QUICK HITS / 2025 RECAP

- ✗ The Baltimore Ravens open the 2026 preseason by hosting the Philadelphia Eagles at M&T Bank Stadium on Saturday, Aug. 15. This marks head coach **Jesse Minter**'s first game at the helm after being named the fourth head coach in franchise history in January. Minter, who served as the Chargers' defensive coordinator the past two seasons, now leads a club that provided him his first NFL coaching experience (He spent 2017-20 with the Ravens, holding various roles on the defensive staff).
- ✗ Baltimore finished second in the AFC North in 2025 with an 8-9 record, missing the postseason for just the second time since 2018. The Ravens entered a Week 18 winner-take-all division showdown at Pittsburgh, but fell in heartbreaking fashion to the rival Steelers (10-6) on a missed 44-yard FGA as time expired. Baltimore battled numerous injuries throughout an up-and-down season, as a combined 62 games were missed by Ravens starters, with only two defensive players (S Malaki Starks & CB Nate Wiggins) playing all 17 contests.
- ✗ Baltimore's 2025 offense finished 16th in yards per game (332.2), including second in rushing (156.6 ypg) and 27th in passing (175.6 ypg). Ranking 11th in scoring (24.9 ppg), the Ravens also produced an NFL-best 25 "explosive" runs (20+ yards gained) and the league's No. 1 yards-per-carry average (5.25).
- ✗ In 2025, the Ravens were 24th in total defense (354.5 ypg), including 10th-best vs. the run (106.6 ypg) and 30th vs. the pass (247.9 ypg). Their 23.4 points allowed per game ranked 18th, while the red zone "D" was sturdy, standing sixth in TD% (50.8). From Week 6-18 (last 12 games), the Ravens ranked Top 5 in each RZ TD% (first), rushing ypg (second), scoring (fourth, tied) and third-down% (fifth).

COACH MINTER SAYS

ON HIS PREVAILING MESSAGE TO THE TEAM TO BEGIN TRAINING CAMP:

"It's a day-by-day process. We're not going to win because we're the Ravens. We're not going to win because we have X, Y, Z players. We're not going to win because I'm the coach. We're going to create our success based on the standards that we create and the process that we go through every day. How much better can we get between now and September? Then, how much better can we get between now and November, now and December, now and January, all the way through into February. So, that's really what we're focused on — competing with each other, making each other better, but also connecting and developing a really strong bond amongst the team."

WR Zay Flowers (quad) left practice on Aug. 8 and is considered day-to-day. **ILB Teddye Buchanan** (knee) and **DL Travis Jones** remain on the Physically Unable to Perform (PUP) list. **DL Nnamdi Madubuike** (neck) has resumed individual drills in a limited capacity.

"I wouldn't say you hit a home run with Jesse Minter; I would say you hit a grand slam. He's brilliant in terms of designing a defensive gameplan. He's proved everything you can prove on the defensive side of the ball, and I think relationally — he's so good. I think that's a strength that he can tap into even more as a head coach."

CONSISTENT CONTENDERS

Over the span of the past eight seasons (since 2018), Baltimore owns the NFL's **No. 1 scoring defense** (19.7 ppg allowed) & **No. 2 scoring offense** (26.7 ppg scored).



Baltimore has won a division-best four AFC North titles (2018-19 & 2023-24) since the 2018 season.

RAVENS PRESEASON FAST FACTS

- ✗ The Ravens are 75-36 all time in preseason play, posting a 39-16 preseason home record at M&T Bank Stadium.
- ✗ The Ravens were victorious in 24 straight preseason contests from 2015-23, before falling, 29-28, at Washington (8/21/23). The streak surpassed Vince Lombardi's 1959-62 Green Bay Packers' previous all-time record of 19 straight preseason wins.
- ✗ Baltimore outscored its opponent 561-280 (+281) during the 24-game preseason winning streak, winning the turnover battle 41-25 (+16).
- ✗ During the 24-game preseason winning streak, 14 QBs threw passes for Baltimore, while 43 different Ravens reached the end zone.

