Prescott, who has thrown at least three touchdowns in seven games this season, needs a three-touchdown game at Philadelphia to establish the most games in franchise history (eight) with three-or-more touchdown passes.
- Prescott (21,788) needs 172 passing yards to pass Danny White (21,959) for the fourth-most career passing yards in team history.

BRYAN ANGER

In his first season with the Cowboys, punter Bryan Anger leads the NFL with a career-high 44.6 net average. If Anger maintains his 44.6 net average, he will set a Cowboys record in net average (Chris Jones - 42.5, 2013).

TREVON DIGGS

- Trevon Diggs leads the NFL with 11 interceptions and is second in the league with 21 pass breakups. Diggs' 11 interceptions are tied with Everson Walls for the most interceptions in a season in Cowboys history. With one more pick, Diggs would have a team record 12 interceptions and become the first NFL player with 12 picks since Mike Reinfeldt in 1979.
- Since pass breakups became an official stat in 1999, Diggs is the only player in NFL history with 11 interceptions and 20-plus pass breakups in a season.
- Diggs has recorded at least one interception in all three games he has played against the Eagles and had a pick-six in the 41-21 win over Philadelphia in Week 3.



- Micah Parsons has already established the Cowboys rookie sack record with 13.0 sacks and is gunning for the NFL rookie sack record (14.5), which was set by Jevon Kearse in 1999. Parsons' 13.0 sacks lead all rookies in 2021 and ranks sixth among NFL defenders.
- Parsons has the most multi-sack games (three) by a rookie in Cowboys history. With another multi-sack performance, Parsons would be the seventh rookie in NFL history with four games of 1.5-or-more sacks. Aldon Smith is the only player in league history with five multi-sack games in a rookie season (2011).

TONY POLLARD

Tony Pollard seeks 31 rushing yards to reach 750 rushing yards this season, which would be a career-high. Pollard and Elliott (915 rushing yards) would become the first Cowboys running back tandem to gain 750 yards on the ground in the same season since 1972 - Calvin Hill (1,036) and Walt Garrison (784).

DALTON SCHULTZ

Dalton Schultz, who is at 787 receiving yards, needs 13 yards on Saturday to join Jason Witten as the only Cowboys tight ends to reach 800 yards in a season.

CEEDEE LAMB

- CeeDee Lamb (1,992) needs eight receiving yards on Saturday to reach 2,000 career receiving yards. Lamb would join Hayes (2,235) as the only two Cowboys with 2,000 receiving yards in their first two seasons.
- Lamb's seven career games with 100 scrimmage yards are the second-most 100 scrimmage yard games by a Cowboys receiver in his first two seasons, trailing Bob Hayes (eight).

DALLAS COWBOYS



- Dallas has had 19 different players score a touchdown this season, which is a team record for the most players to reach the end zone in a single season. The NFL record is 21 players in a single season, done three times: 1987 LA Rams (includes replacement players), 2000 Denver Boncos and the 2007 New England Patriots.
- Dallas leads the NFL with 29.9 points-per-game and has already tied the franchise record for most points in a season (479 1983). With one point at Philadelphia, the 2021 Cowboys will set the team record for most points in a season.
- The Cowboys have tallied an NFL-best 25 interceptions this season, the most picks by a Dallas team in a single season since the 1985 squad had 33 interceptions.
- Dallas heads into the regular season finale with a +13 turnover differential, good for third in the NFL. The last time the Cowboys finished a season with a turnover differential of +13-or-better was in 1981 (+18).
- The Cowboys are 5-0 against the NFC East in 2021. With a win at Philadelphia, Dallas will go undefeated against the division for just the third time in franchise history (1969 and 1998).



★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 6-10 record in 2020 and a 11-5 record in 2021, he owns the sixth-most wins (26th all-time) and eighth-highest winning percentage among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason nine times, won six NFC North Division titles, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

McCarthy vs. NFL

\star HEAD COACHES \star

MIKE McCARTHY (142-92-2, 15th Year, 17-15 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, handing the reigns of the team to an innovative offensive mind with a championship pedigree.

