



**POST-GAME NOTES**  
**PHILADELPHIA EAGLES vs. LOS ANGELES CHARGERS**  
**November 7, 2021**

**EAGLES 24, CHARGERS 27**

- Philadelphia finished with 176 rushing yards, which marks its 2nd-highest rushing total of the season (season-high 236 rushing yards in Week 8 at Detroit). The Eagles have produced 175+ rushing yards in consecutive games for the first time since 11/5/17-11/26/17 (3 games). Today was also the first time Philadelphia rushed for 100+ yards in the first half of consecutive games since 2013.
  - **Jordan Howard** led the offense with 71 yards and 1 TD on 17 carries (4.2 avg.). Today marked his highest rushing output since an 82-yard effort on 11/3/19 vs. Chicago. Howard has scored rushing TDs in 7 of his last 12 games played with Philadelphia (9 TDs). He has also posted 3 rushing TDs in a 2-game span for the first time since 9/26/19-10/6/19.
  - **Jalen Hurts** has registered 60+ rushing yards in each of the last 3 games, including 62 yards on 10 carries (6.2 avg.) in today's matchup. This is the second instance in which Hurts has accomplish the feat, having previously done so from 12/13/20-12/27/20 (3 games).
  - **Boston Scott** posted 10 rushes for 40 yards (4.0 avg.) in today's contest. Scott has produced 22 carries for 100 yards (4.5 avg.) and 2 TDs over the last 2 games.
  - **Kenneth Gainwell** helped the Eagles reclaim a 17-16 lead in the third quarter following a 1-yard TD plunge that capped a 10-play, 85-yard scoring drive. It was Gainwell's 3rd career rushing TD as well as his 4th career offensive TD. Only **Corey Clement** (5 in 2017) has recorded more offensive TDs among Eagles rookie RBs in their first 9 games.
  - The Eagles have rushed 30+ times in 3 straight games for the first time since 10/23/17-11/26/17 (5 games). This is also the first time Philadelphia has logged 39-or-more carries in back-to-back games since 9/24/17-10/1/17 (2 games).
- Philadelphia led four 10+ play possessions that resulted in points today, including 3 TD drives – 10 plays, 75 yards; 10 plays, 85 yards; and 10 plays, 78 yards (16-play, 68-yard FG drive also).
- Philadelphia converted 8-of-12 (66.7%) third-down attempts. It marked the Eagles' most third-down conversions this season (most since also posting 8 on 11/30/20 vs. Seattle), and it was their highest third-down conversion percentage this year (highest since 71.4% on 10/11/20 at Pittsburgh).
- **Jalen Hurts** completed 11-of-17 attempts for 162 yards, 1 TD, 0 INTs and a 115.3 passer rating. His 115.3 passer rating was the 2nd-highest single-game total of his career, trailing only the 126.4 mark he produced in Week 1 at Atlanta. Hurts completed 7 passes of 18+ yards, including four 20+ yard completions – 28, 27 and 23 yards to **DeVonta Smith**, and 21 yards to **Dallas Goedert**.
- **DeVonta Smith** registered his second career 100+ yard receiving game after totaling 5 receptions for 116 yards (career-high 23.2 avg.) and 1 TD (previous: 122 yards on 10/3/21 vs. Kansas City).
  - Smith, who now has 537 receiving yards this season, joins **DeSean Jackson** (586 yards in 2008) as the only Eagles to record 500+ receiving yards in their first 9 career games.
- **T.J. Edwards** once again led the defense in tackles (12) after producing a career-high 13 tackles in Week 8 at Detroit. Edwards has registered double-digit tackles for the first time in his career.

**MORE FROM THE GAME**

- **Fletcher Cox** appeared in his 149th career regular-season game, which broke a tie with **Ken Clarke** (148, 1978-87) for the most games played by a defensive tackle in franchise history.
  - Overall, Cox's 149 career games are the 6th-most ever by an Eagles defensive player, behind **Brian Dawkins** (183, 1996-2008), **Chuck Bednarik** (169, 1949-62), **Brandon Graham** (161, 2010-present), **Randy Logan** (159, 1978-83) and **Trent Cole** (155, 2005-14).
- **Jason Kelce** has started in 114 consecutive regular-season games, which is the longest active streak among NFL centers. Kelce also played in his 150th career game, which is the 5th-most by an offensive lineman in Eagles history, trailing only **Chuck Bednarik** (169, 1949-62), **Tra Thomas** (166, 1998-2008), **Guy Morriss** (158, 1973-83) and **Jerry Sisemore** (156, 1973-84).