2026 PRESEASON BROADCAST INFORMATION

✗ All three of the Ravens' preseason games are called on TV by the newest "Voice of the Ravens," Kyle Youmans, who in June became the third radio play-by-play announcer in franchise history, following the April retirement of Gerry Sandusky. Pro Football Hall of Famer **Rod Woodson** provides analysis, with CBS Sports' **Evan Washburn** handling sideline reporting duties.

✗ The Emmy Award-winning broadcasts and pre-game shows are produced by Ravens Productions, led by coordinating producer Matt Brevet, producer Andy Bock and director Lou Kusserow.

✗ The broadcasts are televised on: WBAL-TV (Baltimore), WGAL (Harrisburg, Pa.), WJLA (Washington, D.C.), WBOC (Salisbury, Md.), WWCW/WFXR (Roanoke, Va.), WTVZ (Norfolk, Va.), WUPV (Richmond, Va.), WHSV (Harrisonburg, Va.), WSAZ/WQCW/ESAZ (Charleston/Huntington, W.Va.), EVFX/EDTV (Clarksburg/Weston, W.Va.), WKYT/WYMT/EKYT/EYMT (Lexington, Ky.) and WLKY (Louisville, Ky.).

✗ Broadcasts are also simulcast on **25** radio affiliate networks.

2025 OFFENSIVE & SPECIAL TEAMS HIGHLIGHTS

RUSHING AS A UNIT

✗ Baltimore recorded 156.6 rushing yards per game and 2,662 rushing yards, both the NFL's No. 2 marks.

✗ The Ravens generated an NFL-best 25 "explosive" runs (20+ yards gained) and the league's No. 1 yards-per-carry average (5.25).

✗ 2025 marked the fourth-consecutive season in which Baltimore accumulated over 2,600 ground yards as a team, which is tied for the longest streak of any team since at least the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Chicago, 1983-86). It's also the seventh season in which the team rushed for over 2,600 yards, which are the most such campaigns of any team since the merger.

HENRY LEADS POTENT GROUND ATTACK

✗ For the second straight season, RB **Derrick Henry** led the league's No. 2 rushing attack, producing Top 5 NFL rankings with 1,595 yards (second), 16 TDs (second) and 5.2 ypc (third). Henry was the NFL's only RB in 2025 to rank in the Top 3 in each rushing yards, rushing TDs and YPC average.

✗ Henry now ranks fourth all-time in rushing TDs (122) and 10th in rushing yards (13,018). He became the fourth NFL player ever to record over 3,000 rushing yards in his first two seasons with a franchise, joining Priest Holmes (KC), Jerome Bettis (Pit.) and Ricky Williams (NO).

TE Mark Andrews set franchise records for career receiving yards and receptions in 2025, becoming just the second TE in NFL history (Travis Kelce) to earn the receiving "Triple Crown" as a franchise's all-time leader in receiving yards, receptions and TDs.

He's also the fifth TE to lead their franchise in receiving yards, joining Travis Kelce (13,002 – Chiefs), Jason Witten (12,977 – Cowboys), Antonio Gates (11,841 – Chargers) and Ozzie Newsome (7,980 – Browns).

STOUT EARNS FIRST-TEAM ALL-PRO

Named AP first-team All-Pro and a Pro Bowler in 2025, P Jordan Stout tallied franchise and NFL bests in net punting average (44.9), while his gross punting average (50.1) ranked first in Ravens history and third in the NFL. He also recorded the longest punt in franchise history (74 yards) on 11/23/25 vs. NYJ. Stout signed with the New York Giants in March 2026.

KEY OFFENSIVE CONTRIBUTORS

Despite missing four games due to injury, **QB Lamar Jackson** finished with 2,549 yards, 21 TDs, 7 INTs and a 103.8 passer rating (No. 4 in NFL). His 8.1 net yards per pass attempt tied for the NFL's third-highest rate.



WR Zay Flowers set career highs in receiving yards (1,211 - 7th in NFL, 2nd in franchise history) and catches (86 - 11th in NFL). He became the third player in franchise history with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons.

FB Patrick Ricard earned his third AP All-Pro honor and his sixth Pro Bowl nod in 2025, blocking for Baltimore's No. 2 rushing offense (156.6 ypg). He was the seventh Raven to be selected to at least six Pro Bowls. Ricard signed with the New York Giants in March 2026.



