### RAMS TRAVEL TO PHILLY

Woodland Hills, Calif. – The Los Angeles Rams will head to Philadelphia in a battle between two undefeated teams. The Rams can begin 3-0 for the fourth time since head coach Sean McVay was hired in 2017 (2018-19, 2021).

The Rams defeated the Titans 33-19 last Sunday and improved to 2-0 to start the season.

Matthew Stafford surpassed 15,000 passing yards as a Ram, making him the fifth quarterback in NFL history to pass for 15,000 yards on multiple teams (DET and LAR). Stafford completed 23-of-33 passes for 298 yards and two touchdowns. WR Davante Adams caught six passes for 106 yards and a touchdown. WR Puka Nacua had eight receptions for 91 yards and a 45-yard rushing touchdown.

On the defensive side, OLB Byron Young registered five total tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble. Young now has recorded a sack in back-to-back games to start the season. S Kam Curl totaled seven tackles and two tackles for loss, including his first sack of the season. The Rams defense sacked Cam Ward five times with four different players registering a sack.

The Rams will face off against the Eagles for the 46th time in franchise history this Sunday. The two teams last played on January 19, 2025 in the NFC Divisional Round when the Rams lost 28-22. The series stands at 25-20-1 in favor of the Eagles.

## 2025 SEASON TOP PERFORMERS



## GAME NOTES

- **PASSING:** After two games this season, **QB Matthew Stafford** has completed 44-of-62 passes for 543 yards and three touchdowns. Stafford ranks sixth in the NFL in passing yards (543), seventh in passer rating (107.1) and eighth in completion percentage (71.0%).
- **RUSHING:** **RB Blake Corum** scored his first career rushing touchdown and finished the game with five rushes for 44 yards. **RB Kyren Williams** added 66 yards to his season total in Week 2 and ranks 13th in the NFL in rushing yards (132). **WR Puka Nacua** scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 45-yard rush.
- **RECEIVING:** **WR Davante Adams** caught six passes for 106 yards and his first touchdown of the season. Adams ranks 13th in the NFL in receiving yards (157) through the first two weeks. **WR Puka Nacua** registered 136 yards of total offense, including 91 receiving yards on eight receptions. Nacua currently leads the NFL in receptions (18) and is fourth in receiving yards (221) through two weeks.
- **BLOCKING:** In Week Two, **OL Kevin Dotson** played 59 offensive snaps (34 pass blocking snaps) and allowed zero sacks, zero quarterback hits and only three pressures. Dotson has not allowed a sack in 12 consecutive regular season games, dating back to last season.
- **DEFENSIVE:** In Week Two, **OLB Byron Young** recorded five total tackles with 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble. Young has now recorded sacks in back-to-back games to start the season and ranks tied for fourth in the NFL with 3.0. **S Kam Curl** registered seven total tackles and two tackles for loss, including his first sack of the season.

RB **Kyren Williams** passed Steven Jackson (2,651) and Marshall Faulk (2,679) for rushing yards through a player's first 40 games in franchise history (2,714).

WR **Puka Nacua** scored his first touchdown of the season on 45-yard rush which was the longest rushing touchdown for the Rams since Week 15 of the 2017 season. Nacua also reached 200 career receptions.

WR **Davante Adams** passed Michael Irvin (11,904) in career receiving yards and moved to 32nd in NFL history with 12,001. Adams tied Antonio Brown, Calvin Johnson, Brandon Marshall and Jimmy Smith (46) for the 11th-most 100+ yard receiving games in NFL history.

CB **Darious Williams** passed Fakhir Brown and James Laurinaitis (34) to move into 10th place in franchise history for passes defended (35).

**Les Snead and Sean McVay** moved to 17th-most wins by a General Manager and Head Coach duo in NFL history.

## MCVAY HITS 100

Sean McVay coached his 100th career regular season game (in Week 2, 2023). He had a record of 61-39 and the fifth-highest winning percentage amongst active head coaches in their first 100 regular season games.

## THE RAMS G.O.A.T. COACH

Last season, Sean McVay became the winningest head coach in franchise history (including postseason) with 80 wins, passing John Robinson (79 wins). He accomplished the feat during his eighth season, while Robinson needed nine seasons to become the winningest coach for the Rams.

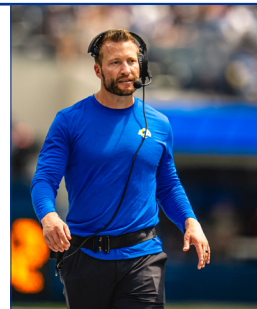
In Week 13 of last season, McVay recorded his 76th regular season win, passing John Robinson for the most by a Head Coach in franchise history.

## COACH 'EM UP

Rams Head Coach Sean McVay took over a team that was coming off of a 4-12 season and ranked 32nd in scoring. McVay helped transform it into the No. 1 scoring team in the league and helped secure the franchise's first NFC West title since 2003.