McCarthy has 14 years of head coaching experience – 13 with Green Bay and one with Dallas – along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 142-92-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the sixth-most wins (26th all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason nine times, won six NFC North Division titles, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In his first season with the Cowboys, McCarthy's plan to install a new culture in Dallas was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to COVID protocols, McCarthy's first offseason with the Cowboys included no in-person meetings or practices. When the 2020 season came around, McCarthy's challenges continued. He watched his franchise quarterback Dak Prescott suffer a devastating season-ending injury in Week 5, along with having to implement eight different starting offensive line combinations due to injuries up front. Despite the hurdles, the 2020 Dallas Cowboys were in position to win the NFC East entering Week 17 but came up just short.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight or more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

NICK SIRIANNI (9-7, 1st Year)

Nick Sirianni was named the 24th head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles on January 24, 2021, after a productive three-year stretch as the Indianapolis Colts offensive coordinator.

During his first season in Philadelphia, Sirianni has guided the Eagles to a playoff berth, becoming just the third coach in team history to guide the Eagles to the postseason in his first season, joining Chip Kelly (2013) and Ray Rhodes (1995). Sirianni's offense leads the NFL in rushing (160.4 yards-per-game) while the defense is tied for eighth in points allowed (20.9)

In his three seasons guiding the Colts offense, Indianapolis was seventh in red zone touchdown efficiency (63.9%) and eighth in points-per-game (24.4). Sirianni helped the Colts to a 28-20 record during that span, including a pair of 10-win campaigns and two playoff appearances.

In 2020 Sirianni directed a Colts offense that posted the 10thmost total yards-per-game in the NFL (387.1). Sirianni and quarterback Philip Rivers worked well together while with the Colts, as Rivers posted the eighth-highest completion percentage (68%) and 10th-most passing yards (4,169) in the NFL.

Sirianni took over a young offense in Philadelphia, including rookie wide receiver DeVonta Smith and second-year playmakers in Jalen Hurts, Jalen Reagor and Quez Watkins. However, Sirianni is no stranger to developing young offensive talents. In 2020 with Indianapolis, Sirianni helped rookie running back Jonathan Taylor finish third in the NFL in rushing with 1,169 yards on the ground.

During 2018, Sirianni's first season with the Colts offense, quarterback Andrew Luck was named Associated Press NFL Comeback Player of the Year after throwing for 4,593 yards and 39 touchdowns.

Prior to his three-year stint with the Colts, Sirianni spent five seasons with the LA Chargers (2013-17), starting as an offensive quality control coach before going on to coach quarterbacks and receivers. From 2014-15, Sirianni served as the Chargers quarterbacks coach while Philip Rivers was under center. Sirianni helped Rivers earn back-to-back Pro Bowls in those two seasons.

Sirianni began his NFL coaching career with the Kansas City Chiefs (2009-12) as a quality control coach. Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Sirianni spent three years as the wide receivers coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2006-08) and two seasons as the defensive backs coach at his alma mater, Mount Union, where he was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 2000-02.

★ PRO BOWL COWBOYS ★

Five Dallas Cowboys were selected to the 2021 NFL Pro Bowl set to take place at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas, Nev., on Sunday, February 6, 2022. Three of the five players representing the Cowboys in the Pro Bowl will be making their first trip, and three of the five were selected as starters. There are two players from offense, two from defense and one from special teams.

Tyron Smith will be making his eighth trip to the game, tying him with Emmitt Smith for the sixth-most trips in team history. Zack Martin (starter) will be making his seventh trip, giving him the second-most appearances by a Cowboys guard behind Allen (nine). Martin's seven

trips also tie DeMarcus Ware for the eighth-most overall.