C Tyler Linderbaum became the third Ravens OL (J. Ogden & M. Yanda) to be named to at least three Pro Bowls. He blocked for an offense that finished No. 2 in the NFL in rushing ypg (156.6). Linderbaum signed with the Las Vegas Raiders in March 2026.

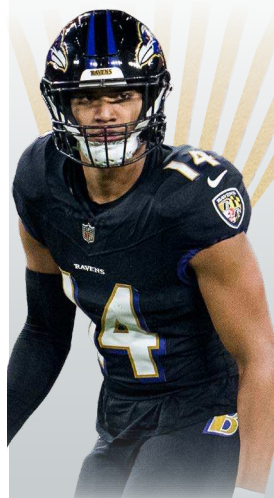

X Hamilton was the only NFL player to play at least 130 snaps at each slot cornerback, high safety, outside linebacker and edge throughout the 2025 season. He also logged snaps at middle linebacker (59), interior line (38) and cornerback (34).

X He was the NFL's only safety – and just one of four defenders overall – to record at least 100 tackles (105), 1 sack (1), 2 FFs (2), 5 PD (9) and 5 TFL (7) in 2025.

RELIABLE ROQUAN

ILB Roquan Smith earned his fourth-straight Pro Bowl nod, breaking into the Ravens' Top 6 all-time tackles list. Smith finished this season with 130 tackles (76 solo), which ranked 15th in the NFL and ninth in the AFC. Over his career, he owns 1,134 tackles, which are the most through any player's first eight NFL seasons since 1987.

OLB Dre'Mont Jones, acquired via trade in November, logged 17 tackles (6 solo), including 2.5 sacks, 2 TFL, a team-high 15 QBHs, 1 PD and 1 FR. Jones signed with the New England Patriots in March 2026.



NT Travis Jones enjoyed a career year, recording career highs in tackles (47), TFL (9), sacks (5), QBHs (9), FF (1) and FR (1). Jones' 5 sacks and 9 TFL are the most by a NT in single-season franchise history.

OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS COACH: HARLAND BOWER

X Harland Bower enters his first season as an NFL coach, after spending 16 years (2010-25) in the collegiate ranks. For the past four seasons (2022-25), he served as the defensive ends coach at Duke, where in 2025, he mentored a pair of All-ACC honorees in DE Vincent Anthony Jr. and DE Wesley Williams.

PASS GAME COORDINATOR: MARCUS BRADY

X Marcus Brady enters his ninth season as an NFL coach, last serving as the Los Angeles Chargers' passing game coordinator from 2024-25. Prior to his time in L.A., he was with the Philadelphia Eagles for two seasons (2022-23) in offensive consultant roles. While with the Indianapolis Colts, he served as offensive coordinator his final two seasons (2021-22), in addition to coaching quarterbacks from 2018-20. Brady also coached in the CFL for nine seasons (2009-17), following a seven-year playing career at quarterback in the Canadian league.

SENIOR SPECIAL TEAMS COACH: RANDY BROWN

X Randy Brown enters his 19th season on the Ravens' coaching staff, after originally joining Baltimore in 2008 as a kicking consultant. Throughout his Ravens tenure, he has helped coach seven Pro Bowlers, including 2025 first-team All-Pro P Jordan Stout, who ranked No. 1 in the NFL in net (44.9) and No. 3 in gross (50.1) punting average this past season. Brown also aided in the development of rookie K Tyler Loop, who recorded a franchise-rookie-record 134 points in 2025 by connecting on 30-of-34 field goal attempts (88.2%) and 44-of-46 point after attempts (95.7%).

WIDE RECEIVERS COACH: KEARY COLBERT

X Entering his fourth NFL coaching season, **Keary Colbert** spent the past three years (2023-25) guiding the Denver Broncos' wide receivers. Prior to entering the NFL, he held a variety of offensive coaching positions at Florida (2022), his alma mater USC (2010, 2016-21), Alabama (2014-15) and Georgia State (2013). Originally selected by the Carolina Panthers in the second round of the 2004 NFL Draft, Colbert played six NFL seasons with the Panthers (2004-07), Broncos (2008), Seattle Seahawks (2008), Detroit Lions (2008) and Kansas City Chiefs (2011).