Due to his excellent first season and his instrumental part in revamping the Rams offense, McVay was chosen as the Associated Press Coach of the Year for 2017. He is the fourth head coach in franchise history to achieve this honor.

The last Rams head coach to win the award was Dick Vermeil in 1999. Vermeil helped guide the Rams to a 13-3 record, winning the NFC West and culminating with the franchise's lone Super Bowl victory over the Titans, 23-16, in Super Bowl XXXIV. Chuck Knox was the only other rookie head coach in franchise history to win the award.

McVay became the youngest coach in NFL history to win the Associated Press Coach of the Year award. McVay was 31 years old during the team's final game of the season. Previously, Don Shula (34 years old) was the youngest coach to win the award.

## RECORDS KNOW NO AGE

Sean McVay, who turned 39 in January, has an 81-52 regular-season record as an NFL head coach. That is the third-most wins by a coach before turning 40 in NFL history, behind only Curly Lambeau (130) and George Halas (107).

## WINNING AGAINST THE ODDS

After starting 1-4 last season, the Rams went on to win nine of their following 11 games and secured their first division title in Week 17. They became just the 14th team in NFL history to make the playoffs after starting the season 1-4.

The Rams won five consecutive games (Weeks 13-17) for the first time since 2021 (Weeks 13-17) and also won five consecutive road games for the first time in season since 2001 (eight consecutive games). This season marked the fifth time in franchise history that the team had a road winning streak of at least five games (1969, 1975, 1988, and 2001).

The Rams became the first team in NFL history to enter their bye week with a losing record and make the playoffs in consecutive seasons.

Under Head Coach Sean McVay, the Rams have posted a winning record in seven of his eight seasons, the most winning seasons by a Head Coach in franchise history.



## DIVISION DOMINANCE

In 2024, the Rams won the NFC West for the fourth time in eight seasons under Sean McVay (2017, 2018, 2021, 2024) and for the first time since 2021. Only Chuck Knox (five) has more division titles as the Rams head coach.

Last season marked McVay's sixth playoff berth, tied with John Robinson for the most by a head coach in franchise history.

## DECEMBER TO REMEMBER

Since 2021, no team in the NFL has a better win percentage in the month of December than the Rams (.789 percent). The Rams have won 15 of 19 games played and outscored opponents 505-377, a point differential of 128, the second-highest in the NFL behind the Buffalo Bills (149).

## DYNAMIC DUO

Head Coach Sean McVay and General Manager Les Snead currently rank third amongst active Head Coach and General Manager duos for wins in the NFL with **90**. Their 90 wins together are 18th all-time among duos in NFL history.

Among active duos, the Rams rank third in the NFL and first among NFC duos.

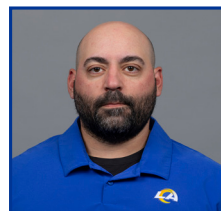

# RAMS TEAM NOTES



## I'M HONORED

In 2024, OLB Jared Verse was named NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month for his performance in the month of September. He was also nominated for Pepsi Rookie of the Week after his Week 2 performance. S Kamren Kinchens became the first rookie defensive back to win the Defensive Player of the Week award multiple times during his first season in the NFL. DE Braden Fiske was named the NFL Defensive Rookie of the month for the month of November.

CB Cobie Durant was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week after his performance in Week 7 against Las Vegas. He became the first defensive back to record an interception, sack and forced fumble in a game last season. This was Durant's first-career Player of the Week award and he became the third Rams defensive back to win Defensive Player of the Week in the past 10 seasons. He also became the second player from South Carolina State to win a Player of the Week award since 2000, joining Darius Leonard (four-time winner).

In 2023, WR Puka Nacua was named Offensive Rookie Player of the Month for December/January and NT Kobie Turner was named Defensive Rookie Player of the Month for December/January.

Last season RB Kyren Williams was nominated for FedEx Ground Player of the Week after a dominating three touchdown performance in Week 3. Last season, he was nominated in Week 6, Week 12, Week 14, and Week 16. He won the Nickelodeon NVP award after another dominating performance in Week 17.

WR Puka Nacua won NFC Offensive Player of the Week after his performance in Week 16.

QB Matthew Stafford was nominated for FedEx Air Player of the Week in Week 16.

WR Puka Nacua was nominated for Pepsi Zero Sugar NFL Rookie of the Week in four out of the seven games of the 2023 season. He won in Week 2, Week 4, Week 7, Week 13, and Week 16.

NT Kobie Turner was nominated for Pepsi Sugar NFL Rookie of the Week after his career-high performance in Week 12 and Week 17.

OLB Byron Young won the Pepsi Zero Sugar NFL Rookie of the Week after his dominating performance in Week 6. He was also nominated in Week 9.

