

POST-GAME NOTES PHILADELPHIA EAGLES vs. NEW YORK GIANTS January 21, 2023

EAGLES WIN 38-7, ADVANCE TO NFC TITLE GAME

- Philadelphia defeated New York, 38-7, and will now host the 2022 NFC Championship Game at Lincoln Financial Field against either the Dallas Cowboys or San Francisco 49ers.
 - The Eagles will appear in their seventh conference title game under **Jeffrey Lurie**'s ownership, marking the 2nd-most in the league since 2001 (New England 13).
- Philadelphia's 31-point win tied for the largest margin of victory in Eagles postseason history, joining the 38-7 defeat of the Minnesota Vikings in the 2017 NFC Championship Game.
 - o The 2017 NFC Championship Game was five years ago to the date.

HURTS RECORDS 3 TDs IN FIRST PLAYOFF VICTORY

- Jalen Hurts completed 16-of-24 (66.7%) attempts for 154 yards, 2 TDs, 0 INTs and a 112.2 passer rating, while also rushing for 34 yards and 1 TD on 9 attempts. Hurts threw TD passes to Dallas Goedert (16 yards) and DeVonta Smith (9 yards) during the first quarter.
 - Hurts' 112.2 passer rating was the 3rd-highest mark in franchise postseason history, trailing only Rodney Peete on 12/30/95 vs. Detroit (143.3) and Nick Foles on 1/21/18 vs. Minnesota during the 2017 NFC Championship Game (141.4).
- Hurts is the second QB in Eagles history to have 2+ passing TDs and 1+ rushing TD in a playoff game, joining **Donovan McNabb** on 12/31/00 vs. Tampa Bay and 1/19/02 at Chicago.

DOMINANT IN ALL THREE PHASES

- Philadelphia registered 268 rushing yards, averaging 6.1 yards per attempt on 44 carries.
 - The Eagles' 268 rushing yards were the 2nd-most in team playoff history, trailing only a 274-yard performance in the 1949 NFL Championship Game (12/18/49 at LAR). It also marked the most rushing yards by any NFL team in a postseason game since San Francisco had 285 yards vs. Green Bay in the 2019 NFC Championship Game.
 - Kenneth Gainwell's 121 total yards from scrimmage were the most by an Eagle
 in the postseason since Jeremy Maclin's 146 yards against Dallas (1/9/10). In
 total, he finished with 112 rushing yards and 1 TD with 9 receiving yards.
 - Miles Sanders rushed for 90 yards on 17 attempts (5.3 avg.).
 - Including playoffs, Boston Scott has scored in each of his 9 career games against the Giants (11 of his 18 career TDs have been vs. New York).
- Philadelphia converted 71.4% (10-of-14) of its third-down opportunities, tying a team single-game postseason record (also 10-of-14 on third down in the 2017 NFC Championship Game).
 - The Eagles' 26 first downs (17 rushing, 8 passing, 1 penalty) were the 2nd-most in team playoff history, behind the 2017 NFC Championship Game vs. Minnesota (27).
- Defensively, Philadelphia limited New York to just 227 total yards. The Giants recorded 118
 rushing yards and only 109 net passing yards (sacked 5 times for a loss of 26 yards). The Eagles
 rushed for 41 more yards than the Giants had accumulated offensively the entire game.
 - The Eagles' first six defensive series resulted in the following outcomes turnover on downs and an interception followed by four consecutive three-and-out drives.
 - On New York's first drive, Haason Reddick registered his first 1.5 career playoff sacks to move the Giants out of FG range and then fail on fourth-and-8.
 - Reddick now has 17.5 sacks in 18 games (including playoffs).
 - James Bradberry recorded his first career postseason takeaway when he picked off Giants QB Daniel Jones at the end of the first quarter.

- Philadelphia held a 28-0 advantage through the first two quarters.
 Brett Kern landed 3 punts inside the 20-yard line (9, 15, and 7), including 2 inside the 10-yard line. He also booted a season-long 56-yard punt during the third quarter.