CHIEF OF STAFF TO THE HEAD COACH: CHRISTINA DeRUYTER

X Christina DeRuyter spent the past two seasons (2024-25) serving as the Los Angeles Chargers' director of football logistics. Prior to her time in the NFL, she worked collegiately in operations and recruiting at Michigan (2021-23), Vanderbilt (2021), Texas Tech (2019-21) and Arizona (2018). A Texas A&M graduate, she also worked for the Aggies' football operations and broadcast departments as a student.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR: DECLAN DOYLE

X Declan Doyle enters his eighth NFL coaching season and his second as an offensive coordinator (2025 – Chicago Bears). While with Chicago last season, he helped the offense rank sixth in total yards (369.5 ypg), producing the league's No. 3 rushing (144.5 ypg) and No. 10 passing (225.1 ypg) attacks. Prior to his time with the Bears, Doyle served as the Denver Broncos' tight ends coach (2023-24) and as an offensive assistant for the New Orleans Saints (2019-22). His first coaching opportunity came as an offensive assistant at the University of Iowa (2016-18).

DEFENSIVE LINE COACH: LOU ESPOSITO

X A 25-year coaching veteran, **Lou Esposito** enters his first NFL season after last working at Michigan, where he spent the past two seasons (2024-25) coaching the defensive line. Esposito served seven seasons (2017-23) as Western Michigan's defensive coordinator and defensive line/defensive ends coach. From 2014-16, he was the inaugural head coach at Davenport University. Esposito also held assistant-coaching roles at Ferris State (2013), Western Michigan (2010-12), Saint Joseph's (Ind.) College (2004) and with the AFL's Memphis Xplorers (2002-03). His first head-coaching role came at Saint Joseph's (Ind.) College, where he led the program from 2005-09.

RUNNING BACKS COACH: EDDIE FAULKNER

X Eddie Faulkner enters his eighth NFL season and first with the Ravens after spending the previous seven years (2019-25) coaching the Pittsburgh Steelers' running backs. In 2025, he helped guide the one-two punch of Jaylen Warren and Kenneth Gainwell, who combined for nearly 1,500 rushing yards and 11 rushing touchdowns, along with 113 receptions and five receiving scores. Faulkner was also instrumental in the development of RB Najee Harris, who rushed for over 1,000 yards in each of his four seasons with Pittsburgh (2021-24) and earned Pro Bowl honors as a rookie in 2021. Prior to his time in Pittsburgh, Faulkner served as an assistant coach at North Carolina State (2013-18), Wisconsin (2012), Northern Illinois (2011), Ball State (2003-10) and Anderson University (2002). At Ball State, he spent two seasons (2009-10) as the team's offensive coordinator and running backs coach, including a stint as the program's interim head coach at the end of the 2010 campaign.

ASSISTANT OFFENSIVE LINE COACH: SHAWN FLAHERTY

X Shawn Flaherty joins the Ravens as the assistant offensive line coach after previously serving in the same capacity with the Atlanta Falcons (2023-25). He originally joined the Falcons as a football analyst in 2022. His first NFL coaching experience was with the Miami Dolphins, where he was a coaching assistant (2019-20) before being promoted to assistant offensive line coach in 2021. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at North Carolina State (2017-18). Flaherty played collegiately at Towson University (2013-16), starting games at both guard and center while earning a degree in business administration.

X Prentice Gill enters his first season as assistant wide receivers coach after being elevated from his previous role as a Ravens' coaching fellow, which he held for the past two years (2024-25). Prior to his NFL career, Gill spent one season (2024) at IMG Academy, following four seasons (2020-23) as co-wide receivers coach/assistant recruiting coordinator at Arizona State, and one season as an offensive analyst at Oregon (2019). He previously held graduate assistant roles at USC (2016-18) – where he worked with new Ravens wide receivers coach Keary Colbert – and at San Jose State (2015), where he primarily assisted the defensive backs.

ASSISTANT STRENGTH COACH: GREG GOINES JR.