ILB Nate Landman kicked off the 2025 season with 10 tackles and a game saving forced fumble in the fourth quarter of Week 1. This performance earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week.

## SUCCESS IN THE WEST

Under Head Coach Sean McVay, the Rams are **26-16** in the regular season against NFC West opponents. The Rams finished 6-0 in the NFC West during the 2018 season. The last time an NFC West team accomplished the feat was the Cardinals in 2008. It marked the first time the Rams swept the NFC West since 1999.

The Rams are 14-7 in NFC West road contests since the start of the 2017 season. The most recent road win was against the San Francisco 49ers, 12-6, at Levi's Stadium in Week 15. The Rams' record in the NFC West last season was 5-1, sweeping the Seahawks and the Cardinals.

The Rams overcame a 14-point deficit in Week 3 to defeat San Francisco which was the second-largest comeback win over the 49ers in franchise history. It was also McVay's first win when trailing by 14+ points at any time during a game.

Coach Sean McVay has 14 victories over the Arizona Cardinals since 2017, the most for any coach against an NFC opponent during that span.

The Rams outscored their divisional opponents, 171-112, during the 2017 season, which was a 59-point differential. It was the highest positive point differential in the division for the Rams since 2001, when the Rams outscored their divisional opponents, 274-160, for a 114-point differential. The 2001 Rams played in a five team division and therefore had eight divisional games that season.

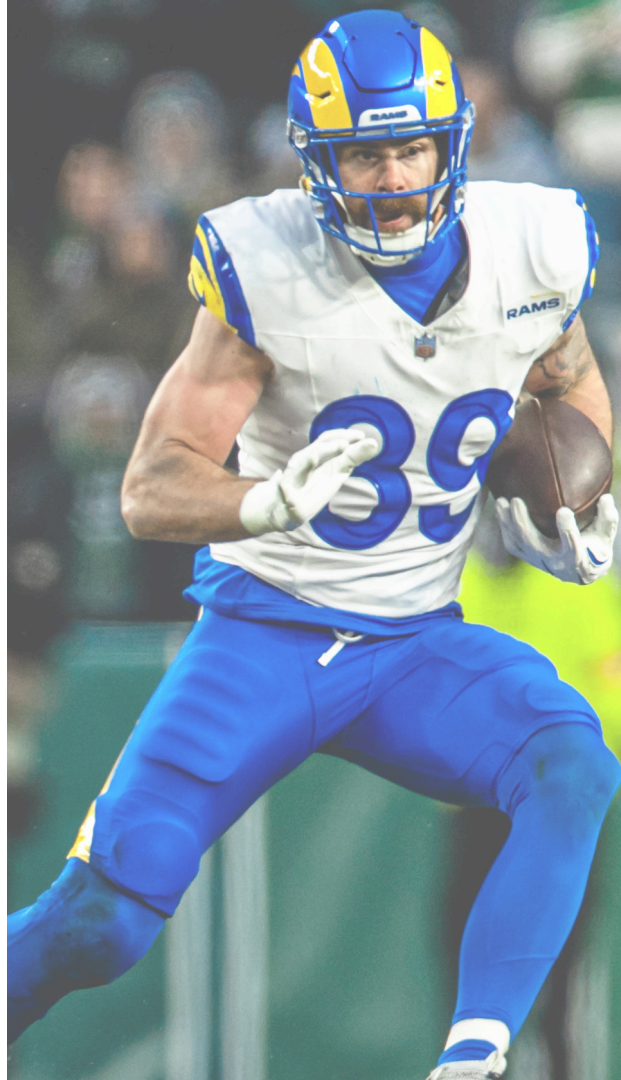

### BIG RIG HIGS

Higbee became only the fifth tight end to record multiple touchdown receptions in every season since 2018, joining Travis Kelce, George Kittle, Mark Andrews and Dallas Goedert. Last season he recorded his 29th career game with at least five receptions, marking the 10th most such games by a tight end since entering the league in 2016.





### ROB LEADS THE WAY

**OT Rob Havenstein** has been a staple of the Rams offensive line since he was drafted in 2015. He has started every game that he has appeared in and is the only player on the roster who was with the team before moving back home to Los Angeles in 2016.

Rob Havenstein is 9th in franchise history in career starts (143).

Last season, he allowed just 12 hurries, five quarterback hits, and three sacks.





# RAMS OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES



## HOLD THE LINE

Last season, the **Los Angeles Rams offensive line** allowed 31 sacks, the sixth-best mark across the league. From Weeks 7-17, they allowed just 12 sacks and didn't allow a sack in seven of those 11 games (Week 8,9,11,14,15,16,17). The offensive line did not allow a sack in four consecutive weeks (Week 14-17), tied for the longest streak in franchise history and the first time they've accomplished the feat since 2013.

