EAGLES SHUT OUT RAIDERS, 31-0, TO IMPROVE TO 9-5

- Philadelphia improved to 9-5 (.643) with today's 31-0 victory vs. Las Vegas. The Eagles have secured their fifth consecutive winning season with **Nick Sirianni** at the helm - the longest streak to start a career in franchise history – and their 21st winning campaign under **Jeffrey Lurie**.
 - Sirianni is the 10th head coach since 1970 to start their career with five straight winning seasons, joining **Bill Cowher**, **John Harbaugh**, **Mike Holmgren**, **Chuck Knox**, **Sean McVay**, **George Seifert**, **Mike Sherman**, **Mike Smith** and **Mike Tomlin** (*Elias*).
 - Since Lurie's first full year of ownership, Philadelphia is one of only four teams with 21+ winning seasons, joining Green Bay (24), New England (24) and Pittsburgh (23).
- The Eagles own a 15-2 (.882) record in their last 17 games at Lincoln Financial Field (including playoffs). That is the club's best 17-game stretch in the history of the venue (since 2003).
- Philadelphia registered a shutout for the first time since 12/30/18 at Washington (W, 24-0). It was the largest margin of victory by the Eagles in a shutout since 12/16/90 vs. Green Bay (W, 31-0).
- Philadelphia limited Las Vegas to 75 total yards, marking the fewest yards allowed by an NFL team since Cleveland on 11/5/23 vs. Arizona (58 yards). The Raiders' 75 total yards were the fewest surrendered by an Eagles defense since 12/4/55 vs. Chicago Cardinals (49 yards).
- Philadelphia's 312-yard margin vs. Las Vegas marked the 3rd-best figure by a team this season, behind Denver in Week 4 vs. Cincinnati (+353) and Kansas City in Week 7 vs. Las Vegas (+339). The Eagles' +312 yard margin represented their most in a game since 9/7/08 vs. St. Louis (+356).

NOTABLE PERFORMANCES IN EAGLES VICTORY

- **Jalen Hurts** became the first QB in Eagles history to record multiple games with a 150+ passer rating (154.9) and 80%+ completion percentage (80.0%) in the same season. He previously accomplished the feat in Week 7 at Minnesota (158.3 rating and 82.6% percentage).
 - Hurts is tied with **Josh Allen** and **Drake Maye** for the most 25+ yard passing TDs (9) in the league this season, tying for the 2nd-highest such total of his career (12 in 2022).
- **Dallas Goedert**, who led the team with 70 receiving yards and 2 TDs, became the fifth player in franchise history to reach 400+ career receptions, joining **Harold Carmichael** (589, 1971-83), **Zach Ertz** (579, 2013-21), **Pete Retzlaff** (452, 1956-66) and **Brian Westbrook** (426, 2002-09).

- With his fourth career game with 2+ TDs, Goedert has now produced the 2nd-most receiving TDs (9) by a TE in Eagles history, behind Pete Retzlaff in 1965 (10).
 - Goedert's three games with 2+ receiving TDs are tied for the 3rd-most by an Eagle in a season, behind **Mike Quick** (4 in 1987) and **Harold Carmichael** (4 in 1979).
- **Brandon Graham** logged his 12th career game with 2.0+ sacks (last: 1/1/23 vs. New Orleans).
 - Graham (37 years-255 days) became the oldest player in Eagles history to register a sack in a game (previously **Richard Dent** at 37 years-1 day on 12/14/97 at Atlanta).
 - Graham also became the oldest NFL player to produce multiple sacks in the first half of a game since **Bruce Smith** on 11/28/02 at Dallas with Washington (39 years-163 days).
- **Zack Baun** picked off Raiders QB **Kenny Pickett** during the third quarter, which gave him career highs in both takeaways (3) and INTs (2). It was his first INT since Week 3 vs. L.A. Rams.
 - Baun is the only NFL player with 100+ tackles, 3.0+ sacks and 3+ takeaways this year.
 - The Eagles have recorded five consecutive games with an INT dating back to Week 11. That is the club's longest streak since doing so in six straight games in 2022.