X Greg Goines Jr. enters his first season as Baltimore's assistant strength coach after three seasons (2023-25) serving as an assistant athletic performance coach on Liberty University's football staff. Goines also held strength & conditioning positions at Auburn (2022), Georgia State (2021-22) and Clemson (2017-21). He earned a master's in sport administration from Georgia State (2022) and a bachelor's in health science from Clemson (2021).

TIGHT ENDS COACH: ZACK GROSSI

X Zack Grossi (pronounced: GRAH-see) enters his first season with Baltimore and his eighth NFL season overall, most recently serving as the Denver Broncos' pass game specialist from 2024-25. Grossi, who was Denver's offensive quality control coach from 2022-23, spent two years coaching alongside Ravens offensive coordinator Declan Doyle and three years with Joe Lombardi, the team's new senior offensive assistant coach. He previously spent time with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' coaching staff (2016-18), while also coaching on the collegiate level at Southern University and A&M College (2020-21) and Hampton University (2019).

X Patrick Kramer enters his sixth NFL season overall, after serving five years as the Atlanta Falcons' offensive assistant coach (2023-25) and football analyst (2021-22). Kramer worked alongside new Ravens offensive line coach & run game coordinator Dwayne Ledford and assistant offensive line coach Shawn Flaherty in Atlanta. A former quarterback at John Carroll University, Kramer also spent time coaching at Tennessee-Chattanooga (2017) and Notre Dame (2018-20), after beginning his coaching career at alma mater John Carroll (2016).

RUN GAME COORDINATOR & OFFENSIVE LINE COACH: DWAYNE LEDFORD

X Entering his 22nd season overall as a coach, **Dwayne Ledford** spent the past five years guiding the Atlanta Falcons' offensive line (2021-25), adding run game coordinator to his role during the 2024-25 campaigns. He also coached collegiately for 14 years at seven different schools, after retiring from the NFL following a six-year playing career as a center with four organizations (49ers, Jaguars, Panthers & Browns).

X Anthony Levine Sr. enters his third season as a Ravens special teams coach and first as the special teams coordinator. He most recently worked with cornerbacks at Notre Dame (2020-25), also serving as the defensive passing game coordinator from 2023-25. Additionally, he held assistant roles at Cincinnati (2018-19), Bowling Green (2014-17), Idaho (2013), Indiana State (2012) and his alma mater Cincinnati (2011). Mickens reunites with head coach Jesse Minter, after they previously coached on the same defensive staff at Indiana State in 2012. Mickens also played cornerback at Cincinnati, where he was coached by Minter (graduate assistant) from 2007-08.

FOOTBALL ANALYST: RICK MINTER

✗ **Rick Minter** enters his ninth season on a coaching staff with his son, Jesse Minter. The elder Minter most recently served as a senior defensive analyst for the Los Angeles Chargers (2024-25) and worked on Michigan's defensive staff from 2022-23. He has over 40 years of coaching experience at both the collegiate and professional ranks, including serving as the University of Cincinnati's head coach from 1994-2003.

DEFENSIVE ASSISTANT: MATT O'DONNELL

✗ **Matt O'Donnell** enters his sixth NFL coaching season, joining the Ravens as a defensive assistant. O'Donnell most recently spent two seasons (2024-25) with the Miami Dolphins' defensive staff under defensive coordinator Anthony Weaver, following his first NFL opportunity with the Houston Texans (2018-20), where he progressed from defensive quality control coach (2018) to defensive assistant (2019) to coordinator of football research/defensive assistant (2020). Prior to his Miami tenure, O'Donnell returned to coach at his alma mater, Brown, where he oversaw cornerbacks (2022) before becoming recruiting coordinator/defensive line coach (2023). O'Donnell also held prior defensive coaching roles at Duke (2016-17; 2021), Southern Mississippi (2014-15) and Iowa (2012-13).

DEFENSIVE QUALITY CONTROL COACH: ANDREW ROGAN

✗ **Andrew Rogan** is in his sixth season with the Ravens and first as the team's defensive quality control coach. Originally joining the Ravens in 2021 as a player personnel assistant, he has provided organizational value from both a player personnel and coaching perspective. Prior to his time in Baltimore, Rogan spent time working as a coaching/personnel/analytics intern for Army Football (2020).