After dealing with a significant amount of injuries on the offensive line early in the season, they bounced back and their current five starters (A. Jackson, Avila, Limmer, Dotson and Havenstein) allowed a combined 14 sacks and 68 pressures. In Week 14, the Rams offensive line held the Bills to a 22% pressure rate, the Bills lowest pressure rate last season.

The Rams finished the season sixth in sacks allowed (31). The Rams are carrying this success over into the 2025 season.

## ON THE DOT(SON)

Since the Rams bye week in Week 6 last season, Dotson allowed just one sack, four quarterback hits, five hurries and 10 pressures.

In his final four games of the regular season, Dotson allowed just one quarterback hit, three hurries and three pressures.

According to PFF, he posted his two best games of the season in Weeks 13 and 15. His 90.9 offensive grade in Week 13 was his best grade last season and the highest among offensive guards. His 89.8 pass blocking grade in Week 12 was his highest last season. His 90.8 run blocking grade in Week 15 was his highest of the season. Dotson posted an offensive grade of 86 or higher and a run blocking grade of 83 or higher in five of the last seven weeks of the regular season.



## CLEAN FOOTBALL

The Rams offensive line finished last season first in penalties per game (5.35).

## LIMITING SACKS

The Rams offensive line finished last season sixth in quarterback sack rate (5.3%). Stafford took just two sacks in the Rams last eight wins.

## KEEPING STAFFORD CLEAN

Among tackles who played over 600 offensive snaps in 2024, OL Rob Havenstein tied for fifth in hurries allowed (13) and OL Alaric Jackson tied for 13th (15). They are one of two tackle duos (Philadelphia) to be ranked in the top-13.

KY(RUN) WILLIAMS

Last season, RB Kyren Williams became the first-ever Rams player with multiple touchdowns in the first two games of a season. In Week 6, Williams rushed for 100+ yards for the second time in three weeks and the second time of his career. He became the first Rams' running back to rush for 150+ yards since Cam Akers in Week 14 of 2020 against the Patriots. In Week 6 against the Cardinals, of his 158 rushing yards, 154 yards were in the second half, becoming the first Rams player since Marshall Faulk in 2001 to have at least 150 rushing yards in a half, according to ESPN Stats and Information.

Williams became the first Rams player with 200 scrimmage yards and two touchdowns in a game since Todd Gurley in 2018. He also was just the fourth player in Rams history with 100+ rushing yards and two receiving touchdowns in a game, joining Todd Gurley (2017), Cleveland Gary (1992), and Eric Dickerson (1983). In Week 16 of 2023 against the Saints, he recorded the sixth 100+ yard rushing game of his career and of the season, tying Todd Gurley who had six 100+ yard rushing contests in 2018. Williams recorded 100+ yards rushing in three consecutive games for the first time in his career. With 47 yards rushing in the first half, he hit the 1,000-yard rushing mark on the season and for the first time in his career. He became the first Rams running back to do so since Todd Gurley in 2018.

Last season in Week 11, Williams surpassed 2,000 rushing yards in his career. He is the 22nd player in franchise history to accomplish the feat and the first since Todd Gurley II in 2017. He has rushed for at least 60 yards in each of the Rams' last eight games, matching Todd Gurley II (2018) for the longest such streak in the last 15 years.

Williams recorded his 14th rushing touchdown of the season, tied for the most in the NFL. He is the sixth Rams running back to record 14 rushing touchdowns in a season and the first since Todd Gurley in 2018. Williams joined Marshall Faulk (18 in 2000) and Todd Gurley II (17 in 2018) as the only Rams players since 2000 to record 14 rushing touchdowns in a season. It was also his 14th consecutive game with at least 50 rushing yards, tied for the second-longest streak in a single season in franchise history. Eric Dickerson accomplished the feat in all 16 games of the 1986 season and Steven Jackson did so in the first 14 games of the 2010 season.

Williams has notched 32 scrimmage touchdowns since the start of 2023, tied for the most during that time span.

KY(RUNNING) UP THE RANKS

Williams finished last season ranked second in rushing first downs (85), tied for fifth in rushing touchdowns (14), seventh in rushing yards (1,299), and 12th in rushes per touchdown (22.57). Since entering the league in 2022, Williams recorded eight games with two-or-more scrimmage touchdowns, tied for the third-most across the NFL, trailing Derrick Henry (10), Jalen Hurts (10), and Saquon Barkley (nine).

Williams scored a rushing touchdown in each of the first six games of the season, becoming the first Rams running back to do so since Greg Bell in 1988. He also became only the fourth running back since 2000 to accomplish the feat, joining LaDainian Tomlinson (2005), Dalvin Cook (2020) and Derrick Henry (2024). He now has 2,000+ scrimmage yards and 20+ scrimmage touchdowns through 28 career games. The only other Rams player since 1967 to achieve those marks in 28-or-fewer games was Eric Dickerson (14 games).

