

## POST-GAME NOTES PHILADELPHIA EAGLES at DALLAS COWBOYS November 23, 2025

## **POST-GAME NOTES**

- Following a fourth-down stand by Philadelphia's defense on Dallas' game-opening drive, the Eagles claimed a 7-0 advantage with a 7-play, 49-yard drive that culminated in a 16yard TD pass from Jalen Hurts to A.J. Brown. The score marked Brown's 4th receiving TD of the season.
  - o Philadelphia recorded its eighth consecutive stop on a fourth-down attempt.
- **Jalen Hurts** gave the Eagles a 14-0 lead during the second quarter with a 7-yard rushing TD.
- After a Zack Baun fumble recovery (lost by Cowboys WR KaVontae Turpin),
   Philadelphia went 66 yards on 6 plays to make it a 21-0 score in the second quarter with a 1-yard TD plunge by Jalen Hurts. The Eagles scored TDs on their first 3 drives for the first time since Week 1 vs. Dallas.
  - Hurts, who is the first QB since the 1970 NFL merger to produce 8+ rushing TDs in five consecutive seasons, registered his 11th career game with 2+ rushing TDs and 1+ passing TD (including playoffs). That is the 2nd-most in NFL history, behind Josh Allen (13).
- Reed Blankenship notched his first INT of the campaign to halt a Cowboys red zone drive in the second quarter. The last time he picked off an opposing QB was 12/22/24 at Washington.
- Nakobe Dean logged his career-high 3rd sack of the season when he brought down Cowboys QB Dak Prescott for a 7-yard loss on third-and-5, forcing Dallas to punt from their 6-yard line.
  - Dean is the first Eagle to produce sacks in three consecutive games since Nolan Smith accomplished the feat during Philadelphia's 2024 postseason run (also three).
- A.J. Brown posted a season-high 8 receptions for 110 yards and 1 TD. Since 2022, Brown is tied for the 2nd-most 100+ yard receiving performances (20), behind only Justin Jefferson (22).