Volker made coaching stops at Kennesaw State (2017-18), Georgia State (2013-16) and Indiana State (2010-12). He was a two-time All-Conference linebacker at the College of Mount St. Joseph, where he played with Ravens head coach Jesse Minter.

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR: ANTHONY WEAVER

✗ **Anthony Weaver** enters his 15th NFL coaching season and first as Baltimore's defensive coordinator. After two seasons (2024-25) as the Miami Dolphins' defensive coordinator, he returns to Baltimore for a third time after previously holding defensive coaching roles from 2021-23 and where he began his NFL playing career as a second-round draft pick at defensive end (2002-05). Prior to his time working with Miami, Weaver also coached defensive line units for the Houston Texans (2016-20; serving as D.C. in his final year), Cleveland Browns (2014-15), Buffalo Bills (2013) and New York Jets (2012).

QUARTERBACKS COACH: ISRAEL WOOLFORK

✗ **Israel Woolfork** enters his fifth full NFL coaching season after spending the past three years (2023-25) as the Arizona Cardinals' quarterbacks coach. He originally entered the NFL with the Cleveland Browns (2021-22) via the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship, where he initially worked with Cleveland's tight ends during the offseason. In 2022, he was the Browns' recipient of the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship, assisting the quarterbacks position. Woolfork's coaching career started at Miami (Ohio), where he enjoyed a nine-year tenure as the RedHawks' wide receivers coach (2018-21), running backs coach (2015-17) and as a graduate assistant (2013-14).

TWO-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS



In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

Jesse Minter was named the Baltimore Ravens' fourth head coach on Jan. 22, 2026, following John Harbaugh (2008-25), Brian Billick (1999-2007) and Ted Marchibroda (1996-98).

✕ Minter, 43, leads the team that first hired him as an NFL coach after four seasons in Baltimore (2017-20), during which the Ravens secured three postseason berths and back-to-back AFC North Division crowns (2018-19).

✕ Minter helped Baltimore rank No. 2 in total defense (312.1 ypg) in the NFL over that four-year span. The Ravens produced NFL bests in a number of categories, including points allowed per game (18.4), net yards per pass allowed (6.0), TDs allowed (124), defensive passer rating (79.5) and yards allowed per play (5.0, tied).

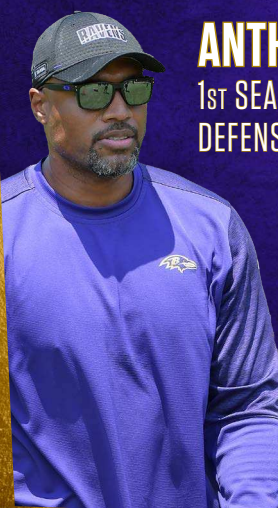

✗ Since 1996, the Ravens have posted a Top 10 scoring defense in 19 of 30 seasons, including the No. 1 units in 2000 (10.3 ppg allowed), 2006 (12.6 ppg allowed) and 2023 (16.5 ppg allowed).

✗ Additionally, Baltimore has boasted 20 Top 10 defenses (yards allowed per game) since 1996, including the No. 6 unit (301.4) in 2023 and the No. 10 unit (324.2) in 2024.

✗ The Ravens have also had 18 Top 10 red zone defenses since 1996, including the No. 6 unit (50.8%) in 2025.

✗ Baltimore's defense has ranked in the Top 10 in rush defense (rushing yards allowed per game) on 22 occasions since 1996, including the No. 10 mark (106.6) in 2025.

✗ Baltimore recorded 57 straight games with at least 1 sack from 2021-25, which is the eighth-longest streak in NFL history (since sacks became an official stat in 1982).