## CAN'T STOP KYREN

Williams scored a touchdown for a ninth-consecutive game in Week 7 last season, the longest streak across the NFL since 2022 (Ezekiel Elliott). He tied Shaun Alexander (2005) and Ezekiel Elliott (2022) for the fourth-longest streak of games with a rushing touchdown since 2000.

The only Rams players since 2000 to score a rushing touchdown in 4+ consecutive games are Steven Jackson (four times), Marshall Faulk (three times), Todd Gurley II (twice), Trung Candidate (once) and Kyren Williams (once).

In Week 7, he recorded his fifth game since last season with at least 50 rushing yards and multiple rushing touchdowns, tied for the most in the NFL over that span (Raheem Mostert).

## CREATING A RAMS LEGACY

In 2023, Kyren Williams scored 92 points en route to leading the team in scoring for the 2024 season. He is the first non-kicker to lead the Rams in scoring since 2018 (Todd Gurley) and the third skill-position player since 2000 to lead the way joining RBs Todd Gurley and Marshall Faulk.

Through Week 14 in 2024, Williams was one of only two position players (Jets RB Breece Hall) across the NFL to lead his team in points scored with 84.

## SOUND THE SIREN FOR KYREN

He had 2,000+ scrimmage yards and 20+ scrimmage touchdowns through 28 career games. The only other Rams player since 1967 to achieve those marks in 28-or-fewer games was Eric Dickerson (14 games). Williams scored a rushing touchdown in each of the first six games of the season, becoming the first Rams running back to do so since Greg Bell in 1988. He also became only the fourth running back since 2000 to accomplish the feat, joining LaDainian Tomlinson (2005), Dalvin Cook (2020) and Derrick Henry (2024).

### IN HISTORIC COMPANY

During the 2023 season, **QB Matthew Stafford** passed Peyton Manning for the most passing yards by a player in his first 200 regular season games (52,723 yards in 193 games).

He has accumulated 58,847 regular season passing yards over his illustrious 14-year career, which ranks 10th most all-time. He is one spot ahead of former Giants QB Eli Manning (57,023) and sits behind Jets Quarterback Aaron Rodgers (61,313).

His 372 passing touchdowns rank tied for 10th all-time with Eli Manning and are more than Warren Moon (291), John Elway (300) and other Hall of Famers like Johnny Unitas (290) and Joe Montana (273). He also ranks second among active quarterbacks.

After Week 3 in 2024, Stafford moved into 10th place on the NFL's all-time completed passes leaderboard, passing QB Eli Manning (4,895). He finished the 2023 regular season with a completion rate above 60%, making that his 10th consecutive season.

Stafford was the third QB to win a Super Bowl in the first season with team. Trent Dilfer was the first in 2000 and Tom Brady the second in 2020.

Additionally, he ranks second in most passing yards per game in NFL history in a minimum of 100 games (271.8). He sits behind Drew Brees (280) and above Peyton Manning (270.5).

### FASTEST TO 60K

In his first 200 career regular season and playoff games, **QB Matthew Stafford** accumulated 54,819 passing yards. He was the fastest QB to reach 50,000 passing yards in NFL history. One other active QB has reached this threshold. Stafford ranks second amongst active QBs in passing yards (according to TruMedia).

### ONE OF A KIND

Nacua (2,077) surpassed 2,000 scrimmage yards in his 23rd career game. He became the fifth wide receiver in NFL history to reach at least 2,000 scrimmage yards in 23 games-or-fewer, joining Charley Taylor (20), Bill Groman (21), Odell Beckham Jr. (21) and Charlie Hennigan (22). He is also the fifth Rams player and first wide receiver to reach 2,000 career scrimmage yards in 23 games-or-fewer.

In his 25th game, he became the second player in NFL history to record at least 150 receptions, 2,000 receiving yards, and nine receiving touchdowns in his first 25 career games, joining Odell Beckham Jr.

In 2023, he joined Hall of Famers Jerry Rice (twice) and Lance Alworth (1964) as the only wide receivers with at least 160 receiving yards, one receiving touchdown and one rushing touchdown in a single game.

**S Quentin Lake** became the fourth Rams defensive back in franchise history to record 10+ tackles in consecutive games, joining Craig Dahl (2010), T.J. McDonald (2014) and John Johnson III (2018). He also became the first Rams player to accomplish the feat in the first two weeks to start a season. Lake is the first Rams defensive back to lead the team in total tackles in consecutive games to start the season since Adam Archuleta did so in 2002.

He recorded nine tackles against the Raiders in Week 7 bringing his season total to 52, the most by a Rams defensive back through the first six games of a season. It was his sixth straight game with six-or-more tackles, the second-longest streak across the NFL in 2024 among defensive backs.

