

POST-GAME NOTES PHILADELPHIA EAGLES at LAS VEGAS RAIDERS October 24, 2021

POST-GAME NOTES

- Philadelphia produced an 8-play, 67-yard scoring drive on the team's opening possession, resulting in a 13-yard TD pass from **Jalen Hurts** to **Kenneth Gainwell** to make it a 7-0 game.
 - The series marked the Eagles' third opening TD drive this season (also Week 1 at Atlanta and Week 6 vs. Tampa Bay). Hurts completed 2-of-3 attempts for 37 yards, including a 24-yard completion to **Dallas Goedert**, while **Miles Sanders** rushed for 25 yards on 5 attempts.
 - Hurts has recorded either a passing TD or rushing TD in 12 straight games.
 - Goedert, who also posted a 25-yard reception during the fourth quarter, has produced catches of 20+ yards in each of his last 4 games played.
- Avonte Maddox picked off Raiders QB Derek Carr at the PHI 4 on Las Vegas' opening drive. The first-quarter takeaway marked Maddox's 3rd career INT and first since 12/16/18 at L.A. Rams.
 - Maddox became the first Eagle to register a red zone INT since Marcus Epps on 12/20/20 at Arizona and the first Eagles CB to do so since Rasul Douglas on 9/6/18 vs. Atlanta.
- **Boston Scott** capped an 8-play, 59-yard scoring drive with a 1-yard rushing TD in the fourth quarter, which cut the Eagles' deficit to 14-30. The play was his first TD since 10/22/20 vs. N.Y. Giants.
- **Jalen Reagor** finished off a 12-play, 75-yard drive after hauling in a 17-yard TD pass from Hurts with 3:50 remaining in the game to cut the deficit to 20-33.
 - Goedert then converted the 2-point conversion attempt, catching the pass from Hurts to make the score 22-33.

MORE FROM THE GAME

- **Jason Kelce** started his 112th consecutive regular-season game, which is the longest active streak among NFL centers (longest streak by an Eagles center since the 1970 merger). It is the longest streak by any NFL center since **Chris Myers** from 2007-14 (123 games).
 - Kelce also moved into sole possession of the 5th-most regular-season games played (149) by an OL in franchise history, trailing only Chuck Bednarik (169, 1949-62), Tra Thomas (166, 1998-2008), Guy Morriss (158, 1973-83) and Jerry Sisemore (156, 1973-84).
