BIRDSEED

- Hosts the DeVonta Smith & Friends Celebrity Softball Game annually at the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Philadelphia Phillies’ Triple-A affiliate) stadium in Allentown, PA ... The fundraiser’s teams feature a number of Eagles teammates and other players from across the league
- Is the son of Christina Smith-Sylve, who is a social worker, and Kelvin Dickerson, who manages a car-detailing business ... Also has a younger brother, Christian, who was a RB at Amite (LA) High School ... Bought a brand new home for his mother during the 2021 offseason
- Credits much of his success to his barber, Vincent Sanders, who became his mentor growing up ... Sanders helped reinforce that football was meant to be a part of Smith’s future and drove him to camps
- Has represented the Eagles Autism Foundation through the NFL’s *My Cause My Cleats* campaign ... The foundation helps support impactful autism research and care to improve the lives of affected individuals and families while aiming to drive scientific breakthroughs

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Is the Eagles’ all-time leader in postseason receiving yards (595)
- Led Philadelphia with 69 yards and 1 TD on 4 receptions (17.3 avg.) in the 40-22 win vs. Kansas City in **Super Bowl LIX** in 2024 ... Hauled in a 46-yard TD pass that is remembered as “The Dagger” as it lifted the Eagles to an insurmountable 34-0 lead during the third quarter
- Recorded the most single-game receiving yards (148) in team playoff history in the NFC Wild Card at Tampa Bay on 1/15/24
- Produced 100 yards on 7 receptions (14.3 avg.) in Super Bowl LVII vs. Kansas City in 2022, becoming the third player in franchise history to have 100+ receiving yards in a Super Bowl ... Joined **Terrell Owens** in Super Bowl XXXIX (122) and **Corey Clement** in Super Bowl LII (100)
- With a career-high 1,196 receiving yards in 2022, teamed up with **A.J. Brown** (1,496) to become the Eagles’ first 1,000+ yard receiving duo ... The tandem then repeated the feat during the 2023 campaign
- Set the team rookie record for receiving yards (916) in 2021, breaking the previous mark owned by **DeSean Jackson** in 2008 (912)

NOTES TO KNOW

- Is one of just four NFL players with 7+ receiving TDs in three consecutive seasons, joining **Davante Adams**, **A.J. Brown** and **Ja’Marr Chase** ... Also one of four Eagles to accomplish that feat, along with **Mike Quick** (five, 1983-87), **Harold Carmichael** (four, 1977-80) and Brown

2025 SEASON - EAGLES

- Recorded a career-high 183 yards on 9 catches (20.3 avg.) in the 28-22 win at Minnesota (10/19/25) ... Hauled in a career-long 79-yard TD catch on second-and-5 with 8:07 remaining in the third quarter to give the Eagles a 21-9 lead ... His 183 yards marked the most by an Eagle since **Jeremy Maclin** in 2014 (187)
- Caught a 4-yard TD pass on fourth-and-4 from the LAR 4-yard line with 1:48 remaining in the fourth quarter, completing the Eagles stretch of 19 unanswered points and giving them a 27-26 lead in the win vs. Los

2024 SEASON - EAGLES

- ▶ Finished with 833 yards after leading the team in receptions (68) and receiving TDs (career-high 8) in 13 games ... Added 190 yards and 1 TD on 16 catches in four playoff contests ... Became the first Eagle with 300+ career receptions (308) in their first four NFL seasons
- ▶ Caught 4 passes for 69 yards (17.3 avg.) and 1 TD in the 40-22 victory vs. Kansas City in **Super Bowl LIX** (2/9/25) ... Completed the signature play of the game, known as "The Dagger," a 46-yard TD that provided Philadelphia a 34-0 lead with 2:40 remaining in the third quarter
- ▶ Posted a season-high 120 yards and a career-high-tying 2 TDs on 6 receptions (20.0 avg.) in the 41-7 win vs. Dallas (12/29/24) ... His 22-yard TD in the second quarter gave the Eagles a lead they would not surrender en route to clinching the NFC East Championship
- ▶ Logged a career-high 11 catches (most by an Eagle in 2024) for 109 yards and 1 TD in the 27-13 victory vs. Pittsburgh (12/15/24)
- ▶ Registered the game-winning, 45-yard TD with 7:54 remaining in the fourth quarter of the 20-16 win vs. Cleveland (10/13/24)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ Played collegiately at Alabama (2017-20), where he caught 235 passes for 3,965 yards and 46 TDs in 54 career games ... Finished as the SEC's all-time leader in receiving yards and TDs (5th-most in NCAA history)
- ▶ Voted the 2020 Heisman Trophy winner after leading the NCAA in receptions (117), receiving yards (1,856) and receiving TDs (23) ... Became the first WR to capture the Heisman Trophy since **Desmond Howard** in 1991 ... Also became just the third player in Crimson Tide history to do so, joining **Derrick Henry** (2015) and **Mark Ingram** (2009)
- ▶ Recognized as the 2020 *Associated Press* Player of the Year (first WR to ever win the award) ... Also honored as the Biletnikoff Award winner (presented to the nation's top receiver), Paul Hornung Award recipient



(awarded to the nation's most versatile player), a unanimous first-team All-America selection and SEC Offensive Player of the Year

- ▶ A two-time CFP National Champion (2017 and 2020) ... Selected as the Offensive MVP of the 2021 CFP National Championship Game after posting 12 receptions for 215 yards (17.9 avg.) and 3 TDs in the first half, shattering seven school, conference and CFP records