In Week 11, he tied a single-game career-high with 11 tackles. It was his fourth game with 10+ tackles last season. Lake (four games) now has the third-most games among Rams defensive backs with 10+ tackles, trailing John Johnson III (nine) and Taylor Rapp (seven).

In Week 16, Lake became the 11th Rams defensive back to record 100 tackles in a season and the first since Jordan Fuller in 2021. He is the second Rams defensive back to record 100 tackles in their first 15 games of a season, joining Taylor Rapp (2019). Lake finished the season ranked sixth in total tackles (111) among defensive backs. His 111 tackles are the fifth-most by a defensive back in franchise history.

He played 100% of the Rams defensive snaps through the first 17 weeks of the season, one of three defenders (Panthers S Xavier Woods and Colts LB Zaire Franklin) in the NFL to accomplish the feat last season.



## BALL HAWKS

The Rams were one of five teams (Texans, Lions, Steelers, Eagles) to have multiple players (S Jaylen McCollough and Kamren Kinchens) rank in the top-10 in interceptions last season. They were also the only team to have two rookies rank in the top-10.

Additionally last season the Los Angeles' defense had eight interceptions when the score was within seven points or less in the fourth quarter, tied with the 2003 Patriots and 2002 Buccaneers for the second-most in the past 30 years (2000 Lions - 10).



## WATCH OUT FOR THE LAND SHARK

**CB Cobie Durant** became the sixth player since 2000 to record two passes defended, 1.0 sack, one interception, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble in a game and the first since Fred Warner in Week 2 of 2024 vs Minnesota. Prior to that, the last player to accomplish the feat was Telvin Smith in Week 7 of 2014 vs Cleveland. Durant's interception marked the third of his career and first since Week 16 of 2022 vs. Denver and it marked it his second-career game with at least one sack and one interception (Week 2 of 2022 vs. Atlanta).

In Week 11, Durant tied a single-game career-high with two passes defended. In Week 13, he recorded a single-game career-high two tackles for loss. He has now recorded four tackles for loss in the 2024 season and is tied for the fourth-most among cornerbacks. He became the 11th cornerback last season to record at least six tackles and two tackles for loss.

## HURRY UP

The Rams were one of two teams (Saints) to have two players rank inside the top-13 in hurries last season. Jared Verse tied for second with 56 and Kobie Turner ranked 13th with 43. They were also the only team to have three players rank in the top-17 (Verse, Turner and DE Braden Fiske) tied for 17th with 40.

## WATCH OUT

The Rams are the only team to have multiple players record nine or more pressures in a single game during their rookie season since pressures have been officially tracked (2017). Seven rookies have accomplished the feat, most recently, **OLB Jared Verse** against Las Vegas in Week 7. **DE Kobie Turner** recorded 10 pressures as a rookie in 2023 in Week 17 against the New York Giants and **OLB Byron Young** recorded nine pressures in his third career game in Week 3 of 2023 against Cincinnati.

## BRINGING THE HEAT

The Rams tallied 30.0 sacks from players drafted since the 2022 season: Kobie Turner (8.0), Braden Fiske (8.0), Byron Young (8.0), Jared Verse (4.5), and Tyler Davis (1.5).



## NEW COMER

Nate Landman has 18 total tackles through his first two games with the Rams. Over the last 30 years, that is tied with Will Witherspoon (2006) for the second-most tackles in a player's first two games with the Rams, behind James Laurinaitis who had 23 in 2009.

### GENERATING PRESSURE

DE Kobie Turner generated a league-high 23 pressures when he was double teamed last season. According to Next Gen Stats, he was double teamed on 52.4% of his pass rushes, the fourth-highest rate in the NFL (min. 200 pass rushes).

Last season, he dominated double teams, generating the second-most pressures versus double teams (22) in the NFL, trailing Jets DL Quinnen Williams (25). Turner was double teamed on a league-high 54.1% of pass rushes in 2023 (min. 300 pass rushes)

### KOBIE'S TURN

DE Kobie Turner became only the second player in franchise history to record at least 10.0 sacks in his first 19 career games, joining Aaron Donald (12.5 sacks).

In Week 10 last season, he recorded his second game with at least 1.0 sack and one pass defended last season, tied for the second-most, trailing only Giants OLB Brian Burns (three).

In Week 11 last season, he recorded his first career fumble recovery in the second quarter. Turner recorded a tackle for loss and a pass defended in back-to-back games this season, becoming the ninth player to accomplish the feat in 2024. He is the first Ram to accomplish the feat since Ernest Jones IV in Week 15 and 16 of 2023. He also became the fourth Ram to record at least five tackles, one tackle for loss, one pass defended and one fumble recovery in a game and the first since Alec Ogletree in Week 2 of 2016 vs. Seattle. He is the third player to accomplish the feat last season and the only defensive lineman to do so.