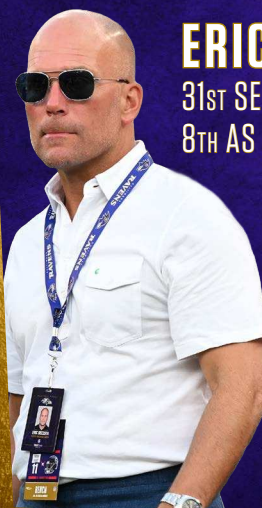

Ozzie Newsome's legacy is unlike any the game has seen. Known throughout all of sports as a premier leader, he is a Hall of Fame player, the architect of Baltimore's 2000 and 2012 Super Bowl championship teams and an elite evaluator who became the NFL's first African American GM. 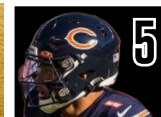

- ✗ Jackson (2) is the 11th player in NFL history to win multiple MVP honors, joining Peyton Manning (5), Aaron Rodgers (4), Tom Brady (3), Jim Brown (3), Brett Favre (3), Johnny Unitas (3), Patrick Mahomes (2), Joe Montana (2), Kurt Warner (2) & Steve Young (2).
- ✗ Only Jackson, Mahomes, Favre & Brown have been named league MVP multiple times at age 27 or younger.

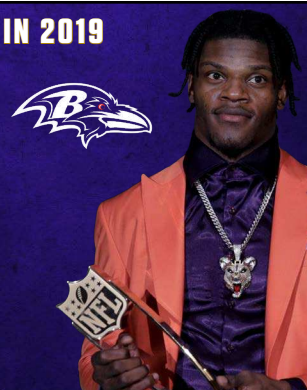
- ✗ Jackson tallied 4,499 total yards, racking up a then-career high 3,678 through the air, to go with a career-best 67.2% completion rate and the NFL's No. 4 passer rating (102.7). He posted a QB-high 821 rushing yards for a league-best 5.5 yards-per-carry average and led his team in passing and rushing an NFL-high seven times.
- ✗ Jackson became the fifth player in NFL history (Josh Allen, Daunte Culpepper, Cam Newton & Dak Prescott) to post 100+ pass TDs and 25+ rush TDs within the first six years of a career.
- ✗ Jackson produced the sixth season (also Kyler Murray in 2020, Jackson in 2019, Russell Wilson in 2014, Robert Griffin III in 2012 & Randall Cunningham in 1990) in NFL history of at least 3,000 passing yards and 800 rushing yards. He's the only player in NFL history to tally multiple such seasons.
- ✗ Jackson recorded his third-career 800-yard rushing season, breaking a tie with Michael Vick (two) for the most such seasons by a QB in NFL history.
- ✗ Jackson became the fourth (also Michael Vick, Russell Wilson & Cam Newton) and fastest (82 games) QB in NFL history to reach 5,000 career rushing yards.
- ✗ In the 2023 Divisional Round vs. Hou., Jackson recorded his third-career 100-yard rushing outing in the playoffs, breaking a tie with QB Colin Kaepernick for the most such playoff performances by a QB in NFL history. He also became the first player in NFL history to reach the following marks in *any* game: 100+ rushing yards, 100.0+ passer rating, 2+ passing TDs, 2+ rushing TDs.
- ✗ In a Week 17 win vs. Mia., Jackson completed 18-of-21 passes (85.7%) for 321 yards and 5 TDs, posting a perfect passer rating (158.3) for the third time in his career. He became the second QB in NFL history (also Ben Roethlisberger) to produce multiple outings (also 9/8/19 at Mia.) with a perfect passer rating and at least 5 passing TDs. His then-three career games with a perfect passer rating (min. 15 pass att.) tied (with Tom Brady, Peyton Manning, Ben Roethlisberger & Kurt Warner) for the NFL's most ever.
- ✗ In a Week 14 victory vs. LAR, Jackson became the first QB in NFL history with multiple performances of at least 300 passing yards, 3 passing TDs and 70 rushing yards (also 9/18/22 vs. Mia.).
- ✗ In a Week 7 victory vs. Det., Jackson completed 21-of-27 passes for 357 yards and 3 TDs, while adding 9 carries for 36 yards and 1 TD, en route to earning his 50th-career victory as the starter. He became the fourth-fastest starting QB in the Super Bowl Era (since 1966) to reach 50 wins, doing so in his 68th-career start. Only Ken Stabler (62), Patrick Mahomes (63), Tom Brady (65) and Roger Staubach (67) reached 50 wins as a starter faster.
- ✗ In Week 3 vs. Ind., Jackson recorded his second-career performance of at least 200 passing yards, 100 rushing yards and 2 rushing TDs. He owns the only two such single-game outputs reaching these marks in NFL history. Additionally, Jackson posted his third-career game with at least 100 rushing yards and multiple rushing TDs. There have only been nine such performances since the merger, and Jackson is the only player with multiple.

