PHILADELPHIA EAGLES vs. TENNESSEE TITANS
December 4, 2022

EAGLES IMPROVE TO 11-1 WITH 35-10 WIN OVER TITANS

- Philadelphia, which owns the best record in the NFL this season, has improved to 11-1 for just the fourth time in franchise history, having previously done so in 1949, 1980 and 2004.
 - **Nick Sirianni** (20-9 regular-season record with the Eagles) is the sixth coach since the 1970 merger to start 11-1 or better in their first or second career year as a head coach, joining **Sean McVay** (2018 Rams), **Jim Caldwell** (2009 Colts), **Steve Mariucci** (1997 49ers), **George Seifert** (1990 49ers) and **Red Miller** (1977 Broncos).
 - **Jalen Hurts** (24 years, 119 days) is the fourth-youngest QB to start 11-1 or better since the 1970 merger, behind **Dan Marino** in 1984 (23 years, 64 days), **Dak Prescott** in 2016 (23 years, 125 days) and **Jared Goff** in 2018 (24 years, 49 days).
- Philadelphia (363 rushing on 11/27/22 vs. Green Bay; 386 passing on 12/4/22 vs. Tennessee) is the first NFL team to throw for 350+ yards after rushing for 350+ yards the previous week since the 1987 Los Angeles Raiders (356 rushing on 11/30/87; 360 passing on 12/6/87).
 - Overall, the Eagles produced 453 total yards (386 passing; 67 rushing), marking the second time this season that they registered 450+ total yards in consecutive games (also 9/11/22-9/19/22). Philadelphia is one of only three NFL teams to have at least 4 games with 450+ total yards this year, joining Kansas City (5) and Miami (4).
- The Eagles have scored 35+ points in back-to-back games for the first time since 11/5/17-11/19/17 (also 2). Philadelphia has totaled 35+ points in 4 games this year (most since doing so in 5 games in 2008), which is tied with Detroit for the most such performances in the NFL.

HURTS THROWS FOR 380 YARDS; COMBINES FOR 4 TDs

- **Jalen Hurts** completed 29-of-39 (74.4%) attempts for 380 yards (9.7 avg.), 3 TDs, 0 INTs and a 130.3 passer rating while also adding 12 yards with 1 TD on 5 carries (4 total TDs).
 - Hurts became the first player in Eagles history to produce 350+ passing yards, 3+ passing TDs, and 1+ rushing TD in a single game. In combining for 4 total TDs, Hurts set a new career high (29 total TDs through 12 games) (previously 26 TDs in 2021).
- For the season, Hurts has accounted for 2,940 yards, 20 TDs, 3 INTs and a 108.3 passer rating on 243-of-357 (68.1%) passing, in addition to 609 yards and 9 TDs on the ground.

'SWOLE BATMAN' & 'SKINNY BATMAN' EACH TOTAL 100+ YARDS

- **A.J. Brown** (119 yards, 2 TDs) and **DeVonta Smith** (102 yards, 1 TD) became the first Eagles duo to post 100+ receiving yards each since **Nelson Agholor** (116 yards, 1 TD) and **Zach Ertz** (110 yards, 2 TDs) accomplished the feat on 12/23/18 vs. Houston.
 - Brown, who finished the game with multiple 25+ yard receiving TDs (40 and 29 yards), leads the league with 8 receiving TDs dating back to Week 6. Overall, he has registered 950+ receiving yards and 9 TDs through the first 12 games of the season.
 - Smith tallied his 4th career performance with 100+ receiving yards.

DEFENSE LIMITS TENNESSEE TO JUST 209 YARDS & 10 POINTS

- Philadelphia allowed only 209 total yards (3.9 opponent yards per play) and 10 points (Eagles' 3rd game this season allowing 10-or-fewer points) in today's victory. **Derrick Henry**, who entered the game with 1,000+ rushing yards and 10 TDs, posted 30 yards on 11 carries (2.7 avg.).
 - Philadelphia's defense limited Tennessee to 4-of-14 (28.6%) on third downs, in addition to holding the Titans 0-of-2 in red zone opportunities.

- The Eagles combined for 6 sacks, gaining contributions from **Josh Sweat** (2.0), **Javon Hargrave** (1.0), **Brandon Graham** (1.0), **Fletcher Cox** (1.0) and **Haason Reddick** (1.0).
 - Philadelphia's 42 sacks (currently 2nd-most in the NFL this season) are tied for the team's most through 12 games since 1991, when the Eagles totaled 43 sacks.

COVEY RECORDS 105 PUNT RETURN YARDS

- **Britain Covey** finished the game with a career-high 105 punt return yards, which are the 2nd-most by any NFL player this season, behind New England's **Marcus Jones** (109 yards on 11/20/22 vs. N.Y. Jets). Covey averaged 17.5 yards per return on 6 attempts.