In Week 14 last season, DE Kobie Turner passed Myles Garrett and Vic Beasley (64) for the 13th-most hurries through a player's first 30 career games played with 65.

### STOPPING THE RUN

DE Kobie Turner generated the fifth-highest run stop rate (16.3%) among all defensive tackles in 2023 (minimum. 100 snaps).

He ranked as the top rookie among stopping the run.

Rookie OLB **Byron Young** made an immediate impact in his rookie season. He was the first rookie in franchise history to be in the sack column in his first three NFL games. He recorded 50 pressures, 61 tackles (42 solo), 8.0 sacks, 29 hurries, and 21 quarterback hits on the season.

After his dominate Week 6 performance, Young won the Pepsi Zero Sugar Rookie Of The Week Award. He was also nominated for the award in Week 9 when he recorded a single-game career best of 2.0 sacks.

### BRINGING THE HEAT

OLB **Byron Young** generated 62 pressures during the 2023 season, good for the second-most among all rookie defenders in the NFL.

According to Next Gen Stats, Young rarely left the field during his rookie season, playing 917 defensive snaps, the most by any rookie edge defender in the NGS era (since 2016).

## WELL VERSED

Rookie OLB Jared Verse became the fourth Rams rookie to record a sack in his debut, joining Kyle Borland (1987), Kevin Carter (1995) and Robert Quinn (2011).

In Week 2, Verse became the fourth Rams rookie to record three tackles for loss in a game (Chris Long – 2008, Michael Brockers – 2012 and Aaron Donald – 2014), tied for the most by a Rams rookie in a single game.

Verse also became the first Rams player since 2021 (Aaron Donald, Week 16) to record three tackles for loss and a forced fumble in the same game. He is the ninth rookie since 2000 to accomplish the feat.

Verse became the sixth player to record at least five quarterback hits in a game last season.

In Week 8, he became the second rookie to record at least 1.5 sacks, one tackle for loss and three quarterback hits in a game last season (Broncos OLB Dondrea Tillman).

In Week 10, Verse finished with four tackles (three solo), two tackles for loss, 1.0 sack, one quarterback hit and one forced fumble. He is also the second Rams rookie to have a sack in three-or-more consecutive games (Aaron Donald recorded a five game streak in 2014). With two tackles for loss vs. Miami, he tied Von Miller and Micah Parsons for the second-most tackles for loss (11) through a player's first nine-career games.

## ROOKIE LEADER

In his rookie season, Verse led all rookies in quarterback hits (18), pressures (77) and hurries (56). He ranked second in tackles for loss (11) and fifth in sacks (4.5) behind teammate Braden Fiske (8.5).

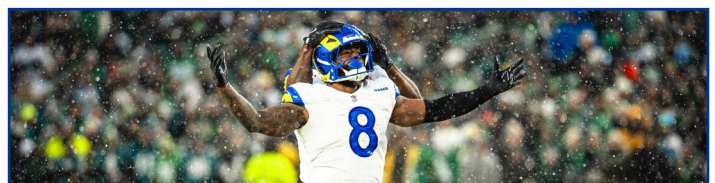

## KARDIAC KARTY

K Joshua Karty became the youngest kicker in franchise history to make a game-winning field goal in the fourth quarter. He is also just the second rookie in franchise history to make a game-winning field goal (Greg Zuerlein in 2012). Karty is the second rookie kicker in franchise history (Greg Zuerlein in 2012) to start his career converting five-of-five field goal attempts.

Karty became the first Rams kicker to make at least five field goals in a game since Greg Zuerlein made seven against Dallas in Week 4 of 2017.

Karty passed Frank Corral (118) for the most points scored by a Rams kicker in their rookie season with 119 points. It is also the second-most points scored by a rookie in franchise history, behind Eric Dickerson's 120. He also tied Frank Corral (29) for the most made field goals by a rookie kicker in franchise history.

## PLAYER ACCOLADES



### PRO FOOTBALL WRITERS OF AMERICA SELECTIONS

The Rams had three players selected to the All-Rookie team, the most in the NFL.

OLB Jared Verse was named the PFWA Defensive Rookie of the Year. He is the second player in franchise history to be selected as the Defensive Rookie of the Year by the PFWA, joining Former DT Aaron Donald (2014).

DE Braden Fiske made the All-Rookie team as a member of the defensive line and WR Jordan Whittington was selected as a kick returner.

The Rams have had seven players named to the All-Rookie team in the past two seasons, the most by any team since 2000.



### NFL WEEKLY/MONTHLY AWARDS

The Rams had seven different players, including four rookies honored by the NFL last season.

OLB Jared Verse was nominated twice for Pepsi Rookie of the Week in Week 2 and Week 10. He was named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for his dominating performance in the month of September when he led rookies in pressures (17), tackles for loss (five) and forced fumbles (one).