2019 UNANIMOUS MVP

- ✗ Jackson became the only QB in NFL history to produce at least 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season. (He had 3,127 passing & 1,206 rushing.)
- ✗ Jackson was responsible for an NFL-best 43 total TDs (36 passing & 7 rushing). His 36 TD passes and 9.0 passing TD percentage each led the NFL and then stood as the most in franchise single-season history.
- ✗ Jackson rushed for 1,206 yards, marking the most by a QB in NFL single-season history. He also produced the NFL's QB single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games (five).
- ✗ Jackson (36/7) became the third QB in NFL history with at least 35 pass TDs & 7 rush TDs. Steve Young (1994), Cam Newton (2015) and Josh Allen (2020 & 2022) have also accomplished this feat.
- ✗ In his final eight games, Jackson threw 25 TDs and 1 INT, completing 69.4% of his passes for 1,477 yards and a 130.3 rating. He tallied 630 rushing yards & 4 rush TDs.
- ✗ In the 2019 Divisional Playoff vs. Ten., Jackson became the first player in NFL history with at least 350 passing yards (365) and 100 rushing yards (143) in *any* game.
- ✗ In a Week 15 win vs. NYJ, Jackson rushed for at least 85 yards, while throwing for 5 TDs for the second time in his career. (He also did this on 11/25/19 at LAR.) Cam Newton is the only other player in NFL history to accomplish the 85 rushing yards/5 passing TDs feat in a game, doing so once in 2015.
- ✗ Jackson posted two perfect passer ratings (at Cin. & Mia.), making him one of two QBs in NFL history (Ben Roethlisberger, 2007) to attain the 158.3 mark twice in a season. His 113.3 overall passer rating ranked No. 3 in the NFL and then stood as a franchise single-season record.
- ✗ In Weeks 11 (vs. Hou.) and 12 (at LAR), Jackson became the first NFL player ever to throw at least 4 passing TDs and post at least 50 rush yards in back-to-back games.
- ✗ In a Week 6 victory over Cincinnati, Jackson became the first player ever to pass for 200 yards (236) and rush for 150 yards (152) in a regular season game. (Colin Kaepernick also accomplished this feat in a 2013 playoff game.)

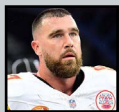
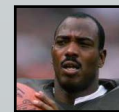
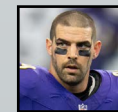

THE NEXT FLIGHT

✕ On April 16, the Ravens unveiled "The Next Flight" collection, the largest uniform change since 2000. Developed since 2023 in collaboration with Nike and the NFL, the redesign evolves an iconic look after 30 seasons while honoring a set long loved by fans and players.

✕ "From the outset, our objective was clear: evolve a uniform that has become iconic and only move forward if we can truly make it better," Ravens Senior Vice President of Marketing Brad Downs stated. "After more than three years of design, iteration and collaboration, we believe we've done just that — delivering a look that feels both modern and unmistakably Ravens."

✕ Infused with distinct characteristics of a raven, the design evokes wings, talons and iridescent accents across all four jersey and paint colors. Notably, the "midnight purple" color was designed to emulate the iridescence of a raven's feathers and is now woven into multiple elements across the collection, including the number set and shields on each sleeve. The team now also sports "Baltimore" on the front of its white jerseys, while the black collar of the purple, black and Purple Rising jerseys also includes the "Baltimore" name.

✕ Two new alternate helmets were introduced, highlighted by all-new "Darkness" helmets to be worn with the team's all-black uniforms. The matte black helmet features black talon stripes and a two-toned front-facing Ravens logo, accentuating the red eyes also seen above the stadium's player introductions tunnel. Lastly, the "Purple Rising" helmet — first introduced in 2024 and originally worn with the alternate purple uniform — now includes the primary Ravens logo, allowing for interchangeability with additional uniform combinations.
