

POST-GAME NOTES PHILADELPHIA EAGLES vs. NEW YORK GIANTS October 26, 2025

EAGLES DEFEAT GIANTS, 38-20, TO IMPROVE TO 6-2 THIS SEASON

- Philadelphia has started 6-2 or better through eight games for the fourth consecutive season, which is tied for the longest stretch in franchise history (also 1947-50). Prior to this streak, the last time the Eagles got off to 6-2 starts or better in consecutive seasons was from 1979-81 (three).
 - According to *Elias Sports*, Sirianni is the eighth head coach in league history to start 6-2 or better in four of their first five career seasons. The others to do so are **Paul** Brown, Guy Chamberlin, Jon Gruden, George Halas, Chuck Knox, Don Shula and Mike Tomlin.
- Philadelphia leads the NFL in winning percentage (.828, 24-5) since 2024 (including playoffs). The Eagles have won 12 of their last 14 games (.857) as well as 22 of their last 25 contests (.880).
 - With today's victory, Nick Sirianni (60-25, 2021-present) has tied Dick Vermeil (60-55, 1976-82) for the 3rd-most wins by an Eagles head coach (including playoffs).
- Philadelphia is tied with Buffalo for the best home winning percentage (.829, 29-6) in the NFL since 2022 (including playoffs), going 13-1 (.929) in its last 14 games at Lincoln Financial Field.
- The Eagles are 13-0 against the Giants at Lincoln Financial Field since 2014 (including playoffs). Overall, Philadelphia owns a 16-4 (.800) record vs. New York over the last 20 matchups.
- The Eagles rushed for a season-high 276 yards, marking the most by an NFL team this year. This is Philadelphia's highest regular-season rushing output since 11/24/24 at L.A. Rams (314).
- The Eagles' 18-point win marked their largest margin of victory in the regular season since 11/10/24 at Dallas (28). It was also the Giants' largest margin of defeat this season.

BARKLEY RUSHES FOR SEASON-HIGH 150 YARDS, SCORES 2 TDs

- Saquon Barkley rushed for a season-high 150 yards with 1 TD on 14 carries (10.7 avg.) and added 24 yards and 1 TD on 4 receptions, combining for 174 yards and 2 TDs in the divisional win.
 - Barkley has posted 1+ rushing TD and 1+ receiving TD in the same game for the first time since he last suited up in the Eagles' Kelly Green uniform on 11/3/24 vs.
 Jacksonville. Barkley also accomplished the feat in the 2024 season opener vs.
 Green Bay.
 - o Including playoffs, Barkley has 8 rushing TDs of 60+ yards as an Eagle (NFL-record seven 60+ yard rushing TDs in 2024). That is the same amount as the next three closest Eagles combined since 2000 Miles Sanders (3), Brian Westbrook (3) and Bryce Brown (2).

- This is Barkley's 10th career game with 150+ rushing yards and 9th multi-TD game since joining the Eagles - the most among NFL RBs since 2024 (including playoffs).
- Tank Bigsby produced his third career game with 100+ rushing yards with a 104-yard effort on just 9 attempts (11.6 avg.). It marked the 2nd-highest rushing total of his career, behind a 118-yard and 2-TD performance that he registered on 10/20/24 vs. New England with Jacksonville.
 - o Barkley and Bigsby became the first Eagles duo to each rush for 100+ yards in a game since **Bryce Brown** (115) and **LeSean McCoy** (133) on 12/22/13 vs. Chicago.

HURTS THROWS A CAREER-HIGH-TYING 4 TDs FOR A 141.5 PASSER RATING

- **Jalen Hurts** completed 15-of-20 (75.0%) attempts for 179 yards, 4 TDs (tied career high), 0 INTs and a 141.5 passer rating. He ranks 3rd in the NFL with a 114.4 passer rating this season.
 - This is Hurts' third career performance with 4+ passing TDs, having previously accomplished that on 10/29/23 at Washington and 10/30/22 vs. Pittsburgh.
 - Hurts became the sixth Eagles QB with 100+ career passing TDs, joining Donovan McNabb (216, 1999-2009), Ron Jaworski (175, 1977-86), Randall Cunningham (150, 1985-95), Carson Wentz (113, 2016-20) and Norm Snead (111, 1964-70).
 - Hurts is the third Eagles QB since the 1970 NFL merger to produce a 140+ passer rating in consecutive games, joining Nick Foles (2013) and Randall Cunningham (1992).

GOEDERT CELEBRATES NATIONAL TIGHT ENDS DAY WITH 2 TDs

- Dallas Goedert finished with 28 yards and a career-high-tying 2 TDs (third time) on 3
 receptions. His last performance with multiple receiving TDs happened during Week 4 at
 Tampa Bay.
 - o Goedert is tied with **Amon-Ra St. Brown** for the NFL lead in receiving TDs (7).
 - Since 2015, only three NFL TEs have registered 7+ receiving TDs in their first seven games played in a season - Goedert (2025), Travis Kelce (2022) and Rob Gronkowski (2015).
- During the drive that resulted in Jahan Dotson's 40-yard TD, Goedert tied DeSean Jackson (379, 2008-13 and 2019-20) for the 6th-most catches in Eagles history. He ranks 4th among Eagles TEs, behind Zach Ertz (579, 2013-21), Pete Retzlaff (452, 1956-66) and Brent Celek (398, 2007-17).

MORE FROM THE GAME

- Philadelphia totaled a season-high 5 sacks, marking the unit's best total since Super Bowl LIX vs. Kansas City (6). It was their most in the regular season since 11/24/24 at L.A. Rams (5).
 - The Eagles earned contributions in sacks from Zack Baun (1.0), Jalen Carter (1.0),
 Jordan Davis (1.0 career-high 3.0 in 2025), Jalyx Hunt (1.0) and Moro Ojomo (1.0).
 - Ojomo leads the defense with a career-high 4.0 sacks.
- **DeVonta Smith** led the Eagles offense with 84 yards on 6 receptions (14.0 avg.) in the win.
- Will Shipley set up the scoring drive that resulted in a 9-yard TD reception by Saquon
 Barkley with a career-long 41-yard kickoff return the longest kickoff return by an Eagle this year.

EAGLES MILESTONES

- Lane Johnson made his 166th career regular-season appearance, tying **Tra Thomas** (1998-2008) for the 9th-most games played in franchise history. Overall, Johnson is tied for the 2nd-most games by an Eagles OL in the Super Bowl Era, trailing only **Jason Kelce** (193, 2011-23).
- Dallas Goedert played in his 100th career regular-season game with Philadelphia.