DE Braden Fiske was named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month in November after leading all rookies in tackles for loss (six), sacks (5.0), and tied for first in forced fumbles (one).

Verse and Fiske were just the third defensive rookie duo to each win the award in the same season joining Dee Milliner/Sheldon Richardson (2013) and Erik Coleman/Jonathan Vilma (2004).

S Kamren Kinchens became the first rookie defensive back to win the Defensive Player of the Week award multiple times during his first season in the NFL.

CB Cobie Durant was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week after his performance in Week 7 against Las Vegas when he became the first defensive back to record an interception, sack and forced fumble in a game last season.







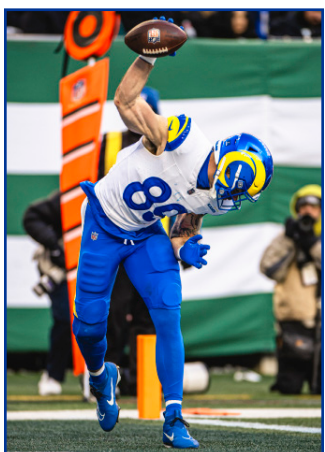
# 2024 TEAM AWARDS



## CARROLL ROSENBLUM MEMORIAL AWARD

Given to the team's Rookie of the Year, the award was established following the passing of former owner Carroll Rosenbloom in 1979. Rosenbloom became the owner of the Rams when he orchestrated an unprecedented franchise trade in 1972. Rosenbloom traded the Baltimore Colts to Robert Irsay for the Rams. The Rams won an NFL record seven consecutive NFC West titles from 1973-79 under Rosenbloom's leadership. This year's Carroll Rosenbloom Memorial Award winner is **OLB Jared Verse**.

Verse led all rookies in pressures (77), hurries (56) and quarterback hits (18). He tied for second in tackles for loss (11) and fifth in sacks (4.5). Across the NFL, Verse tied for second in hurries (56), fourth in pressures (77), tied for seventh in fumble recoveries (two) and tied for 32nd in tackles for loss (11). In Week 16, Verse joined teammate Braden Fiske as the only rookies in franchise history to record at least 4.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries in their first season.



## CARL EKERN SPIRIT OF THE GAME AWARD/ED BLOCK COURAGE AWARD

Established in 1990, the award is given to the player who best exemplifies sportsmanship, ethic, and commitment to his teammates. Those traits were displayed by former Rams linebacker Carl Ekern, killed in an automobile accident in 1990. Ekern was a starter for the Rams from 1982-88 and earned an invitation to the Pro Bowl in 1986. This year's Carl Ekern Spirit of the Game Award winner is **TE Tyler Higbee**. Higbee was also voted by his teammates as the Ed Block Courage Award recipient, given to a player who is a role model of inspiration, sportsmanship, and courage.

Despite missing 14 games due to a significant knee injury sustained during the Wild Card Round of the 2023 season, Higbee has been praised by coaches and teammates for his steadiness, toughness, resilience, and commitment throughout the rehabilitation process. In Week 16 vs. the New York Jets, Higbee recorded his first reception of the 2024 season and scored on an 11-yard touchdown. Despite missing most of the season, Higbee served as a leader and a valuable contributor to the team. Off the field, Higbee purchased gifts for two families served by the Watts-Willowbrook Boys & Girls Club this holiday season. He also purchased items on holiday wish lists for two families in need including grocery gift cards, Visa gift cards to help pay bills, furniture, toys for children, electronics, as well as clothing items for members of each family.



## DANIEL F. REEVES MEMORIAL AWARD

Given to the team's Most Valuable Player, the award was established in honor of former owner Daniel F. Reeves in 1969. Reeves purchased a stake in the Rams in 1941 and became the sole owner in 1943 while serving stateside in the U.S. Army Air Forces. He played a pivotal role in resolving the team's financial difficulties and helped lead the team to a Western Division title in 1945 and secured the championship later that season. Following the 1945 season, he orchestrated the team's relocation to Los Angeles. Reeves restored the franchise to its winning ways and played a key role in designing the "Fearsome Foursome" defensive line consisting of Rosey Grier, Merlin Olsen, Deacon Jones and Lamar Lundy. This year's Daniel F. Reeves Memorial Award winner is **QB Matthew Stafford**.

The three-time Pro Bowl selection has completed 340-of-517 pass attempts for 3,762 yards and 20 touchdowns last season. He finished the season ranked 11th in the NFL in completions, 12th in passing first downs (176), 13th in passing yards and 15th in passer rating (93.7). Last season, Stafford passed Eli Manning (366) and moved into sole possession of 10th on the NFL's all-time passing touchdowns list with 377. He also passed Dan Marino (4,967) for ninth on the NFL's all-time completions list with 5,174 and moved into 10th on the NFL's all-time passing yards list with 59,809 career passing yards.