Representing the defense are two first-time selections in Trevon Diggs and Micah Parsons, with both selected as starters. Diggs is the first cornerback to make the game since Byron Jones in 2018, and the first corner to be named a starter since Deion Sanders. Parsons becomes the second Cowboys rookie linebacker (Leighton Vander Esch, 2018), fourth rookie defender (Mel Renfro, 1964; Everson Walls, 1981 and Vander Esch) and 12th overall rookie to earn the honor.

Rounding out Dallas' Pro Bowl roster is punter Bryan Anger, making his first career appearance. Anger is the fourth punter in Cowboys

history to earn a spot in the Pro Bowl.

★ PRIMETIME COWBOYS ★

The Dallas Cowboys have a 96-80 record in primetime games and are 4-1 this year, with the opening week loss to Tampa Bay and wins against Philadelphia, Minnesota, New Orleans and Washington. With a win on Saturday, Dallas would go 5-1 in primetime games for the first time since 2016.

This week the Cowboys return to primetime on Saturday night on ESPN's *Monday Night Football* in a road bout in Philadelphia. The Cowboys hold a 48-35 all-time record on *MNF* broadcasts and will be making their 84th appearance on the show. Dallas' 48 wins on *MNF* are the third-most in NFL history behind Pittsburgh (51) and San Francisco (50).

Dallas and Philadelphia squared off in primetime in Week 3 of the 2021 season, as the Cowboys defeated the Eagles 41-21 on *Monday Night Football* in front of a TV audience of 14.9 million viewers, the most-watched MNF Week 3 game since 2012.

The Dallas Cowboys announced Dak Prescott as its nominee for the WALTER PAYTON NFL MAN OF THE YEAR AWARD PRESENT-ED BY NATIONWIDE.

Considered one of the league's most prestigious honors, the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Award presented by Nation-wide recognizes an NFL player for outstanding community service activities off the field, as well as excellence on the field.

"I am extremely humbled and honored to be named the Dallas Cowboys Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year candidate, especially in light of all of the great things my teammates are doing in the community," said Prescott. "I am proud



of the work that my Faith Fight Finish Foundation is doing to support those facing adversity and the programming being developed to help those individuals, families and communities find strength for a better future. If I can be the catalyst for conversations to be started or someone to seek help when they are feeling alone, I see that as a great purpose."

Prescott and the Faith Fight Finish Foundation (FFF) have worked tirelessly to align with trusted partners to implement solutions to the issues plaguing our nation. In the wake of the senseless murder of George Floyd, Prescott lent his voice to the dialogue, penning an oped in which he vowed to take action to rid communities of racism, racial-profiling and hate. He pledged one million dollars to police training, education, and advocacy. Since that time, FFF has worked to build trust between law enforcement and the communities they serve and protect, by forming the Law Enforcement Steering Committee (LESC) comprised of youth, community leaders and law enforcement personnel that addresses systemic racism through education and advocacy.

Mental health awareness became a cause Prescott began championing after losing his brother, Jace, to suicide during the isolation of the Covid-19 pandemic. Prescott's promise is to make sure that Jace's life will be "a life taken to save millions." Through collaboration with NFL players Soloman Thomas and Hayden Hurst, Prescott and FFF are sponsoring programs created to teach educators to connect with students in crisis and identify the signs of depression and mental illness.

As a nominee, Prescott will wear a Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year helmet decal through the end of the season in recognition of his accomplishments on and off the field. All 32 nominees will receive up to a \$40,000 donation in their name to their charity of choice. The winner of the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award will receive a \$250,000 donation to the charity of his choice. All donations are courtesy of the NFL Foundation and Nationwide.

\star PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS \star

Amari Cooper - WR

Played in eight games against the Eagles, seven with Dallas and one with the Raiders, with 36 receptions for 640 yards (17.8 avg.) and four touchdowns.

Trevon Diggs - CB

Has intercepted a pass in all three games he has played against Philadelphia. His four interceptions against the Eagles are the most of any opponent in his career. Tallied a pick-six in the Week 3 win (9/27/21).

