POST-GAME NOTES

- **Dallas Goedert** led the Eagles with a career-high-tying 2 scrimmage TDs, registering a 1-yard rushing TD during the first quarter and a 9-yard TD reception during the second quarter.
 - Goedert is the sixth TE in NFL history to produce a rushing TD and receiving TD in the same game (only TE to do so in the playoffs), joining **Harold Fannin** (2025 with Cleveland), **Trey Burton** (2020 with Indianapolis), **Eric Ebron** (2018 with Indianapolis), **Coby Fleener** (2016 with New Orleans) and **Rob Gronkowski** (2011 with New England).
 - Goedert is the first TE in NFL history to rush for a TD in the playoffs.
 - Goedert is just the second Eagle to record a rushing TD and receiving TD during the same playoff game since **Ricky Watters** on 12/30/95 vs. Detroit.
 - Goedert's 9-yard TD capped a 16-play, 94-yard scoring drive (9:00). It was the Eagles' longest playoff scoring drive in terms of plays and yards since at least 2001.
- **Saquon Barkley** is now the Eagles' all-time leading rusher in the playoffs with 605 yards, breaking a record that was previously held by **Brian Westbrook** (591, 2002-09). Barkley finished tonight's contest with a team-leading 106 yards on 26 carries and added 25 yards on 3 receptions.
 - Barkley has posted 100+ rushing yards in four of his last five playoff games.
 - Barkley's four postseason performances with 100+ rushing yards are the most in franchise history (next closest is **Brian Westbrook** with two across the 2002-09 seasons).
- **Quinnyon Mitchell** registered a career-high 2 INTs to bring his career total to 4 INTs – all from the postseason. He is the first Eagle to produce 4 playoff INTs in their first two NFL seasons.
 - Mitchell is only the fifth NFL player since at least 1994 to record 2+ INTs and 1+ FF in a playoff game, joining **Derek Stingley** (2024 with Houston), **Sam Shields** (2010 with Green Bay), **Aeneas Williams** (2001 with St. Louis) and **Tory James** (2000 with Oakland).
 - Mitchell also became the first Eagle to produce 2+ INTs in a postseason game since **Damon Moore** on 1/12/02 vs. Tampa Bay.
