

Eric Dickerson enters his third overall year with the Philadelphia Eagles. He was named an offensive quality control coach during the 2022 offseason after originally joining the team as a defensive assistant in 2021.

In 2022, Dickerson assisted a record-breaking offense that helped the team reach Super Bowl LVII after its 14-3 campaign. In total, the Eagles established single-season team marks in points (477), total touchdowns (59), scrimmage touchdowns (57), rushing touchdowns (32, tied for fourth in NFL history), total first downs (385), third-down success rate (45.9 pct.), fourth-down conversions (22) and red zone touchdown efficiency (67.8 pct.).

During the 2021 season, Dickerson contributed to a defensive unit that surrendered the fifth-fewest explosive plays (117) in the NFL, while ranking 10th in opponent yards per game (328.8). Philadelphia also tied for the second-most defensive touchdowns (five) in the league.

Dickerson first joined the Eagles during training camp in 2021 as a part of the NFL's Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship Program.

Prior to coming to Philadelphia, Dickerson spent three seasons at Duke as a football analyst (2018-20), working on special teams as well as with the wide receivers and tight ends on offense. In that span, the Blue Devils registered top-three finishes in the ACC in kickoff return yards and punt return yards during the 2019 and 2020 campaigns. Additionally, Duke produced a school single-season record in touchdown passes (31) in 2018.

Under Dickerson's tutelage, **Noah Gray** (fifth-round pick by the Kansas City Chiefs in 2021) earned *Walter Camp* second-team All-America honors in 2019 after totaling the second-most catches (51) by a tight end in program history. During the 2018 season, **Davis Koppenhaver** matched the Blue Devils' single-season record for touchdowns (seven) by a tight end.

Dickerson started his career in 2017 at his alma mater, South Carolina State, where he coached the tight ends and fullbacks.

A 2016 graduate of South Carolina State with a political science degree, Dickerson was a four-year starter and two-year captain on the offensive line, helping the Bulldogs to conference championships in 2013 and 2014.