Ezekiel Elliott - RB

In nine games, carried the ball 186 times for 884 yards and four touchdowns while adding 46 catches for 343 yards and a score. Rushed for 95 yards and two touchdowns in Week 3.

Has 10 catches for 158 yards and a touchdown in three career games against the Eagles, including the longest touchdown reception of his career - a 52-yard bomb from Andy Dalton.

Dak Prescott - QB

Completed 65.4% of his passes for 2,115 yards with 11 touch-downs against seven interceptions in nine games against Philadelphia. His 143.3 passer rating in the Week 3 win (9/27/21) was the third-highest of his career.

Leighton Vander Esch - LB

Notched 36 tackles, two for loss, and a sack in five games. In his first-ever game against the Eagles, set career-highs in both total tackles (19) and solo tackles (15). Forced a strip-sack in the 2020 Week 8 loss to Philadelphia.

FIRST TIME, LAST TIME

The first time these two clubs met, the Dallas Cowboys were entering the second game of their inaugural season. On Oct. 9, 1960, the Cowboys lost a 25-27 nail biter to the Eagles in front of 18,500 fans at the Cotton Bowl.

Dallas and Philadelphia last faced off in Week 3 on Monday Night Football, as the Cowboys handed the Eagles a 41-21 loss in front of 93,267 fans at AT&T Stadium. Trevon Diggs recorded his first career pick-six while Ezekiel Elliott ran for 95 yards and two touchdowns and Dalton Schultz caught six passes for two scores.

\star all in the family \star

The Dallas Cowboys broke a four-year streak of winning seasons against the NFC East after finishing 2-4 against the division in 2020. However, the Cowboys are off to a 5-0 start against the NFC East in 2021 and are the only team in the NFL that is unbeaten against their division. Dallas wraps up play against the NFC East at Philadelphia in the regular season finale.

Overall, the Cowboys hold a 217-148-4 record against NFC East rivals. Below is a look at Dallas' record against the East:

Since Dak Prescott took over as the starting quarterback for Dallas, he has thrown 50 touchdowns against 15 interceptions for 7,408 yards and a 98.9 passer rating against the NFC East - tied for the 10th-highest passer rating by any quarterback against his own division in that span, while recording a 24-6 record against NFC East opponents as the Cowboys quarterback.

\star Series History \star

Dallas and Philadelphia have squared off 125 times, with the Cowboys holding a 71-54 edge in one of the NFL's largest rivalries. Dallas lost the first three games of the series before log-ging win streaks of 11 games and nine games over the course of the next 18 years. There have been four playoff games - one Wild Card Game (2009), two Divisional Playoff Games (1992 and 1995) and an NFC Championship Game (1980). In 2018 the Dallas Cowboys reached a milestone with their 10th season in what is now AT&T Stadium. The Cowboys finished that regular season 7-1 record at home - tied with the 2016 team for the most wins and best record in a single season all-time at AT&T Stadium. In 2021 the building hosted its 100th regular season game in a contest against Denver (11/7). The Cowboys finished 5-3 in 2021.

Dallas' first game at the venue was on Sept. 20, 2009 - a 31-33 loss to the N.Y. Giants. The club's first win came a week later with a 21-7 decision over Carolina. Overall, Dallas owns a 58-46

regular season record - 3-1 postseason - and a 61-47 overall mark at home in AT&T Stadium. Below is a breakdown of the club's record on their home turf:



Dak Prescott earned NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his Week 6 performance in the comeback victory over New England (10/17/21). Prescott threw for 445 yards and three touchdowns - the most yards ever against a Bill Belichick Patriots defense - marking the fourth-consecutive three-touchdown day for Prescott. Included in his three touchdowns was the overtime game-winner to CeeDee Lamb, cementing Prescott's 17th career game-winning drive and Dallas' first win in Foxboro since 1986.

