

POST-GAME NOTES PHILADELPHIA EAGLES vs. PITTSBURGH STEELERS October 30, 2022

EAGLES IMPROVE TO 7-0 WITH 35-13 VICTORY

- Philadelphia, which is the only undefeated team in the NFL, has produced a 7-0 record for just the second time in franchise history, having previously done so in 2004 under **Andy Reid**.
 - Nick Sirianni is the first head coach to lead the Eagles to a 7-0 start within their first two seasons with the team. He is also the first NFL head coach to start 6-0 in their first or second career year as a head coach since Sean McVay in 2018 (Rams, 8-0).
- Philadelphia's 7-game winning streak is the longest of the Nick Sirianni era. It is also the Eagles' best stretch since capturing a team-record-tying 9 consecutive wins in 2017.
 - Dating back to last season, Jalen Hurts has won 10 straight regular-season starts, which
 is the longest such streak in franchise history (longest active streak in the NFL).

HURTS PRODUCES CAREER-HIGH 4 PASSING TDs

- **Jalen Hurts** completed 19-of-28 (67.9%) attempts for 285 yards, 4 TDs (career high), 0 INTs and a 140.6 passer rating (career high). He became the first Eagle to throw for 4 TDs, 0 INTs and a 125.0+ passer rating since **Nick Foles**' 7-TD performance on 11/3/13 at Oakland.
 - Each of Hurts' career-high 4 passing TDs went for 25+ yards. According to *Elias Sports*,
 Hurts became the first Eagles QB to record four 25+ yard TD passes in a game since
 Norm Snead on 9/28/69 vs. Pittsburgh. Overall, he became the first NFL QB to
 accomplish the feat since Patrick Mahomes on 11/1/20 vs. N.Y. Jets.
 - Hurts completed TD passes of 39 (first quarter), 27 and 29 (second quarter) yards to A.J. Brown, as well as 34 yards (third quarter) to Zach Pascal.
 - Hurts' career-high 140.6 passer rating was the highest by an Eagles QB since Nick Foles' 141.4 mark in the 2017 NFC Championship Game (1/21/18 vs. Minnesota). It is the highest by an Eagles QB in a regular-season contests since Foles' perfect 158.3 rating during his 7-TD game against the Raiders on 11/3/13.

BROWN FINISHES WITH CAREER HIGHS IN TDs & YARDS

- **A.J. Brown** hauled in 6 passes for 156 yards (career high) and 3 TDs (career high). He became the first Eagle to record 650+ receiving yards (659) and 5+ TDs (5) in the first 7 games of a season since **Terrell Owens** during the 2005 campaign (763 yards, 6 TDs).
 - Brown, who totaled 4 receptions of 25+ yards (39, 27, 29 and 43), became the first Eagle to produce 3 receiving TDs of 25+ yards in a game since Ben Hawkins on 9/28/69 vs. Pittsburgh. His 3 TDs were the most since Riley Cooper on 11/3/13 at Oakland.
 - Brown's 39-yard TD reception in the first quarter was his longest score since hauling in a 57-yarder on 10/31/21 at Indianapolis with Tennessee.
 - Brown became the first NFL player to have 3 TD catches of 25+ yards since Breshad Perriman on 12/15/19 at Detroit with Tampa Bay. The last NFL player to do so in the first half of a game was Drew Bennett on 12/5/04 at Indianapolis with Tennessee.

KEY DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Philadelphia combined for 6.0 sacks in today's victory, bringing its season total to 23.0, which marks the Eagles' most through 7 games since the 2009 campaign (also 23.0).
- **Javon Hargrave** registered a career-high-tying 2.0 sacks against his former team, including a strip sack against Steelers QB **Kenny Pickett** in the fourth quarter. His FF marked the team's 6th strip sack of the season, which is currently tied with Denver for the most in the league.

- **C.J. Gardner-Johnson** finished the game with 8 tackles (7 solo), 1.0 sack and 1 INT. Gardner-Johnson has recorded an INT in 3 consecutive games (career-high 2 INTs in Week 6 vs. Dallas), which is the longest streak by an Eagle since **Rodney McLeod** from 10/29/17-11/19/17.
- Haason Reddick, Milton Williams and Marlon Tuipulotu also notched sacks.

MORE FROM THE GAME

- **Miles Sanders** made it a 35-13 score in the fourth quarter when he ran it in from the 11-yard line. Sanders' 5 rushing TDs this season are just 1 TD shy of his career high set in 2020 (6 TDs).
- **Dallas Goedert** had 3 catches for 30 yards on third downs in today's victory. Overall, he finished the game with 6 receptions for 64 yards. The Eagles converted 7 of 12 third downs.
