PHILADELPHIA EAGLES vs. NEW YORK GIANTS
January 8, 2023

EAGLES CLINCH NO. 1 SEED, NFC EAST & FRANCHISE-RECORD 14 WINS

- Philadelphia secured the No. 1 seed in the NFC playoffs, captured its 10th NFC East division title under **Jeffrey Lurie**'s ownership (most by any NFC East team since 2001), and set a single-season franchise record with 14 regular-season wins with today's 22-16 victory.
 - This is the fifth time in franchise history that the Eagles clinched the top seed in the conference (also 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2017). *Philadelphia has now earned two No. 1 seeds over a five-year span with different head coach/QB combos each season.*
- With today's win over New York, **Nick Sirianni** became the fourth coach since the 1970 merger to win 14 games in their first or second career season as a head coach, joining **Jim Caldwell** (2009 Colts), **Mike Martz** (2001 Rams) and **George Seifert** (twice, 1989-90 49ers).
- **Jalen Hurts** finished the year with a 14-1 record (.933 winning percentage) as a starter.
 - At 24 years old, Hurts became the second youngest QB in NFL history to win 14 regular-season games, behind **Dan Marino** (23 years old) with Miami in 1984 (14-2).

PHILADELPHIA FINISHES WITH MULTIPLE TEAM SINGLE-SEASON RECORDS

- Philadelphia finished the season with a franchise-record 477 points (previously 474 in 2014), including club records in total TDs (59), scrimmage TDs (57) and rushing TDs (32).
 - The Eagles' 32 rushing TDs are tied for the 4th-most in NFL single-season history, trailing only the 1962 Packers (36), 1948 49ers (35) and 1976 Steelers (33). Philadelphia is the only team in NFL history to rush for 25+ TDs in consecutive seasons.
- Philadelphia established a single-season franchise record with 70 sacks this year. Only the 1984 Bears (72) and 1989 Vikings (71) recorded more QB takedowns in NFL history.
 - The Eagles are the only NFL team to have four different players – **Haason Reddick** (16.0), **Brandon Graham** (11.0), **Javon Hargrave** (11.0) and **Josh Sweat** (11.0) (all career highs for everyone) – record 10.0+ sacks in the same season.
- Philadelphia also finished with single-season team records in the following categories:
 - 45.9% third-down conversion rate (previously 45.7% in 2021) (since 1972)
 - 67.8% red zone TD efficiency (previously 66.7% in 2019) (since 1995)

A.J. BROWN BREAKS MIKE QUICK'S RECEIVING YARDS RECORD

- In his first season with the Eagles, **A.J. Brown** set a single-season franchise record with 1,496 receiving yards, eclipsing the previous mark owned by **Mike Quick** in 1983 (1,409).
 - Brown, who finished with 4 receptions for 95 yards, broke Quick's record with a 35-yard reception on Philadelphia's first play from scrimmage. He also hauled in a 37-yard reception on third-and-9 on the team's second series to set up a TD drive.

DEVONTA SMITH SETS EAGLES RECORD FOR RECEPTIONS BY WR

- **DeVonta Smith**, who produced 67 yards on a team-high 7 receptions, finished his second NFL season with 95 catches, which are the most by a WR in Eagles history. Overall, Smith's 95 receptions are 2nd on the Eagles' all-time list, trailing only **Zach Ertz** in 2018 (116).

EAGLES SPECIAL TEAMS STANDS OUT IN VICTORY

- **Jake Elliott** connected on a career-high 5 FGs (54, 52, 39, 32 and 22 yards) and combined for a career-high-tying 16 points (also 11/21/21 vs. New Orleans). He is the second player in team history to make two 50+ yard FGs in a game, joining **Paul McFadden** on 11/4/84 at Detroit.
 - Elliott, who owns the most 50+ yard FGs (20) in franchise history (including playoffs, has converted on 8 of his last 9 FG attempts from 50+ yards dating back to 2021.
- At the end of the first quarter, Philadelphia FG block unit stopped a fake FG attempt, with **Zech McPhearson** sacking Giants holder **Jamie Gillan** to set up the Eagles at the 40-yard line.
- **Nakobe Dean** recovered an onside kick by the Giants to open the third quarter.

BOSTON SCOTT'S CONTINUED SUCCESS VS. GIANTS

- **Boston Scott** gave the Eagles a 10-0 advantage in the first quarter with an 8-yard rushing TD, capping a 12-play, 80-yard scoring drive. Scott, who finished with a team-high 54 yards (6.0 avg.) and 1 TD, has scored 10 of his 17 career TDs against the Giants (9 rushing, 1 receiving).