Prescott again was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week after he threw for 330 yards and four touchdowns in a home victory over Washington (12/26/21) - becoming the only quarterback to throw a touchdown pass to a wide receiver, tight end, running back and offensive lineman in a regular season NFL game.

He also earned NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his Week 1, 2019 performance against the N.Y. Giants (9/8/19), again in Week 12, 2019 after commanding a road victory over the Detroit Lions (11/17/19), and then Prescott carried the Cowboys to a comeback victory from a 20-point deficit at home against the Falcons (9/20/20) in Week 2 of the 2020 season.

Prescott joins Troy Aikman and Tony Romo as the only Cowboys quarterbacks to earn three player of the week awards:

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

In his first season, Elliott had seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie all-time and tied for the NFL-lead in 2016. He owns 30 for his career to rank third all-time in team history. Dallas is 26-4 when Elliott tops 100 yards on the ground:





Against Washington (12/26), Dallas had touchdowns from an offensive lineman and a defensive lineman in the same game for the first time in franchise history when defensive end DeMarcus Lawrence intercepted a pass and returned it 40 yards for a touchdown and then tackle Terence Steele caught a touchdown after reporting eligible.

Steele's touchdown reception was the first touchdown catch by a Cowboys offensive lineman in team history (Rayfield Wright caught a touchdown in 1968 as a backup tight end before he was moved to right tackle and became the starter in 1969).

Dallas added a punt block touchdown in the game against Washington, scoring a touchdown in all three phases of the game for the first time since at Philadelphia (11/11/12).

Trevon Diggs was named NFC Defensive Player of the Month for September, becoming just the third Cowboys defender and first defensive back to win the award for Dallas.

Diggs was a lock-down corner through three September games for Dallas, helping the Cowboys to a league-leading plusfive turnover differential and NFL-best eight takeaways in the opening month of 2021. Diggs tied for the NFL-lead with three interceptions - matching his career-high from his rookie campaign in 2020, and led all defensive players with six pass breakups in September. In the Week 3 Monday Night Football game against division rival Philadelphia, Diggs returned an interception 59 yards for a touchdown to break open the game, also registering three breakups in the contest and holding Jalen Hurts to a 36.8 passer rating when targeted.

He registered an interception in each of the first three games of the season, tied with Everson Walls (1985) for the longest streak to start a season in Cowboys history since the 1970 merger.

Dallas also ranked 10th in passing yards-per-game (277.3) at the conclusion of September largely on the strength of Diggs' play.

On the heels of his NFC Defensive Player of the Month honors, Trevon Diggs added another accolade to his resume, earning NFC Defensive Player of the Week after the Cowboys' 36-28 win over the Panthers.

Diggs recorded four tackles and two interceptions in the game, becoming the fourth player since 1990 and first Cowboy since 1970 with an interception in each of his team's first four games of a season. No other player had two interceptions in Week 4.

Diggs is the first Cowboys cornerback to earn the honor since Brandon Carr (Week 15, 2012).

Micah Parsons leads the Cowboys and is tied for the league-lead with 20 tackles for loss - the most tackles for loss by a Cowboys linebacker since Sean Lee posted 13 TFLs in 2017.

★ THE LIONBACKER ★

The Cowboys drafted Micah Parsons with the 12th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft, adding a fast play maker to a defense that finished 28th in points/game allowed in 2020.

Parsons is proving to be a versatile chess piece for Dallas, playing 301 run defense snaps, 307 pass rush snaps and 284 pass coverage snaps in 2021. Pro Football Focus has credited Parsons with 67 quarterback pressures on the season - 11th in the NFL - largely due to eight pressures in Week 2 at the LA Chargers, a game in which Parsons moved from linebacker to defensive end because of injuries to other players on the Cowboys roster, and 10 pressures against Las Vegas (11/28).

Micah Parsons was awarded NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors following the Cowboys road victory at Minnesota in Week 8, the first defensive player of the week honor for Parsons and the second by a Cowboys defender in 2021.

Parsons finished with a game-high 11 tackles, including four tackles for losses, with one pressure. Parsons tormented Minnesota ball carriers behind the line of scrimmage, making him only the third Cowboy (DeMarcus Ware, four times; DeMarcus Lawrence, once), to tally four tackles behind the line of scrimmage in recent history (dating back to 2008).

★ DEF ROOKIE OF THE MONTH ★

Micah Parsons was named NFL Defensive Rookie Month following a dominating four games in November.

Parsons led all NFL defenders with 6.5 sacks, which also tied De-Marcus Lawrence for the second-most sacks in a month in franchise history (DeMarcus Ware, 7.0, Oct., 2011). Parsons recorded a sack in each of the four November games, including two contests with multiple sacks. His sack on Thanksgiving Day bumped his season total to 9.0, which established a club rookie record for single-season sacks.

Not including his 6.5 sacks, Parsons notched an additional four tackles for loss (one in each game) and was credited with 13 pressures, including a season-high seven on Thanksgiving Day against Las Vegas (11/25).

\star DEF ROOKIE OF THE MONTH X2 \star

Micah Parsons earned his second NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month award for the month of December, after posting 12 tackles, 4.0 sacks, three tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one pass defensed during the month. He was the only rookie to record at least one sack in three different games across Weeks 13-16.

Parsons, who was also named Defensive Rookie of the Month for November, is the first Cowboys player to win multiple Rookie of the Month awards (offense or defense). This award for Parsons marks the third consecutive season that a defensive rookie has won the award in consecutive months [Tampa Bay linebacker Devin White (November & December, 2019); Carolina safety Jeremy Chinn (October & November, 2020)].

★ I'LL TAKE THAT ★

The Dallas defense forced four takeaways in Week 1 against Tom Brady and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, tying its single-game high from a season ago (at Phi, 11/1/20 and vs. SF, 12/20/20).

The Cowboys finished last season with a -3 turnover differential, tied for 21st in the league, and had a 2-7 record in games that they posted an even or negative turnover margin.

Dallas ranks third with a +13 turnover differential in 2021, and it has posted an even or positive takeaway differential in 12-of-16 games this season, going 10-2 in those games.

TAKEAWAYS IN BUNCHES \star

The Cowboys recorded 16 takeaways (nine fumble recoveries, seven interceptions) in the second half of the 2020 season after recording only seven takeaways in the first eight games of the season. Dallas finished the year with a takeaway in seven straight games, its longest streak with a takeaway since a ninegame streak to close the 2018 season.

Dallas has continued to pilfer the football in 2021, recording 33 takeaways through 16 games - tied for the most in the NFL. The takeaways have not only limited opponent scoring but have led to points for the Cowboys on 66.7% of drives after takeaways (22-of-33) - also first in the league:





Randy Gregory made an immediate impact in his return from injury at Washington (12/12), tipping a pass that he then intercepted in the second quarter, and then sacking quarterback Kyle Allen while simultaneously forcing a fumble that stopped an attempted comeback drive in the fourth quarter.

Gregory is the first defensive lineman to have a sack, an interception and a forced fumble in the same game since Jerry Hughes did it for Buffalo at the N.Y. Jets (10/25/20), and he is only the second Cowboys player to ever post that stat line, joining Tony Dixon who did it at Washington on Dec. 29, 2002.



The kick to beat the Chargers was the second-longest game-winner of Zuerlein's career - longest regular season kick - and Zuerlein's 57-yard game-winning kick in the NFC Conference Championship game in 2018 is the longest game-winning field goal in postseason history.

Zuerlein is 28-of-34 on field goals in 2021- two-of-five from 50-plus yards. He is tied for 12th in the NFL with 120 kicking points.

Zuerlein finished three-of-nine from 50-plus in 2020 and connected on 34-of-41 field goals overall, tied with Richie Cunningham (1997) for the most made field goals in a single season in team history. He also tallied 135 points, tied for second-most in a single season in team history.


